**PRELIMINARY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER**  
**AND NOTICE OF LICENSE DENIAL**


The Indiana Department of Insurance (“Department”), pursuant to the Indiana Administrative Orders and Procedures Act, Indiana Code § 4-21.5-1 *et seq.* and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12, hereby gives notice to Shiya Hargrow (“Applicant”) of the following Administrative Order:

1. Applicant submitted an application for nonresident producer licensure with the Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Insurance (“Commissioner”) on August 23, 2022.
2. Applicant was convicted on or about July 7, 2015 of Cruelty to Children in the First Degree, a Felony; Three (3) counts of Aggravated Battery, a Felony, in the State of Georgia.
3. On or about August 6, 2020, Applicant was denied licensure in California for her criminal history.
4. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(6) provides, in part, that the Commissioner may refuse to issue an insurance producer license for having been convicted of a felony.

5. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(9) provides, in part, that the Commissioner may refuse to issue an insurance producer license for having an insurance producer license, or its equivalent, denied, suspended, or revoked in any other state, province, district, or territory.
6. Following a review of public records and the materials submitted by the Applicant, the Commissioner, being fully advised, now hereby notifies Applicant that he has not fully met the requirements of licensure, as stated by Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(6) and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(9), due to Applicant's July 7, 2015 conviction of Cruelty to Children in the First Degree, and three (3) counts of Aggravated Battery and having an insurance producer license denied by the State of California on August 6, 2020.
7. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(d) provides that the Applicant may, not more than sixty-three (63) days after notice of denial of the applicant's application is mailed, make written demand to the Commissioner for a hearing before the Commissioner to determine the reasonableness of the Commissioner's action.
8. This is considered an administrative action by the Indiana Department of Insurance. If you choose to appeal this administrative action, please follow the aforementioned instructions. Subsequently, after the Department has received your written request for a hearing, The State of Indiana Office of Administrative Law Proceedings ("OALP") will assign an administrative law judge to preside over this matter, and you will receive more information from OALP to begin the administrative process.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED** that Applicant's request for licensure is hereby **DENIED** pursuant to Indiana Code 27-1-15.6-12(b)(6) and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(9), due to Applicant's felony convictions and licensure denial. Applicant may reapply for licensure not less than one (1) year from the date of this order.
