PRELIMINARY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER AND NOTICE OF LICENSE DENIAL

The Indiana Department of Insurance ("Department"), pursuant to the Indiana Administrative Orders and Procedures Act, Indiana Code § 4-21.5-1 et seq. and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12, hereby gives notice to Thomang C. Thang ("Applicant") of the following Administrative Order:

- Applicant filed an application for resident producer licensure with the Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Insurance ("Commissioner") on March 5, 2020.
- 2. Before approving an application, the Commissioner must find that the applicant has met specific requirements under Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-6 and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12.
- 3. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(1) provides, in part, that the Commissioner may refuse to issue an insurance producer's license for providing incorrect, misleading, incomplete, or materially untrue information in a license application.
- 4. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(2)(D) provides, in part, that the Commissioner may refuse to issue an insurance producer's license for violating an Order of the Commissioner.

- 5. Following a review of public records, the Commissioner, being fully advised, now hereby notifies Applicant that he has not fully met the requirements of licensure as stated by Indiana Codes § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(1) due to his failure to disclose on a license application his October 7, 2002 conviction for Minor Consumption of Alcohol, a Class C Misdemeanor, and his July 23, 2014 conviction for Invasion of Privacy, a Class A Misdemeanor.
- 6. Following a review of public records, the Commissioner, being fully advised, now hereby notifies Applicant that he has not fully met the requirements of licensure as stated by Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(2)(D) by failing to pay a Five Hundred Dollar (\$500) civil penalty in violation of the Commissioner's Final Order, which was issued on June 12, 2020 by the Indiana Department of Insurance.
- 7. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(d) provides that the applicant may, not more than sixty-three (63) days after notice of denial of the application is mailed, make written demand to the Commissioner for a hearing before the Commissioner to determine the reasonableness of the Commissioner's action.
- 8. This is considered an agency action. This action has been initiated by the aforementioned authority. If you choose to appeal this agency action, the State of Indiana Office of Administrative Law Proceedings ("OALP") will assign an administrative law judge to preside over this matter, and subsequently you will be contacted by the OALP with more information to begin the administrative process.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Applicant's request for licensure is hereby DENIED pursuant to Indiana Codes §§ 27-1-15.6-12(b)(1) and 27-1-15.6-12(b)(2)(D) due to Applicant's failure to disclose a two (2) misdemeanor convictions on an application for licensure, and for violating an Order of the Commissioner. Applicant may reapply for licensure not less than one (1) year from the date of this order.
