PRELIMINARY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
AND NOTICE OF LICENSE DENIAL

The Indiana Department of Insurance (“Department”), pursuant to the Indiana Administrative Orders and Procedures Act, Indiana Code § 4-21.5-1 *et seq.* and Indiana Code § 27-1-28-18, hereby gives notice to Quinterrical Warner (“Applicant”) of the following Administrative Order:

1. Applicant submitted an application for nonresident independent adjuster licensure with the Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Insurance (“Commissioner”) on June 26, 2020.
2. Before approving an application, the Commissioner must find that the applicant has met specific requirements under Indiana Code § 27-1-28-17 and Indiana Code § 27-1-28-18.
3. Indiana Code § 27-1-28-18(b)(1) states that the Commissioner may refuse to issue an independent adjuster license for providing incorrect, misleading, incomplete, or materially untrue information in a license application.

4. Following a review of public records and the materials submitted by the Applicant in support of her application, the Commissioner being fully advised, now hereby notifies Applicant that she has not fully met the requirements of licensure, as stated by Indiana Code § 27-1-28-18(b)(1), due to Applicant's failure to provide complete information to the Department regarding her pending criminal charges from May 12, 2020, for Battery-Family Violence, a Misdemeanor, and Criminal Trespass, a Misdemeanor, in the State of Georgia.
5. Indiana Code § 27-1-28-18(c) provides that the Applicant may, not more than thirty (30) days after notice of denial of the applicant's application is mailed, make written demand to the Commissioner for a hearing before the Commissioner to determine the reasonableness of the Commissioner's action.
6. This is considered an agency action. This action has been initiated by the aforementioned authority. If you choose to appeal this agency action, the State of Indiana Office of Administrative Law Proceedings ("OALP") will assign an administrative law judge to preside over this matter, and subsequently you will be contacted by the OALP with more information to begin the administrative process.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Applicant's request for licensure is hereby DENIED pursuant to Indiana Code § 27-1-28-18(b)(1), due to Applicant's failure to provide complete information to the Department regarding Applicant's pending criminal charges. Applicant may reapply for licensure not less than one (1) year from the date of this order.
