The Indiana Gaming Commission Business Meeting was stenographically taken down by me, Tammy R. Lee, Court Reporter, held at Tropicana Evansville, 421 Northwest Riverside Drive, Evansville, Indiana, commencing at 11:00 a.m., September 29, 2017. The following transcript is a true and accurate transcript of the proceedings held.

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1 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Good morning. Thank
2 you for attending the September 29, 2017, Indiana
3 Gaming Commission meeting. First off, I'd like to
4 thank John Chaszar and his team for hosting and the
5 whole Tropicana team for hosting us today. It's some
6 exciting times here, both for Tropicana and the City
7 of Evansville and the State of Indiana. We look
8 forward to hearing more about that later in the
9 meeting.

10 Unfortunately, I guess, with all the
11 exciting stuff, we have to take care of a little bit
12 of business today, so that's what we're going to do.
13 We'll jump right into our agenda. I'll call the
14 meeting to order, and we'll have a short roll call.
15 Commissioner Fine.

16 COMMISSIONER FINE: Present.

17 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Commissioner Svetanoff.

18 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Present.

19 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Commissioner Williams.

20 COMMISSIONER WILLIAMS: Present.

21 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Commissioner Herndon.

22 COMMISSIONER HERNDON: Present.

23 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: And Commissioner Saxon.

24 COMMISSIONER SAXON: Present.

25 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: And the chairman is

1 present, as well.

2 The first order of business is the approval
3 of the minutes from our last meeting. They were
4 previously distributed to the Commission members.
5 Any comments, corrections?

6 COMMISSIONER FINE: Move for approval.

7 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Second.

8 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: There's a motion and a
9 second. All those in favor say aye.

10 (Chorus of ayes.)

11 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Opposed.

12 The meeting minutes are adopted.

13 The next topic is the report from the
14 executive director, Sara.

15 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: All right. Thank
16 you, Mr. Chair. Welcome, everyone, to the future
17 site of Tropicana's land based casino. We're just
18 absolutely thrilled to be here. I want to start off
19 with our staff updates. Dustin, you want to stand.
20 Dustin Moloy joins us as our newest staff attorney.
21 He went to Indiana University and then attended IU
22 McKinney School of Law. He worked at a small
23 Indianapolis area law firm prior to joining us, so
24 welcome, Dustin.

25 Stephanie Gardner. Stephanie has now been

1 with us for about a month. She is serving as our
2 Voluntary Exclusion Program coordinator. She came to
3 us from the State personnel division where she was
4 for about three years as an HR generalist, and prior
5 to being with the State, she attended Northern
6 Michigan University.

7 Next we have Omavi Caesar. Omavi, stand
8 up. He has recently joined us as our occupational
9 licensing coordinator. He's a graduate of Fishers
10 High School and worked for Pearson Education, Klipsch
11 Music Center, and most recently in the Amazon
12 Fulfilment Center. He was there for five years as a
13 Tier 1 associate.

14 We have also just completed our 12th
15 recruit class for our gaming agents. We will have
16 four new gaming agents employed to the Southern Zone
17 in the next week or so.

18 Our Background and Financial Investigations
19 Divisions have conducted reinvestigations of casino
20 licensee Hollywood and suppliers Everi, IGT, and
21 SuzoHapp, and those reports are in your confidential
22 materials, and Director Brown is present should you
23 have any questions.

24 So to my favorite part of my executive
25 director report, I have decided that you all don't

1 like to me hear me talk this much, so I'm going to
2 pare down my exclusion and waiver report. The full
3 details of the exclusion and waivers are going to be
4 posted on our website from here on out. And then
5 they have also been provided to the commissioners,
6 and they will be fully incorporated in the meeting
7 minutes.

8 So big picture, we have issued 11 waivers
9 since our last meeting, and we have added 17
10 individuals to the exclusion list. I'm happy to
11 answer any questions about the exclusions or waivers
12 if anybody has them.

