

## **INDIANA GAMING COMMISSION BUSINESS MEETING**

September 17, 2009  
Hollywood Casino  
Lawrenceburg, Indiana

### **Call to Order and Roll Call:**

Chairman Timothy Murphy called the meeting to order at approximately 1:00 p.m. local time. A quorum was present.

### **Present:**

Commission Members: Tim Murphy, Chairman, Marc Fine, secretary, Tom Swihart, Robert Morgan and Mary Shy. Commission Staff: Ernest E. Yelton, Phil Sicuso, Jennifer Reske, Chris Gray, Matt Shouse, Adam Packer, Lea Ellingwood, Kesha Rich, Garth Brown, Jeff Neuenschwander, George Carey, Tami Timberman-Wright, and members of the public.

### **Approval of the Minutes:**

Upon motion by Tom Swihart, second by Mary Shy, and the unanimous vote of those present, the Commissioners approved the proposed minutes of the June 11, 2009 business meeting.

### **Report of the Executive Director:**

The Executive Director gave the following staff report: Commissioner Justin Christian's term expired. Citing increased professional and business demands, he has asked not to be reappointed. Wade Lowhorn was announced as the State Athletic Commission's new Director. The Assistant Director's position has been filled by Andy Means, former information analyst for the IGC. Joanna Holland has been named as their new administrative assistant. Glen Lloyd, Director of Financial Investigation, retired. Joel DeCapua, one of the original financial investigators, resigned to accept an assignment as an FBI special agent. Replacing Andy Means as Information Analyst is Kesha Rich, formerly the Occupational Licensing Coordinator.

Six junket operators and seven junketeers have been added since the last commission meeting. This raises the total to 10 operators and 11 junketeers.

The Legislative Special Session produced only one bill; the budget. The creation of an Interim Gaming Study Committee was inserted into this bill. The committee is comprised of 4 senators, 4 representatives and two lay appointments of individuals who have a history of financial expertise. Executive Director Yelton was named as an ad hoc member of the group. This statute charges the committee with 17 gaming issues and requires that recommended legislation be

presented by December 1. The committee met August 24 and September 14. It is scheduled to meet again on October 19.

On June 30, the Indiana Supreme Court issued its opinion in *East Chicago I*, holding (1); some of the City's claims should survive a motion to dismiss and be heard on their merits, and: (2) while the LDA is not terminable at the City's will, it may be subject to alteration, if achieved through the appropriate channels of the Indiana Gaming Commission.

The Indiana Supreme Court granted transfer in *East Chicago III* and indicated its intent to conduct oral argument after briefing deadlines. This litigation concerns the constitutionality of Section 302 of the 2007 budget bill, which authorizes the City of East Chicago to unilaterally void the LDA and redirect casino payments directly to the City.

The Supreme Court denied transfer in *Gary v Majestic Star Casinos* which resulted in the trial court reassuming jurisdiction over a contract dispute relating to (1) whether a 2005 amendment to the Gary LDA is valid and in effect, and (2) whether the City is in breach of the original LDA or the 2005 amendment. The trial court needs to first determine whether the dispute is subject to arbitration, and if so, whether the Gaming Commission should be bound by an arbitrator's decision. While the case is pending, LDA escrows of monies from Majestic will remain in place pending further order of the Court.

The Background Investigation Division completed its three-year reinvestigations of Western Money Systems and Dallman. The reports and renewals were submitted to the Commissioners.

On September 1, 2009, the Indiana Gaming Commission's investigation division received an Indiana Riverboat Owner's License application from Icahn Enterprises G.P., Inc ("Icahn Enterprises") and a Personal Disclosure form-1 for Mr. Carl Icahn. The IGC has also received seven Personal Disclosure form-1's for other officers and directors of the Icahn entities involved in the purchase of 43.71% of Tropicana Entertainment ("Tropicana"). Tropicana will be submitting a Transfer of Ownership in a Riverboat Owner's License Application in conjunction with the transfer of the 43% interest. Tropicana has already submitted seven Personal Disclosure form-1 applications for its officers, directors and board members.

Since the June meeting, four individuals have been placed on the Exclusion List, which permanently bars patrons from entering the gaming area of an Indiana casino. Tommy Yeager was excluded for unlawfully taking possession of other patrons' TITOs and redeeming the tickets for cash on five separate occasions. Mr. Yeager pled guilty to one count of conversion in both Switzerland and Harrison counties and received probation. Abedisi Adigun was excluded for past posting a bet while playing baccarat at Ameristar. He was charged with Cheating at a Gambling Game and the matter is pending in the Lake Superior Court. Choi Myeong was excluded for past-posting his bets while playing baccarat at Ameristar on two separate occasions. In 2008 he was excluded from Majestic Star after the first incident. IGC excluded him after the most recent event. Jerry Ray Yates was also excluded Horseshoe Southern Indiana for past-posting bets while playing blackjack. For the year to date, the IGC has placed six patrons on the Exclusion list, bringing the total to 111 individuals who are barred from Indiana casinos.

**Waiver of Rules and Regulations:**

**Argosy** was granted a waiver allowing third party lottery checks to be cashed only on days of the marketing event and granted a waiver allowing “celebrity pit” dealers to wear non obscuring facial make-up and props if necessary. The dealers will also be allowed to keep their own tips which applies only to “celebrity” dealers working in the pit. Argosy was also granted approval of a request to allow non gaming and under 21 employees access through the casino to go to the employee dining room located on the vessel.

**Belterra** was granted a waiver allowing dealers to accept cash tips only during tournament play.

**Blue Chip** was approved a request to include only the titles of the individuals allowed to transfer the currency and chips from the soft count room to the main bank and performing internal audit duties in the internal controls. The individual names will not be required to be in the internal controls.

**Horseshoe Hammond and Horseshoe Southern Indiana** was granted a waiver allowing the dealer, after cutting the cards, to insert the cut card up to one half of one deck from the back of the stack. A request was also approved to allow the centralization/outsourcing of accounts payable to a third party outside of Indiana and to keep digital records, not the originals, of the documentation.
