IWM COMPUTER USE & GHOST EMPLOYMENT II

Inspector General Staff Attorney Amanda Schaeffer Lufkin, after an investigation by Special Agent Chuck Coffin, reports as follows:

In the course of investigating another case, 2010-06-0162, Special Agent Chuck Coffin of the Office of Inspector General (OIG) discovered what appeared to be violations of Code of Ethics rules 42 IAC 1-5-12 (use of state property) and 42 IAC 1-5-13 (ghost employment), by an employee with the Indiana War Memorials. Specifically, the employee's email and computer use records showed that he had used his state-issued computer to send and receive inappropriate emails, visit inappropriate websites, and view inappropriate images, all dealing with pornography. In addition, the employee's computer use records and attendance reports reflected that he routinely engaged in these types of activities during working hours for the state.

In December of 2009, the State Ethics Commission (SEC) issued a Final Report based on a previous OIG investigation (2009-04-0082) of this same respondent for similar activity. In that Final Report, respondent "admitted to

violating 42 IAC 1-5-12, the use of state property rule, and 42 IAC 1-5-13 the ghost employment rule.” At that time, the respondent entered into a Settlement Agreement and received SEC sanctions including a two (2) week suspension without pay and a \$1,000 fine.

At its monthly meeting on September 9, 2010, the SEC found that probable cause supported the new alleged violations of the use of state property and ghost employment rules by respondent and advised the OIG to proceed with the matters.

On December 1, 2010, a Settlement Agreement was approved by the SEC which found the respondent in violation of these rules. Because of respondent’s multiple violations, the SEC ordered the respondent to be barred from any future state employment.
