November 10, 2011
Indiana Chamber of Commerce Conference Center
Indianapolis, Indiana

Call to Order and Roll Call:

Chairman Tim Murphy called the meeting to order at 1:01 p.m. local time. A quorum was present.

Present:

Approval of the Minutes:

Upon motion by Tim Murphy, second by Robert Morgan, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the proposed minutes from the September 15, 2011, business meeting.

Report of the Executive Director:

The Executive Director began his report with a staff update that introduced Dana Coleman, the newest addition to the background and financial investigation division, as Background Investigator.

Executive Director Yelton announced that the background and financial investigation division completed its reinvestigation of Rising Star and supplier Electroncek. The confidential reports were previously submitted to the Commissioners, and Directors Garth Brown and Danielle Leek were present at the meeting to answer questions about the reports.

Executive Director Yelton reported that IGC staff added ten individuals to the Exclusion List since the September Commission Meeting, which barred those patrons from entering any casino in Indiana. Of those ten individuals, four were added to the Exclusion List for either capping, past-posting or pinching their bets while at an Indiana casino. Five individuals were placed on the list for taking illegal possession of a TITO, casino chips or U.S. currency in excess of \$500 or making fraudulent cash withdraws while at an Indiana casino. The final individual added to the Exclusion List, Joshua Stipes, was observed

manipulating an electronic roulette game by taking advantage of a software problem with the game. In addition to being barred, Joshua Stipes was also charged with multiple felony offenses. Executive Director Yelton reported that the updated Exclusion List brought the total to 54 patrons placed on the list this year and 265 individuals total that have been barred from Indiana casinos and racinos.

Waiver of Rules and Regulations:

The members of the Casino Association were granted a waiver for a test period which allows a photograph of the first MTL transaction for each patron. This waiver eliminated the requirement to take a photograph of a patron for each of their MTL transactions.

Blue Chip: Granted a waiver for the addition of a \$10,000 tournament chip.

French Lick: Granted a waiver increasing the aggregate amount of checks cashed within seven days from \$1,000 to \$2,500 for in-house cashing and \$5,000 for checks cashed utilizing a check guarantee service.

Horseshoe Hammond: Granted a waiver for the addition of a \$100,000 tournament chip.

Old Business:

Order 2011-207

The Commission re-visited Order 2011-207, which was tabled at the last meeting. Order 2011-207 regarded Indiana Live! Casino's request to install an additional 200 slot machines in addition to the 2,000 allowed under IC 4-35-7-11.

Action: Upon movement by Tim Murphy, second by Mary Shy, and unanimous vote of those present, Order 2011-207 was removed the table and presented for vote. Commissioner Morgan discussed the status of Indiana Live's violations with Director Chris Gray before the vote. Upon motion by Robert Morgan, second by Tim Murphy, and unanimous vote of those present, Order 2011-207 approved Indiana Live! Casino's request to install not more than 2,200 slot machines on its premises.

Exclusion Violation:

Order 2011-237

An Order Affirming ALJ Michael Cook's Order on Motion on Summary Judgment in Complaint No. 2011-EX-02.

ALJ Michael Cook's Order on Motion for Summary Judgment included a conclusion that the Commission was entitled to the forfeiture of a \$1,719 jackpot won by Albert Matysak at the Blue Chip Casino on March 18, 2011, because Mr. Matysak was an excluded person at the time of winning the jackpot.

Mr. Matysak was present at the meeting to present his view of the events to the Commissioners in order to show that he should be allowed to receive the jackpot that he won at Blue Chip Casino. Gaming Commission attorney Jeff Neuenschwander offered the Commission staff's recommendation that the Commissioners affirm the ALJ's September 29, 2011, order.

Action: Upon motion by Robert Morgan, second by Tim Murphy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission affirmed the ALJ's Order in the complaint number 2011-EX-02. Following this Order, the Commission was entitled to the \$1,719 jackpot forfeited by excluded patron Albert Matysak.

Patron Exclusion:

Order 2011-238

Regarding the Petition for Removal from the Exclusion List of Albert Matysak.

Action: With the recommendation of the Hearing Officer and upon motion by Robert Morgan, second by Mary Shy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission adopted the findings of fact of the hearing office, which approved Mr. Matysak's petition for removal from the Exclusion List.

Order 2011-239

Regarding the Petition for Removal from the Exclusion List of John Branum.

Action: With the recommendation of Commission staff and upon motion by Mary Shy, second by Tim Murphy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission adopted the findings of fact of the hearing office, which approved Mr. Branum's petition for removal from the Exclusion List.

Order 2011-240

Regarding the Settlement Agreement for Jennifer Jo Knox's Appeal of her Placement on the Statewide Exclusion List.

