# FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND RECOMMENDED ORDER

Administrative Law Judge Reuben B. Hill ("ALJ"), having heard, reviewed and considered all of the evidence, will now render a decision concerning the matter of Robert Campbell ("Applicant"). This matter came on to be heard by the ALJ on February 21, 2018 at 11:00 a.m. at the Indiana Department of Insurance at 311 West Washington Street, Indianapolis, Indiana.

The Enforcement Division of the Indiana Department of Insurance ("Department") was represented by counsel, Erica J. Dobbs. Applicant appeared by telephone and without counsel. Evidence was heard, and exhibits were received into evidence.

Based upon the evidence presented at said hearing, the ALJ now makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and issues the Recommended Order.

### FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Applicant applied for a Non Resident Producer License on December 3, 2017. His home state is Texas where his license is active and in good standing.
- Applicant disclosed on his application that he had previously been convicted of a felony.
   (Department's Exhibit 1).
- Applicant has prior felony convictions for three (3) counts of Indecent Liberties with a
  Child and two (2) counts of Second Degree Kidnapping, all out of North Carolina on
  August 12, 2005.
- 4. Applicant testified that at the time of the offenses, Applicant was Twenty-Nine (29) years old and the victim was Fifteen (15) years old.
- Applicant plead guilty to all Five (5) counts and was sentenced to Thirteen (13) to Sixteen (16) months in prison and Sixty (60) months of supervised probation.
   (Department's Exhibits 2 and 3).
- 6. Applicant testified that he served Thirteen (13) months in minimum security custody followed by approximately Four (4) years of probation.
- 7. Applicant was released from probation on August 25, 2010. (Department's Exhibit 2).
- 8. Applicant testified he is a registered sex offender with a lifetime registration requirement.
- 9. Applicant admitted One (1) exhibit at the hearing. Applicant's Exhibit A is a character reference letter from his manager.

- 10. Applicant is employed by US Health Advisors. Applicant testified that he has a team of Thirty (3) to Thirty-Five (35) agents working under him that can seek licensure in only the states where Applicant is licensed.
- 11. Applicant testified he is licensed in Thirteen (13) states.

#### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- The Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Insurance ("Commissioner") has
  jurisdiction over both the subject matter and the parties to this action.
- This hearing was held in compliance with the Administrative Orders and Procedures Act of the Indiana Code.
- 3. Indiana Code 27-1-15.6-12(b) states that the Commissioner may refuse to issue an Insurance Producer License, due to a number of factors.
- 4. Specifically, Indiana Code 27-1-15.6-12(b)(6) allows the Commissioner to deny an Insurance Producer's license for having been convicted of a felony.
- Applicant has Five (5) felony convictions, including Second Degree Kidnapping and Indecent Liberties with a Child.
- 6. Indiana Code 4-21.5-3-14(c) states that the person requesting an agency take action has the burden of persuasion and the burden of going forward. Applicant is requesting that the Department issue his Non Resident Producer License and, therefore, bears the burden.
- 7. Pursuant to Indiana Code 27-1-15.6-12(d), a hearing was held to determine the reasonableness of the Commissioner's decision. Applicant failed to meet his burden of proving the Commissioner's decision was unreasonable.

8. Findings of Fact that can be adopted as Conclusions of Law are hereby incorporated herein as such.

# RECOMMENDED ORDER

#### IT IS THEREFORE RECOMMENDED:

In consideration of the foregoing Findings of Fact and the Conclusions of Law as stated, the Administrative Law Judge now recommends to the **Commissioner of Insurance** the following:

 That Applicant's application for an Indiana Non Resident Producer's License be DENIED.

# PRELIMINARY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER AND NOTICE OF LICENSE DENIAL

The Indiana Department of Insurance, pursuant to the Indiana Administrative Orders and Procedures Act, Indiana Code § 4-21.5-1 *et seq.* and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12, hereby gives notice to Robert D. Campbell ("Applicant") of the following Administrative Order:

- Applicant filed an application for nonresident licensure with the Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Insurance ("Commissioner") on December 03, 2017.
- 2. Before approving an application, the Commissioner must find that the applicant has met specific requirements under Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-8 and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12.
- 3. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(6) provides that the Commissioner may refuse to issue an insurance producer license for having been convicted of a felony.
- 4. Following a review of materials submitted by Applicant in support of his application, the Commissioner being fully advised, now hereby notifies Applicant that he has not fully met the requirements of licensure as stated by Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(6) due to his August 05, 2005 North Carolina convictions of three (3) counts Indecent Liberties With a

Child, a Class F Felony, and two (2) counts of Second Degree Kidnapping, a Class E Felony.

Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(d) provides that the applicant may, not more than sixty-three

(63) days after notice of denial of the application is mailed, make written demand to the

Commissioner for a hearing before the Commissioner to determine the reasonableness of
the Commissioner's action.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Applicant's request for licensure is hereby DENIED pursuant to Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(6), due to his felony convictions.
