Soil and groundwater investigation and remediation. Estimated cost: \$65,000

Background

The site is currently an abandoned automobile service station. In May 1994, a confirmed release was reported during the removal of three gasoline underground storage tanks (USTs). Samples collected during closure activities indicated that soil and groundwater had been impacted.

Current Status

The ultimate goal of the Indiana Brownfields Program is to complete remediation on the subject property and achieve a No Further Action designation for redevelopment. Consequently, two rounds of additional groundwater and soil samples were collected October 29, 2009, and November 9, 2009, to determine the extent of groundwater and soil contamination. The subsurface investigation included the installation of thirteen soil borings and temporary monitoring wells. Soil excavation and permanent monitoring well installation is scheduled for early December 2009. The site is expected to achieve commercial/industrial closure through recordation of an environmental restrictive covenant.