On October 20, 2011, Ms. Knox agreed to a settlement agreement in which her placement on the Commission Exclusion List would be affirmed but she could petition for removal from the exclusion list after two years.

Action: Upon motion by Robert Morgan, second by Tim Murphy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the settlement agreement entered into by Commission staff and Jennifer Jo Knox.

Supplier's License Matters:

Order 2011-241

An Order of the Indiana Gaming Commission Concerning the Renewal of Supplier's Licenses to Aristocrat Technologies, Inc. and Paltronics, Inc.

Action: Upon motion by Tim Murphy, second by Mary Shy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission granted renewal of the licenses for Aristocrat Technologies, Inc., valid November 9, 2011 through November 8, 2012, and Paltronics, Inc., valid November 17, 2011 through November 16, 2012.

Order 2011-242

An Order of the Indiana Gaming Commission Concerning the Transfer of Minority Ownership Interest in Lottomatica Group S.p.A. to DEA Partecipazioni, S.p.A.

Action: Upon motion by Mary Shy, second by Robert Morgan, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the transfer of a minority ownership interest in Lottomatica to Partecipazioni.

Order 2011-243

An Order Waiving 68 IAC 5-2 Concerning a Transfer of Ownership in Atlantic City Coin and Slot Company, Inc. to Alea Partners, LLC.

In Order 2010-39, the Commission approved a transfer of 10% interest in supplier licensee Atlantic City Coin and Slot Company to Alea Partners, LLC. The Commission has determined that the requirements of 68 IAC 5-2 are impractical and burdensome since the Commission has already investigated and approved Alea as a substantial owner of a supplier license under Order 2010-39.

Action: Upon motion by Robert Morgan, second by Tim Murphy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved waiver of 68 IAC 5-2 for purposes of Alea exercising a warrant to acquire additional shares of AC Coin common stock.

**Settlement Agreement of
Bally Technologies, Inc.
11-BALLY-02
Order 2011-244**

A settlement agreement was reached with Bally Technologies, Inc. regarding four violations wherein Bally failed to do the following: enter order of bill validators into the EGDS, receive a vendor's badge upon entering Casino Aztar, send the most current approved software to French Lick Casino and correctly fill a shipment of chips to Horseshoe Southern Indiana. Bally Technologies agreed to a monetary settlement of \$4,000 in lieu of disciplinary action.

Action: Upon motion by Robert Morgan, second by Mary Shy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the proposed terms of the settlement agreement.

Occupational Licensees:

Order 2011-245

An Order Approving the Settlement Agreement between the Indiana Gaming Commission and Laura Long.

Ms. Long violated 68 IAC 2-3-9.1 (a)(5) that required all occupational licensees to notify the Commission in writing any time the licensee had been arrested, indicted, charged, convicted or plead guilty to any felony or misdemeanor offense within 10 calendar days of the event. Ms. Long failed to disclose her arrest for Driving under the Influence until 888 days after the arrest took place.

The terms of the settlement agreement reached with Ms. Long stipulated that her occupational license shall be voluntarily relinquished for two working days.

Action: Upon motion by Tim Murphy, second by Mary Shy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the proposed terms of the settlement agreement.

Order 2011-246

An Order of the Indiana Gaming Commission regarding the Request of Rodney Elkins for a Waiver of 68 IAC 2-3-5 (c)(10).

Mr. Elkins disclosed in his application for a Level 1 license to be a Captain of Casino Aztar that he had been convicted of Driving under the Influence four times between 1984 and 1992. Under 68 IAC 2-3-5 (c)(10), “an applicant whose duties will be to operate or navigate the riverboat must not have violated any criminal statute involving drugs or alcohol, or both, in any jurisdiction.” Based on the age and nature of the offenses and the petitioner’s disclosure of the offenses in his application, Mr. Elkins requested a waiver of 68 IAC-2-3-5 (c)(10).

Action: Upon motion by Robert Morgan, second by Tim Murphy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the request by Mr. Elkins for a waiver of 68 IAC 2-3-5(c)(10).

Disciplinary Actions:

**Settlement Agreement of
Casino Aztar
11-AZ-04
Order 2011-247**

A settlement agreement was reached regarding an incident wherein the casino failed to timely notify the Gaming Agents of a termination. Casino Aztar has agreed to a monetary settlement of \$2,000 in lieu of disciplinary actions.

Action: Upon motion by Mary Shy, second by Tim Murphy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the proposed terms of the settlement agreement.

**Settlement Agreement of
Belterra Casino
11-BT-03
Order 2011-248**

A settlement agreement was reached regarding an incident wherein Belterra Casino violated the rule requiring that the internal space of an electronic gaming device not be readily accessible when the door is closed. Belterra has agreed to a monetary settlement of \$2,500 in lieu of disciplinary actions.

