FINAL ORDER

The Enforcement Division of the Indiana Department of Insurance ("Department"), by counsel, Samantha Aldridge, and Jonathan Howard ("Respondent"), a resident producer, signed an Agreed Entry which purports to resolve all issues involved in the above-captioned cause number, and which has been submitted to the Commissioner of Insurance ("Commissioner") for approval.

The Commissioner, after reviewing the Agreed Entry, which places Respondent on probation for a period of two (2) years, during which time Respondent will be required to submit a current list of appointments every six (6) months, and imposes a fine of one thousand dollars (\$1,000), due to Respondent's criminal history and his failure to timely report his criminal proceedings, finds it has been entered into fairly and without fraud, duress or undue influence, and is fair and equitable between the parties. The Commissioner hereby incorporates the Agreed Entry as if fully set forth herein and approves and adopts in full the Agreed Entry as a resolution of this matter.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Commissioner as follows:

1. Respondent's resident producer license shall be renewed, and it shall be

placed on probation for a period of two (2) years, beginning the date the

Commissioner signs this Final Order.

2. Respondent shall pay a civil penalty in the amount of one thousand dollars

(\$1,000) to the Department within thirty (30) days after the Commissioner

signs this Final Order.

3. During the probationary period, Respondent shall submit a current list of

appointments every six (6) months from the date of this Final Order via email

at: Enforcement@idoi.in.gov.

4. During the probationary period, any violations of Title 27 of the Indiana Code

will result in the Department seeking immediate revocation of Respondent's

license.

AGREED ENTRY

This Agreed Entry is executed by and between the Enforcement Division of the Indiana Department of Insurance ("Department"), by counsel, Samantha Aldridge, and Jonathan Howard ("Respondent"), to resolve all issues in the above-captioned cause number. This Agreed Entry is subject to the review and approval of Amy L. Beard, Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Insurance ("Commissioner").

WHEREAS, Respondent has held a resident producer license since September 21, 2009.

WHEREAS, Respondent was charged on or around September 30, 2019 with Stalking, a Level 6 Felony.

WHEREAS, Respondent failed to timely report this criminal prosecution to the Department within 30 days of his initial hearing, held on October 1, 2019.

WHEREAS, Respondent was convicted on March 12, 2020, for Stalking, as an A Misdemeanor;

WHEREAS, Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(2)(A), states, in part, that the Commissioner may levy a civil penalty and place a producer on probation for violating an insurance law.

WHEREAS, Indiana Code §27-1-15.6-7(b) is an insurance law, that states in part, that not more than thirty (30) days after an initial pretrial hearing date, a producer shall report to the Commissioner any criminal prosecution of the producer initiated in any jurisdiction.

WHEREAS, Indiana Code § 27-1-15.8-12(b)(8) states, in part, that the Commissioner may levy a civil penalty and place a producer on probation for using fraudulent, coercive, or dishonest practices, or demonstrating incompetence, untrustworthiness, or financial irresponsibility in the conduct of business in Indiana or elsewhere.

WHEREAS, the Department and Respondent (collectively, the "Parties") reached this agreement as a result of the evidentiary hearing held June 28, 2022.

IT IS, THEREFORE, NOW AGREED by and between the Parties as follows:

- The Commissioner has jurisdiction over the subject matter and the Parties to this Agreed Entry.
- 2. In order to avoid formal litigation in this matter, Respondent has determined that it is in his best interests to enter into this Agreed Entry. As such, Respondent acknowledges that he executes this Agreed Entry with full realization of its contents and effects.
- 3. This Agreed Entry is executed knowingly, voluntarily, and freely by the Parties.
 The Parties agree that the terms of this Agreed Entry constitute final resolution of this matter.

