PRELIMINARY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
AND NOTICE OF LICENSE DENIAL

The Indiana Department of Insurance, pursuant to the Indiana Administrative Act, Indiana Code § 4-21.5-1 et seq. and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12, hereby gives notice to Michele L. Hess (“Applicant”) of the following Administrative Order:


1. Applicant filed an application for licensure with the Commissioner on or about May 7, 2010. Following a review of materials submitted by Applicant in support of his application, the Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Insurance, (“Commissioner”), being fully advised, now hereby notifies Applicant that the materials submitted indicate that Applicant has not fully met the requirements of licensure as stated by Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b), specifically: Applicant submitted a falsified Score Report for the pre-licensing exam; the Applicant failed to disclose convictions for Theft, a class A misdemeanor, and Check Fraud, a Class D felony; the Applicant has been convicted of a felony; and,

2. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(d) provides that:
[i]f the commissioner refuses to renew a license or denies an application for a license; the commissioner shall notify the applicant or licensee and advise the applicant or licensee, in a writing sent through regular first class mail, of the reason for the denial of the applicant’s application or the non renewal of the licensee’s license. The applicant or licensee may, not more than sixty-three (63) days after notice of denial of the applicant’s application or non renewal of the

licensee's license is mailed, make written demand to the commissioner for a hearing before the commissioner to determine the reasonableness of the commissioner's action. The hearing shall be held not more than thirty (30) days after the applicant or licensee makes the written demand, and shall be conducted under IC 4-21.5 and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(d).

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Applicant's request for licensure is hereby denied pursuant to Indiana Code 27-1-15.6-12(b).