Action: Upon motion by Mary Shy, second by Tim Murphy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the proposed terms of the settlement agreement.

Order 2011-249**

A settlement agreement was reached regarding two disciplinary counts against French Lick. In the first count, the casino allowed an underage person onto the casino floor. In the second count, the casino violated the rule requiring vendors to receive and wear a vendor's badge. French Lick has agreed to a monetary settlement of \$9,000 in lieu of disciplinary action.

Action: Upon motion by Mary Shy, second by Tim Murphy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the proposed terms of the settlement agreement.

**Settlement Agreement of
Indiana Gaming Company
2011-HW-05
Order 2011-250**

A settlement agreement was reached with Hollywood Casino regarding seven disciplinary counts. In the first count, the casino allowed an employee to work on the casino floor without an occupational license. In the second count, the casino allowed patrons through the drop area on several occasions. The third count violated the rule regarding notification of tournaments. In the fourth count, the casino allowed an incorrect table fill to be completely processed and did not realize the fill was incorrect until the table closed. Count five violated the sensitive key rule. In the sixth count, the casino had unsecured chips trays on several Craps tables. In count seven, the casino allowed an underage person on the casino floor. Hollywood Casino has agreed to a monetary settlement of \$72,000 in lieu of disciplinary action. Joe Hasson, General Manager at Hollywood Casino, spoke to the Commissioners about what measures Hollywood is taking to improve compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations.

Action: Upon motion by Mary Shy, second by Tim Murphy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the proposed terms of the settlement agreement.

Hoosier Park L.P.: Centaur, Inc.

Order 2011-251**

A settlement agreement was reached with Hoosier Park regarding an incident wherein the casino allowed an underage person on the casino floor on three separate occasions. Hoosier Park has agreed to a monetary settlement of \$9,000 in lieu of disciplinary actions.

Action: Upon motion by Mary Shy, second by Tim Murphy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the proposed terms of the settlement agreement.

**Settlement Agreement of
Horseshoe Hammond, LLC
11-HH-03
Order 2011-252**

A settlement agreement was reached with Horseshoe Hammond regarding an incident wherein the casino violated the rules requiring the removal and counting of all dropped bill validators. Horseshoe Hammond has agreed to a monetary settlement of \$1,500 in lieu of disciplinary action.

Action: Upon motion by Mary Shy, second by Tim Murphy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the proposed terms of the settlement agreement.

Indianapolis Downs, LLC
11-IL-03
Order 2011-253**

A settlement agreement was reached with Indiana Live! Casino that resulted from three disciplinary counts. In the first count, the casino allowed a person under the age of 21 onto the casino floor on two separate occasions. In the second count, the casino failed to timely notify the Gaming Agents of a terminated employee. In the third count, the casino allowed a patron to enter the employee entrance and walk around the back of the house. Indiana Live has agreed to pay a monetary settlement of \$14,000 in lieu of disciplinary action.

Action: Upon motion by Mary Shy, second by Tim Murphy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the proposed terms of the settlement agreement.

**Settlement Agreement of
The Majestic Star Casino
11-MS-04
Order 2011-254**

A settlement agreement was reached with Majestic Star regarding an incident wherein the casino failed to timely notify Gaming Agents of a terminated employee. Majestic Star has agreed to pay a monetary settlement of \$2,000 in lieu of disciplinary action.

Action: Upon motion by Mary Shy, second by Tim Murphy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the proposed terms of the settlement agreement.

**Settlement Agreement of
Gaming Entertainment (Indiana), LLC
11-RR-02
Order 2011-255**

A settlement agreement was reached with Rising Star regarding an incident wherein the casino violated the rule requiring surveillance and audio coverage in any area of the securing office where a person may be detained and questioned. Rising Star has agreed to a monetary settlement of \$15,000 in lieu of disciplinary action.

Action: Upon motion by Mary Shy, second by Tim Murphy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the proposed terms of the settlement agreement.

Transfer of Ownership:

Order 2011-256

An Order of the Indiana Gaming Commission Concerning: 1) the Application of Wayzata Opportunities Fund II, L.P. to Acquire an Ownership Interest in the Majestic Star Casino, LLC and the Majestic Star Casino II, Inc; and 2) the Debt Transaction Proposed by the Majestic Star Casino, LLC and the Majestic Star Casino II, Inc.

