

Reuben B. Hill, Administrative Law Judge (ALJ)

Before graduating from Indiana University School of Law – Indianapolis in 1973, Judge Hill served in the U.S. Air Force. During his illustrious career, he worked at the Indiana State Police as a legal advisor, Bingham Summers Welsh & Spilman as an associate, Department of Public Safety as community relations director, Flanner House of Indianapolis as executive director and Butler Hahn Hill & Schembs as managing partner. He was elected as judge in the Marion Superior Court in 2000.

Judge Hill served as a lecturer for the Indiana University School of Medicine and as an adjunct professor at Indiana University Robert H. McKinney School of Law – Indianapolis. He also was chosen to lecture at the Rostov Law Enforcement Institute.

Throughout the years, Judge Hill has volunteered his time with many community and professional organizations. He served on the Flanner House Foundation Board (president); Salvation Army Board (director), Indianapolis Lawyers Commission Board (director); Children’s Museum Board (director); WFYI-20 Public Broadcasting Service Board of Directors; Indianapolis 500 Festival Board of Directors; Indiana State Department of Mental Health Board of Directors; Legal Aid Society Board; Indiana Bar Association Advisory Board; Indianapolis Urban League Advisory Board; Selective Service Regional Appeal Board; Legal Services Organization Advisory Committee; Indianapolis Museum of Art Advisory Committee; Indiana University Law School Minority Enrollment Advisory Committee; Legal Services Organization Advisory Committee; Judicial Nominating Commission for Marion County Municipal Courts; Greater Indianapolis Progress Commission; Indiana Lawyers Commission; United Nations Host Coordinator for Delegates through Executive Council on Foreign Diplomats; Heroes Foundation; Metropolitan Arts Council; American Bar Association; Indianapolis Bar Association; Indianapolis Repertory Theater; Kiwanis Club; Inner-City Y Men’s Club; and Golden Glove Official.

ALJ Hill was awarded WTLC Man of the Year in 1978, and was elected to the *Who’s Who Among Black Americans*.
