Soil and groundwater investigation and remediation. Estimated cost: \$120,000

Background

The site is currently an active automobile service station. Historically, the site was utilized as a gasoline service station until the 1980s. In 1991, three gasoline underground storage tanks (USTs) were removed. Additional subsurface investigations determined that groundwater and soil had been impacted. Due to insufficient funding, the owner was unable to properly remediate the site.

Current Status

The ultimate goal of the Indiana Brownfields Program is to complete remediation on the subject property and achieve a No Further Action designation. Consequently, additional groundwater and soil samples were collected on October 14 and 15, 2009, to determine the extent of groundwater and soil contamination. The subsurface investigation included the installation of thirteen soil borings and temporary monitoring wells. Soil excavation and permanent monitoring well installation is scheduled for November 2009. It is expected that the site will achieve commercial/industrial closure through recordation of an environmental restrictive covenant.
