PRELIMINARY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER AND NOTICE OF LICENSE DENIAL

The Indiana Department of Insurance, pursuant to the Indiana Administrative Orders and Procedures Act, Indiana Code § 4-21.5-1 *et seq.* and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12, hereby gives notice to Hunter Miller ("Applicant") of the following Administrative Order:

- 1. Applicant filed an application for resident producer licensure with the Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Insurance ("Commissioner") on May 12, 2022.
- 2. Before approving an application, the Commissioner must find that the applicant has met specific requirements under Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-6 and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12.
- 3. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(1) provides, in part, that the Commissioner may refuse to issue an insurance producer's license for providing incorrect, misleading, incomplete, or materially untrue information in a license application.
- 4. Following a review of public records and a review of materials submitted by Applicant in support of his application, the Commissioner, being fully advised, now hereby notifies Applicant that he has not fully met the requirements of licensure as stated by Indiana Code

§ 27-1-15.6-12(b)(1), due to his failure to disclose on his application for licensure his May

6, 2020 pending charge for Domestic Battery Committed in the Presence of a Child Less

Than 16 Years Old, a Level 6 Felony; Applicant entered into a Pretrial Diversion

Agreement for the aforementioned pending felony on April 9, 2021.

5. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(d) provides that the applicant may, not more than sixty-three

(63) days after notice of denial of the application is mailed, make written demand to the

Commissioner for a hearing before the Commissioner to determine the reasonableness of

the Commissioner's action.

6. This is considered an administrative action by the Indiana Department of Insurance. If you

choose to appeal this administrative action, please follow the aforementioned

instructions. Subsequently, after the Department has received your written request for a

hearing, the State of Indiana Office of Administrative Law Proceedings ("OALP") will

assign an administrative law judge to preside over this matter, and you will receive more

information from OALP to begin the administrative process.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Applicant's request for licensure is hereby DENIED

pursuant to Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(1) due to Applicant's failure to disclose a pending

felony charge on an application. Applicant may reapply for licensure not less than one (1) year

from the date of this order.
