PRELIMINARY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
AND NOTICE OF LICENSE DENIAL

The Indiana Department of Insurance (“Department”), pursuant to the Indiana Administrative Orders and Procedures Act, Indiana Code § 4-21.5-1 *et seq.* and Indiana Code § 27-1-28-18, hereby gives notice to Carmen Leann Oliver (“Applicant”) of the following Administrative Order:

1. Applicant submitted an application for a nonresident independent adjuster licensure with the Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Insurance (“Commissioner”) on April 6, 2023.
2. Before approving an application, the Commissioner must find that the applicant has met specific requirements under Indiana Code § 27-1-28-17 and Indiana Code § 27-1-28-18.
3. Following a review of public records and the materials submitted by Applicant, the Commissioner, being fully advised, now hereby notifies Applicant that Applicant has not fully met the requirements of licensure as stated by Indiana Codes §§ 27-1-28-18(b)(1) and 27-1-28-18(b)(6) due to Applicant failing to disclose a May 31, 2012, conviction for

Assault and Battery, a misdemeanor in the State of Oklahoma, and for having an April 1, 2010, conviction for Unlawful Possession of a Controlled Drug, and a conviction for Assault with a Dangerous Weapon, both felonies in the State of Oklahoma.

4. Indiana Code § 27-1-28-18(b)(1) states, in part, that the Commissioner may refuse to issue an independent adjuster license for providing incorrect, misleading, incomplete, or materially untrue information in a license application.
5. Indiana Code § 27-1-28-18(b)(6) states, in part, that the Commissioner may refuse to issue independent adjuster license for having been convicted of a felony.
6. Indiana Code § 27-1-28-18(c) provides that the applicant may, not more than thirty (30) days after receiving the Commissioner's notice of refusal, make written demand upon the Commissioner for a hearing to determine the reasonableness of the refusal.
7. This is considered an administrative action by the Indiana Department of Insurance. If you choose to appeal this administrative action, please follow the aforementioned instructions. Subsequently, after the Department has received your written request for a hearing, the State of Indiana Office of Administrative Law Proceedings ("OALP") will assign an administrative law judge to preside over this matter, and you will receive more information from OALP to begin the administrative process.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Applicant's request for licensure is hereby **DENIED** pursuant to Indiana Codes §§ 27-1-28-18(b)(1) and 27-1-28-18(b)(6) due to Applicant's felony convictions, and for Applicant's failure to disclose a misdemeanor conviction on their application for licensure. Applicant may reapply for licensure not less than one (1) year from the date of this order.
