PRELIMINARY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER AND NOTICE OF LICENSE DENIAL

The Indiana Department of Insurance ("Department"), pursuant to the Indiana Administrative Orders and Procedures Act, Indiana Code § 4-21.5-1 et seq. and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12, hereby gives notice to Rashaad Rolley ("Applicant") of the following Administrative Order:

- Applicant submitted an application for nonresident insurance producer licensure with the Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Insurance ("Commissioner") on March 18, 2021.
- 2. Before approving an application, the Commissioner must find that the applicant has met specific requirements under Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-8 and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12.
- 3. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(1) states, in part, that the Commissioner may deny a producer's license for providing incorrect, misleading, incomplete, or materially untrue information in a license application.

- 4. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(8) states, in part, that the Commissioner may deny a producer's license for using fraudulent, coercive, or dishonest practices, or demonstrating incompetence, untrustworthiness, or financial irresponsibility in the conduct of business in Indiana or elsewhere.
- 5. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(9) states, in part, that the Commissioner may deny a producer's license for having an insurance producer license, or its equivalent, denied, suspended, or revoked in any other state, province, district, or territory.
- 6. Following a review of public records and the materials submitted by the Applicant in support of his application, the Commissioner being fully advised, now hereby notifies Applicant that he has not fully met the requirements of licensure, as stated by Indiana Codes §§ 27-1-15.6-12(b)(1) and 27-1-15.6-12(b)(8), due to Applicant's criminal history, which includes convictions from August 4, 2017, for Simple Battery against a Police Officer, a Misdemeanor; Custody/Confinement, a Misdemeanor; Hindering Persons Making Emergency Telephone Call, a Misdemeanor; Disorderly Conduct, a Misdemeanor; and Obstruction of Law Enforcement Officer, a Misdemeanor, all from the State of Georgia; and for Applicant's failure to disclose the aforementioned criminal convictions on his application for licensure.
- 7. Following a review of public records and the materials submitted by the Applicant in support of his application, the Commissioner being fully advised, now hereby notifies Applicant that he has not fully met the requirements of licensure, as stated by Indiana Codes §§ 27-1-15.6-12(b)(1) and 27-1-15.6-12(b)(9), due to Applicant's administrative action from January 19, 2021, from the State of Delaware, wherein Applicant was denied

licensure due to applicant's criminal history; and the failure to disclose the aforementioned

administrative action on his application for licensure.

8. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(d) provides that the Applicant may, not more than sixty-three

(63) days after notice of denial of the applicant's application is mailed, make written

demand to the Commissioner for a hearing before the Commissioner to determine the

reasonableness of the Commissioner's action.

9. This is considered an agency action. This action has been initiated by the aforementioned

authority. If you choose to appeal this agency action, the State of Indiana Office of

Administrative Law Proceedings ("OALP") will assign an administrative law judge to

preside over this matter, and subsequently you will be contacted by the OALP with more

information to begin the administrative process.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Applicant's request for licensure is hereby DENIED

pursuant to Indiana Codes §§ 27-1-15.6-12(b)(1), 27-1-15.6-12(b)(8), and 27-1-15.6-12(b)(9), due

to Applicant's criminal history, having a license denial, and for Applicant's failure to disclose the

aforementioned on his application for licensure. Applicant may reapply for licensure not less than

one (1) year from the date of this order.
