

RESOLUTION 1997-22

**A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE USE
OF A WIN CARD FOR BLACKJACK**

The Indiana Gaming Commission (“Commission”) adopts the following resolution pursuant to the authority granted to it under IC 4-33 and pursuant to 68 IAC 1-2-6.

The following factors have been considered by the Commission:

1. Pursuant to IC 4-33-10-2(a)(3)(D), it is a crime to use, or possess with the intent to use, a device that assists an individual with “analyzing the strategy for paying [sic] or betting to be used in the game, except as permitted by the Commission.”
2. Gaming International, Inc. has requested that the Commission approve the use of blackjack win cards by patrons on Indiana riverboats. The win cards for blackjack indicates when a patron should split pairs, double down, or take a hit based upon the dealer’s exposed card and based upon a basic strategy for playing blackjack.
3. The basic strategy for playing blackjack is readily available to patrons through various sources.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE INDIANA GAMING
COMMISSION, THAT THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION IS ADOPTED:**

SECTION 1. SCOPE.

This resolution applies to each riverboat licensee and any person who is a patron of a Riverboat Gambling Operation.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS.

The definitions set forth in IC 4-33-2 and 68 IAC apply to this resolution.

**SECTION 3. APPROVAL OF THE USE OF THE BLACKJACK WIN CARD BY
PATRONS.**

The Commission hereby approves the use of a product known as a “basic strategy” blackjack win card by patrons. The win cards that the Commission authorizes for use on riverboats must not be of a size that would obstruct the view of the play of the game or the playing area by surveillance, Commission agents, or riverboat personnel.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This RESOLUTION is effective immediately.