13 And then lastly, I just wanted to thank, as
14 the chairman said, the Tropicana Evansville staff for
15 hosting this meeting. We just took a tour, and it is
16 going to be an absolutely unbelievable facility.
17 We're so appreciative of the investment that
18 Tropicana made here in Indiana, and they have been
19 just an absolute pleasure to work with for our staff
20 in doing this endeavor.

21 I'd also like to recognize the City of
22 Evansville and the mayor for being great partners and
23 looking forward to three weeks or so until the grand
24 opening. Then just on the record also I want to
25 thank Commissioner Fine and his wife, Cindy, for

1 hosting us last night with dinner at their home. It
2 is great to be down here in Evansville.

3 That concludes my report unless there are
4 any questions.

5 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Thank you, Sara. Any
6 questions for Sara?

7 Very good. Is there any old business?

8 No old business, so let's move into the new
9 business agenda. The first item is Patrons matters
10 on the voluntary exclusion program. Angie, welcome.

11 MS. BUNTON: Thank you. Good morning,
12 commissioners and executive staff. You have before
13 you 29 orders regarding the Voluntary Exclusion
14 Program. Pursuant to the rules of the program, the
15 identities of Voluntary Exclusion Program
16 participants must remain confidential. Pursuant to
17 68 IAC 6-3-2(g), a participant in the program agrees
18 that if he or she violates the terms of the program
19 and enters the gaming area of a facility under the
20 jurisdiction of the Commission, they will forfeit any
21 jackpot or thing of value won as a result of a wager.

22 Under Orders 2017-113 through 2017-140, a
23 total sum of \$30,833.83 was forfeited by John Doe's
24 43 through 70. These winnings were collected at
25 Ameristar, Belterra, Blue Chip, Hollywood, Hoosier

1 Park, Horseshoe Hammond, Horseshoe South, Indiana
2 Grand, Majestic Star, Rising Star, and Tropicana.
3 These winnings were withheld as required by
4 Commission regulations.

5 The last order, Order 2017-141, rescinds
6 Order 2017-67 due to information received following
7 the June Commission meeting.

8 Commission staff recommends that you
9 approve these orders.

10 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Thank you. Any
11 questions for Angie? Again Orders 113 through 140
12 are sort of routine standard ones, but then 141 is a
13 rescission of a previous order.

14 MS. BUNTON: Yes.

15 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Any questions?

16 Seeing none, what's the pleasure of the
17 Commission?

18 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Motion to approve.

19 COMMISSIONER WILLIAMS: Second.

20 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: There's a motion and a
21 second. Any discussion at all?

22 All those in favor say aye.

23 (Chorus of ayes.)

24 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Opposed.

25 Orders 113 through 141 are adopted.

1 MS. BUNTON: Thank you.

2 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Thank you very much.

3 Next matter is an exclusion list removal
4 request. Dustin, welcome. It's your time to shine.

5 MR. MOLOY: All right. Thank you,
6 Commissioners. I think we have two of these this
7 morning. You have before you, for Number 1, Order
8 2017-142 concerning the petition for removal from the
9 exclusion list of Quantez Martin. On May 8, 2010,
10 Mr. Martin was observed via video surveillance while
11 at the Hollywood Casino in Lawrenceburg, Indiana,
12 taking unlawful possession of another patron's TITO
13 worth approximately \$891.

14 On August 26, 2010, Executive Director
15 Ernest E. Yelton placed Mr. Martin on the statewide
16 exclusion list. On May 22, 2017, and June 28, 2017,
17 respectively, the Commission received Mr. Martin's
18 two petitions to be removed from the exclusion list.

19 On August 3, 2017, a hearing was conducted
20 regarding Mr. Martin's removal from the exclusion
21 list. At the hearing Mr. Martin took full
22 responsibility for his actions and he cooperated
23 throughout the entire process. Mr. Martin expressed
24 deep regret for his actions, and he indicated that he
25 was now aware of how to handle a similar situation in

1 the future.