- 4. Respondent knowingly, voluntarily, and freely waives the right to a public hearing on this matter, including the right to appear in person before the Commissioner, present evidence, cross-examine witnesses, and present arguments.
- 5. Respondent knowingly, voluntarily, and freely waives the right to judicial review of this matter or otherwise appeal or challenge the validity of this Agreed Entry.
- 6. Respondent knowingly, voluntarily, and freely waives, releases, and forever discharges all claims or challenges, known or unknown, against the Department, its Commissioner, employees, agents, and representatives, in their individual and official capacities, that arise out of or are related to the Agreed Entry or Final Order, including but not limited to any act or omission as part of the underlying audit, investigation, negotiation, or approval process.
- Respondent's Indiana resident producer's license shall be renewed contingent upon Respondent's timely payment of the civil penalty. Respondent shall pay a civil penalty in the amount of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) to the Department within thirty (30) days after the Commissioner signs the Final Order adopting this Agreed Entry. Failure to timely pay the civil penalty may result in the Department taking an administrative action against Respondent's nonresident producer license.
- 8. Respondent shall be placed on probation for a period of two (2) years beginning the date the Commissioner signs the Final Order adopting this Agreed Entry.

 During the probationary period, any violations of Title 27 of the Indiana Code will result in the Department seeking immediate revocation of Respondent's

- license. During the probationary period, Respondent shall submit a current list of appointments to the Department every six (6) months from the date of the Final Order via email at: Enforcement@idoi.in.gov.
- 9. Respondent has carefully read and examined this Agreed Entry and fully understands its terms.
- 10. Respondent has had the opportunity to have this Agreed Entry reviewed by legal counsel of his choosing, at his own expense, and is aware of the benefits gained and obligations incurred by the execution of this Agreed Entry. Respondent understands and agrees that the Department cannot give him legal advice.
- 11. Respondent has entered into this Agreed Entry knowingly, voluntarily, and freely, and has not been subject to duress, coercion, threat, or undue influence.
- 12. This Agreed Entry constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties, and no other promises or agreements, express or implied, have been made by the Department or by any employee, director, agent, or other representative thereof to induce Respondent to enter this Agreed Entry.
- 13. The Department agrees to accept Respondent's compliance with the terms of this Agreed Entry as full satisfaction of this matter, and warrants and represents that so long as Respondent complies with the terms of this Agreed Entry, the Department will not bring any further action against Respondent based on the facts that give rise to this Agreed Entry.
- 14. In the event the Department finds there has been a breach of any of the provisions of this Agreed Entry, the Department may reopen this matter and pursue alternative action pursuant to Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12.

- 15. Applicant waives any applicable statute of limitations for purposes of any enforcement of the terms and conditions of this Agreed Entry.
- 16. Respondent acknowledges that this Agreed Entry may be admitted into evidence in any judicial or administrative proceeding against Respondent to enforce the terms and conditions contained herein.
- 17. Respondent understands that this Agreed Entry resolves only the matter pending with the Department and does not affect any criminal prosecution or civil litigation that may be pending or hereinafter commence against Respondent.
- 18. This Agreed Entry does not in any way affect the Department's authority in future audits, investigations, examinations, negotiations, or other complaints involving Respondent.
- 19. It is expressly understood that this Agreed Entry is subject to the Commissioner's acceptance and has no force or effect until such acceptance is evidence by the entry of a Final Order by the Commissioner.
- 20. Should this Agreed Entry not be accepted by the Commissioner, it is agreed that presentation to, and consideration of this Agreed Entry by the Commissioner, shall not unfairly or illegally prejudice the Commissioner or the Respondent from further participation in or resolution of these proceedings.
- 21. If this Agreed Entry is accepted by the Commissioner, it will become part of Respondent's permanent record and may be considered in future actions brought by the Department or any other regulator against Respondent. It is further understood that, if accepted by the Commissioner, this Agreed Entry and resulting Final Order are public records pursuant to Indiana Code § 4-21.5-3-32 that may

not be sealed or otherwise withheld from the public and may be reported to the National Association of Insurance Commissioners and published on the Department's website as required.

Respondent acknowledges that this is an Administrative Action he may be 22. required to report to other jurisdictions in which he is licensed and on future licensing applications.
