## PRELIMINARY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER AND NOTICE OF LICENSE DENIAL

The Indiana Department of Insurance, pursuant to the Indiana Administrative Orders and Procedures Act, Indiana Code § 4-21.5-1 *et seq.* and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12, hereby gives notice to Letitia Miller ("Applicant") of the following Administrative Order:

- 1. Applicant submitted an application for resident producer licensure with the Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Insurance ("Commissioner") on October 22, 2021.
- 2. Before approving an application, the Commissioner must find that the Applicant has met specific requirements under Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-6 and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12.
- 3. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(1) authorizes the Commissioner to refuse to issue a producer license for providing incorrect, misleading, incomplete, or materially untrue information in a license application.
- 4. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(8) authorizes the Commissioner to refuse to issue a producer license for using fraudulent, coercive, or dishonest practices, or demonstrating

- incompetence, untrustworthiness or financial irresponsibility in the conduct of business in Indiana or elsewhere.
- 5. Following a review of public records and the materials submitted by Applicant in support of her application, the Commissioner being fully advised, now hereby notifies Applicant that she has not fully met the requirements of licensure as stated by Indiana Codes §§ 27-1-15.6-12(b)(1) and 27-1-15.6-12(b)(8) due to her February 17, 2006, conviction for Theft, a Class A Misdemeanor, from the State of Indiana, and for her failure to disclose the same on her application for licensure.
- 6. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(d) provides that the applicant may, not more than sixty-three (63) days after notice of denial of the application is mailed, make written demand to the Commissioner for a hearing before the Commissioner to determine the reasonableness of the Commissioner's action.
- 7. This is considered an agency action. This action has been initiated by the aforementioned authority. If you choose to appeal this agency action, the State of Indiana Office of Administrative Law Proceedings ("OALP") will assign an administrative law judge to preside over this matter, and subsequently you will be contacted by the OALP with more information to begin the administrative process.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Applicant's request for licensure is hereby DENIED pursuant to Indiana Codes §§ 27-1-15.6-12(b)(1) and 27-1-15.6-12(b)(8) due to her criminal history, and for her failure to disclose the same on her application for licensure. Applicant may reapply for licensure not less than one (1) year from the date of this order.
