## PRELIMINARY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER AND NOTICE OF LICENSE DENIAL

The Indiana Department of Insurance ("Department"), pursuant to the Indiana Administrative Orders and Procedures Act, Indiana Code § 4-21.5-1 *et seq.* and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12, hereby gives notice to Matthew Gering ("Applicant") of the following Administrative Order:

- 1. Applicant submitted an application for nonresident producer licensure with the Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Insurance ("Commissioner") on April 24, 2023.
- 2. On or about May 30, 2023, Applicant was denied licensure in Kansas for Applicant's criminal history.
- 3. On or about August 28, 2023, Applicant was denied licensure in South Dakota for Applicant's criminal history.
- 4. On or about September 13, 2023, Applicant was denied licensure in California for Applicant's criminal history.

- 5. On or about August 9, 2023, Applicant was issued a probationary license for a period of twenty-four (24) months from the state of Georgia through a consent order due to Applicant's criminal history.
- 6. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(9) provides, in part, that the Commissioner may refuse to issue an insurance producer license for having an insurance producer license, or its equivalent, denied, suspended, or revoked in any other state, province, district, or territory.
- 7. Following a review of public records and the materials submitted by the Applicant, the Commissioner, being fully advised, now hereby notifies Applicant that he has not fully met the requirements of licensure, as stated by Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(9), due to having an insurance producer license denied by the State of Kansas on May 30, 2023, South Dakota on August 28, 2023, and California on September 28, 2023.
- 8. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(d) provides that the Applicant may, not more than sixty-three (63) days after notice of denial of the applicant's application is mailed, make written demand to the Commissioner for a hearing before the Commissioner to determine the reasonableness of the Commissioner's action.
- 9. This is considered an administrative action by the Indiana Department of Insurance. If you choose to appeal this administrative action, please follow the aforementioned instructions. Subsequently, after the Department has received your written request for a hearing, The State of Indiana Office of Administrative Law Proceedings ("OALP") will assign an administrative law judge to preside over this matter, and you will receive more information from OALP to begin the administrative process.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Applicant's request for licensure is hereby DENIED pursuant to Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(9), due to Applicant's licensure denials. Applicant may reapply for licensure not less than one (1) year from the date of this order.
