Dear Governor Holcomb:

The Underground Plant Protection Advisory Committee (UPPAC) provides penalty recommendations to the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (IURC) regarding findings of violations of the Indiana 811 Law, Indiana Code chapter-8-1-26. UPPAC members are Governor appointees who are required by statute to be representatives of various stakeholders in this process, including utility and excavation companies who are often parties in excavation damages cases. In compliance with Indiana Code § 4-2-6-9, UPPAC members who are employees of a party in a case have abstained from the discussion and voting on penalty recommendations that could involve their employer. On June 9, 2016, the Indiana State Ethics Commission issued a formal advisory opinion (attached) stating that UPPAC members in this situation need to submit a conflict of interest disclosure statement on at least an annual basis, indicating the possible conflict regarding their employer and the screening process in place that requires UPPAC members to abstain from the discussion and vote on any penalty recommendation involving their employer.

In your role as the appointing authority for UPPAC, and in my role as the Ethics Officer for UPPAC, please consider this letter your official notification from UPPAC current members Angie DeKemper, Bruce Dickie, Rick Smith, Scott Sontag, Blaine Walters, and Ben Warren, as required by Indiana Code § 4-2-6-9, of these possible conflicts of interest, with the attached disclosure statements, which include the ongoing screening process of abstaining from any discussion or vote regarding penalty recommendations involving their employers.