As a part of Majestic Star's bankruptcy plan, Wayzata Opportunities Fund will acquire an approximately 48% ownership interest in Reorganized Majestic Holdco, and, indirectly, Majestic Star casinos. Several representatives from Majestic Star, Wayzata, and the City of Gary were present at the meeting to offer their viewpoints of the transfer of ownership interests to Wayzata. Kay Fleming, Regulatory Counsel for Majestic Star, Doug Brown, Bose McKinney Evan's attorney representing Wayzata, Pat Halloran, Wayzata Managing Partner and Peter Rusthoven, Counsel for Majestic Star, all presented their viewpoints about the transfer of ownership and the new direction of Majestic Star to the Commissioners. Mike Hile, representing the City of Gary, also addressed the Commissioners about the City of Gary's dissatisfaction with Majestic Star's fulfillment of its LDAs and the financial support Gary has received from the casino.

Action: Upon motion by Mary Shy, second by Robert Morgan, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the application of Wayzata to acquire an ownership interest in Majestic Star, contingent upon five conditions presented in the Order by Commission staff. In addition, the Commission approved the exit financing package proposed by Majestic Star.

Renewal:

Order 2011-257

An Order of the Indiana Gaming Commission Renewing the Riverboat Owner's License of Belterra Resort Indiana, LLC.

Action: Upon motion by Robert Morgan, second by Mary Shy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission granted renewal of Belterra's riverboat owner's license for a period of one year, from October 23, 2011 through October 22, 2012. In addition, the Commission granted renewal of its approval of the written power of attorney identifying Ronald Gifford as trustee-in-waiting for Belterra.

Order 2011-258

An Order of the Indiana Gaming Commission Renewing the Riverboat Owner's License of Caesars Riverboat Casino, LLC.

Action: Upon motion by Robert Morgan, second by Mary Shy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission granted renewal of Horseshoe Southern Indiana's riverboat owner's license for a period of one year, from November 16, 2011 through November 15, 2012. In addition, the Commission granted renewal of its approval of the written power of attorney identifying Charles Atwood as trustee-in-waiting for Horseshoe Southern Indiana.

Boxing/Mixed Martial Arts: Disciplinary Action

Order 2011-259

An Order Regarding Cut Throat MMA, LLC's Promoter License Renewal Application.

Commission staff discovered that Cut Throat MMA was actively falsifying medical paperwork submitted to the Commission for purposes of obtaining its permit to conduct a May 21, 2011 event. Because of this incident, Commission staff recommended that the Commission deny the renewal for a promoter's license for Cut Throat MMA, LLC.

Action: Upon motion by Mary Shy, second by Tim Murphy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the denial of Cut Throat MMA, LLC's license application.

Order 2011-260: WITHDRAWN

Boxing/Mixed Martial Arts: Bond

Order 2011-261

An Order Regarding the Commission's Claim against Knock Out Sports Event Surety Bond.

Knock Out Sports Promotions failed to make payments necessary under IC 4-33-22 and LSA Doc #11-559 (E). Due to this failure, Commission staff sought the Commission's authority to initiate a claim against the Promoter's bond in the event that the Promoter failed to make all required payments by November 28, 2011.

Action: Upon motion by Mary Shy, second by Tim Murphy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the recovery of required payments through the exercise of the Promoter's bond in the event that the Promoter failed to make required payments by November 28, 2011.

Rules:

Resolution 2011-262

A Resolution Adopting an Emergency Rule regarding the Conduct of Charity Gaming under IC 4-32.2.

Action: Upon motion by Tim Murphy, second by Robert Morgan, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission adopted the emergency rule for the initial 90 day period as well as an optional 90 day extension period.

Resolution 2011-263

A Resolution Adopting LSA Document #11-462 as a Final Rule.

Action: Upon motion by Mary Shy, second by Robert Morgan, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission adopted the readopted final rule document which will be submitted to the *Indiana Registrar* for filing.

Resolution 2011-264

A Resolution Adopting an Emergency Rule regarding Development Agreements.

Action: Upon motion by Robert Morgan, second by Tim Murphy, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission adopted the emergency rule for the initial 90 day period as well as an optional 90 day extension period.

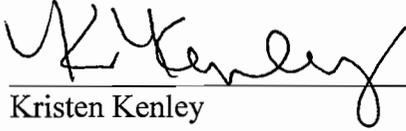
Resolution 2011-265

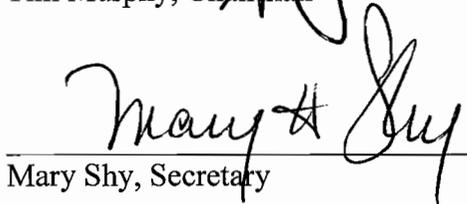

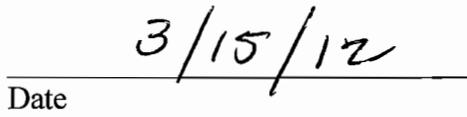
