PRELIMINARY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER AND NOTICE OF LICENSE DENIAL

The Indiana Department of Insurance, pursuant to the Indiana Administrative Orders and Procedures Act, Indiana Code § 4-21.5-1 *et seq.* and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12, hereby gives notice to Matthew Bernard ("Applicant") of the following Administrative Order:

- 1. Applicant filed an application for nonresident producer licensure with the Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Insurance ("Commissioner") on November 8, 2021.
- 2. Before approving an application, the Commissioner must find that the Applicant has met specific requirements under Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-8 and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12.
- 3. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(6) provides, in part, that the Commissioner may refuse to issue an insurance producer license for having been convicted of a felony.
- 4. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(9) states, in part, that the Commissioner may refuse to issue an insurance producer's license for having an insurance producer license, or its equivalent, denied, suspended, or revoked in any other state, province, district or territory.

5. Following a review of materials submitted by Applicant in support of his application, the

Commissioner being fully advised, now hereby notifies Applicant that he has not fully met the

requirements of licensure as stated by Indiana Codes §§ 27-1-15.6-12(b)(6) and 27-1-15.6-12(b)(9)

due to Applicant's conviction from April 27, 2022, in the Court of Common Pleas, Franklin

County, Ohio, for Telephone Harassment, a 5th Degree Felony, and the administrative action by

Illinois Department of Insurance by denying his license application in January 2022.

6. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(d) provides that the applicant may, not more than sixty-three (63)

days after notice of denial of the application is mailed, make written demand to the Commissioner

for a hearing before the Commissioner to determine the reasonableness of the Commissioner's

action.

7. This is considered an agency action. This action has been initiated by the aforementioned

authority. If you choose to appeal this agency action, the State of Indiana Office of Administrative

Law Proceedings ("OALP") will assign an administrative law judge to preside over this matter,

and subsequently you will be contacted by the OALP with more information to begin the

administrative process.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Applicant's request for licensure is hereby DENIED pursuant to

Indiana Codes §§ 27-1-15.6-12(b)(6) and 27-1-15.6-12(b)(9) due to Applicant's felony conviction and the

administrative action by Illinois. Applicant may reapply for licensure not less than one (1) year from the

date of this order.
