

# American Recovery & Reinvestment Act (ARRA) Leaking Underground Storage Tank (LUST)

## Interstate Truck Plaza, Plymouth

### **ARRA Assistance Provided**

Underground storage tank (UST) removal, soil and groundwater investigation and remediation.

Estimated cost: \$120,000

## Background

The site is currently a vacant property and was formerly occupied by a bulk petroleum distribution facility. The facility was believed to be in operation from the early 1930s until the late 1970s. Petroleum impacted soil and groundwater was discovered during an initial site assessment conducted in 2002. Furthermore, the initial assessment determined that five USTs potentially remained on-site.

## **Current Status**

The ultimate goal of the Indiana Brownfields
Program is to complete remediation on the subject
property and achieve a No Further Action designation for redevelopment. Consequently, five USTs
located at the property were removed on September
28, 2009. Additional soil and groundwater subsurface investigation was conducted on November 11,
2009 to determine the extent of contamination. The
subsurface investigation included the installation of
six temporary soil borings and three permanent
monitoring wells. Pending analytical results,
groundwater monitoring is scheduled to begin in
early December. The site is expected to achieve
commercial/industrial closure through recordation
of an environmental restrictive covenant.
