IGC hired four new people since the last meeting: Rachel Burger as a Background Investigator, Sara Nevins as a Program Coordinator, Amy Willoughby as a Law Enforcement Administrative Assistant, and Josie Conrad as the Executive Administrative Assistant. There have been three promotions: Kimi Simpson from Occupational License Coordinator to Gaming Agent Administrator, Anthony Edwards was promoted to Supervisor and Ed Cinko promoted to Assistant Supervisor at Majestic Casino. The Agent promotions were due to Supervisor Johnnie Hudson retiring. Since the June 2018 Business Meeting, Commission staff has added 35 individuals to the Exclusion List and 5 waivers were granted. Executive Director Tait went on to add that the Investigations Division has completed a reinvestigation of suppliers American Gaming Systems, Data Financial, and Global Surveillance.

- 3) Caesars must provide the Commission with a legal opinion demonstrating compliance with Ind. Code § 4-33-4-21 and Ind. Code § 4-35-5-7; and
- 4) Caesars must close the proposed financing on or before February 28, 2019.