2 Since the incident Mr. Martin has also
3 become increasingly involved in his church and has
4 mentored young inner city youth and has learned from
5 this experience. He expressed shame and remorse for
6 his actions and noted that his actions have
7 consequences, and he has continued to learn from his
8 mistake.

9 Mr. Martin has made no further attempt to
10 enter an Indiana casino or another casino in any
11 other jurisdiction since being placed on the
12 exclusion list.

13 Based on the totality of the factors above,
14 I concluded that Mr. Martin has met the required
15 standard of clear and convincing evidence, as
16 reflected in my findings of fact and recommendation.
17 Adopting my findings would have the effect of
18 granting Mr. Martin's petition for removal, and I
19 respectfully recommend that the Commission adopt my
20 findings at this time.

21 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Why don't we go ahead
22 and take the next one, as well.

23 MR. MOLOY: Sure. Yeah. We can go into
24 Stengel, as well. That would be Order 2017-143
25 concerning the petition for removal from the

1 exclusion list of James Stengel. On March 12, 2016,
2 Mr. Stengel was observed via video surveillance while
3 at the Blue Chip Casino in Michigan City, Indiana,
4 taking the unlawful possession of another patron's
5 TITO worth approximately \$516.

6 On April 26, 2016, Executive Director Tait
7 placed Mr. Stengel on the statewide exclusion list.
8 On May 9, 2016, the Commission received Mr. Stengel's
9 appeal of his placement on the exclusion list. In
10 lieu of administrative action, the Commission entered
11 into a settlement agreement with Mr. Stengel,
12 allowing him to petition for removal after one year,
13 and on May 9, 2017, Mr. Stengel timely submitted his
14 petition for removal from the exclusion list.

15 Staff Attorney Noah Jackson was appointed
16 to review Mr. Stengel's petition, and a hearing was
17 conducted on July 9, 2017. Mr. Stengel showed
18 remorse and took full responsibility for his actions
19 and cooperated throughout the entire removal process.
20 When he took the TITO, Mr. Stengel testified that he
21 did not realize that he was committing an illegal
22 act. Rather, he thought it was just his lucky day.

23 Since the incident Mr. Stengel has paid
24 restitution and has become fully aware that taking a
25 TITO is a criminal act, and he testified he would

1 never do it again. Mr. Stengel's wife also testified
2 on his behalf, stating that her husband has been
3 deeply troubled by the fact that he committed a
4 criminal act.

5 Mr. Stengel has not visited an Indiana
6 casino since being placed on the Indiana exclusion
7 list. He has visited the Four Winds Casino in
8 Michigan a few times per month. Outside of this
9 incident, Mr. Stengel has never been evicted from any
10 casino in or outside of Indiana.

11 Based on the totality of the factors above,
12 reviewing attorney Noah Jackson concluded that
13 Mr. Stengel met the required standard of clear and
14 convincing evidence as reflected in his findings of
15 fact and recommendation. Adopting Mr. Jackson's
16 findings would have the effect of granting
17 Mr. Stengel's petition for removal, and I
18 respectfully recommend that the Commission adopt
19 Mr. Jackson's findings at this time.

20 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Thank you very much.
21 Any questions for Dustin on these findings of facts
22 and the recommendations to remove these two patrons
23 from the exclusion list?

24 Seeing none, what is the pleasure of the
25 board or Commission on Orders 142 and 143?

1 COMMISSIONER FINE: Move for approval.

2 MR. SVETANOFF: Second.

3 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: There's a motion and a
4 second. All those in favor say aye.

5 (Chorus of ayes.)

6 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Opposed.

