Describe the conflict of interest:  
I am a member of the Underground Plant Protection Advisory Committee (Advisory Committee). By statute, I am appointed by the Governor and therefore, I am considered a "state appointee" for purposes of Ind. code 4-2-6-9. The Advisory Committee recommends penalties for excavation damage cases under Ind. code chapter 8-1-26. As per a formal advisory opinion of the Indiana State Ethics Commission, my participation in recommending a penalty constitutes a "decision or vote" for purposes of the conflict of interest rule.

The majority of excavation damage cases have an operator and excavator as parties to the case. I work for Miller Pipeline an excavator. Therefore, a conflict of interest would arise if I were to participate in a "decision or vote" in a case in which Miller Pipeline is a named party.

**Subject:** Notification re: UPPAC Members Possible Conflicts of Interest

Dear Governor Michael R. Pence:

The Underground Plant Protection Advisory Committee (UPPAC) provides penalty recommendations to the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (IURC) regarding findings of violations of the excavation damages statute, Indiana Code chapter 8-1-26. UPPAC members are Governor appointees, who are required by statute to be representatives of various stakeholders in this process, including utility and excavation companies who are often parties in excavation damages cases. In compliance with Indiana Code § 4-2-6-9, UPPAC members who are employees of a party in a case have abstained from the discussion and voting on penalty recommendations that could involve their employer. On June 9, 2016, the Indiana State Ethics Commission issued a formal advisory opinion (attached) indicating that UPPAC members in this situation need to submit a conflict of interest disclosure statement on at least an annual basis, indicating the possible conflict regarding their employer and the screening process in place that requires UPPAC members to abstain from the discussion and vote on any penalty recommendation involving their employer.

In your role as the appointing authority for UPPAC and in my role as the Ethics Officer for UPPAC, please consider this email your official notification from UPPAC members Ralph Miller, Mark Ritter, Luke Selking, Scott Sontag, Blaine Walters, and Ben Warren, as required by Indiana Code § 4-2-6-9, of these possible conflicts of interest, with the attached disclosure statements, and the ongoing screening process of abstaining from any discussion or vote regarding penalty recommendations involving their employers.