7 Orders are adopted. Thank you very much.

8 Moving on to supplier matters, why don't
9 you walk us through that.

10 MR. MOLOY: Okay. Commissioners, you have
11 before you Order 2017-144. Pursuant to Indiana Code
12 Section 4-33-7-8 and 68 IAC Section 2-2-8, a
13 supplier's license must be renewed annually along
14 with payment of a \$7500 renewal fee. Each of the
15 following licensees has submitted a timely request
16 for renewal along with the required payment:

17 Gaming Partners International USA, Inc.;

18 Everi Games, Inc.;

19 GLP Capital, LP;

20 And Global Surveillance Associates, Inc.

21 At this time Commission staff respectfully
22 recommends approval of Order 2017-144 to renew the
23 supplier licenses of those listed.

24 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Thank you. Any
25 questions on this order for supplier renewals?

1 Seeing none, is there a motion?

2 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Motion to approve.

3 COMMISSIONER WILLIAMS: Second.

4 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: There's a motion and a
5 second. All those in favor say aye.

6 (Chorus of ayes.)

7 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Opposed.

8 Order 144 is adopted. Thank you very much.

9 MR. MOLOY: Thank you.

10 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: An order dealing with a
11 permanent license, Garth Brown. Thank you.

12 MR. BROWN: Good morning, Commissioners and
13 executive staff. I'm not used to saying morning with
14 that. You have before you Order 2017-145 regarding
15 the permanent licensure of supplier American Gaming &
16 Electronics, Inc. On or about April 25, 2017,
17 American Gaming & Electronics, Inc., submitted a
18 supplier's license application to the Indiana Gaming
19 Commission. AG&E supplies gaming parts, used
20 machines, electronic components, and repair services
21 to casinos across the country. After review of the
22 submitted applications, Commission staff issued a
23 temporary license to AG&E on April 27, 2017. The
24 temporary license allowed AG&E to begin selling its
25 products in Indiana.

1 Commission staff conducted a background and
2 financial investigation on AG&E and its substantial
3 owners and key persons. Commission staff could find
4 no derogatory information that would affect the
5 applicant's suitability. Staff's final report
6 regarding AG&E is available for your review. You'll
7 need to grant or deny AG&E's application for a
8 permanent supplier's license. Staff recommends that
9 you grant the application.

10 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Thank you. Any
11 questions for Garth?

12 What is the pleasure of Commission on
13 Order 145?

14 COMMISSIONER FINE: Move for approval.

15 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: There's a motion.

16 COMMISSIONER SAXON: Second.

17 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: And a second. All
18 those in favor say aye.

19 (Chorus of ayes.)

20 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Opposed.

21 Order 145 is adopted.

22 MR. BROWN: Thank you.

23 CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: Disciplinary actions on
24 suppliers. Angie.

25 MS. BUNTON: All right. Good morning

1 again. You have before you six settlement agreements
2 concerning disciplinary actions against licensed
3 suppliers.

4 Order 2017-146 is a settlement agreement
5 with Aristocrat Technologies, Incorporated, and
6 includes two counts. In the first count, the
7 supplier violated the rules for shipping electronic
8 gaming device software.

9 In the second count, Aristocrat failed to
10 timely notify the Commission of a termination.
11 Aristocrat Technologies, Incorporated, has agreed to
12 a monetary settlement of \$2,500 in lieu of
13 disciplinary action.

14 Order 2017-147 is a settlement agreement
15 with Bally Gaming, Incorporated, wherein the supplier
16 violated the rules for shipping electronic gaming
17 devices. Bally Gaming, Incorporated, has agreed to a
18 monetary settlement of \$9,000 in lieu of disciplinary
19 action.

20 Order 2017-148 is a settlement agreement
21 with Everi Games, Incorporated, and includes three
22 counts. In the first count, the supplier failed to
23 timely notify the Commission of a termination.

24 In the second count, Everi allowed an
25 unlicensed company to remote in and provide tech

1 support to Indiana Grand on 21 occasions.

2 In the third count, the supplier violated
3 the rules for shipping electronic gaming device
4 software.

5 Everi Games, Incorporated, has agreed to a
6 monetary settlement of \$12,500.

7 Order 2017-149 is a settlement agreement
8 with IGT and includes two counts. In the first
9 count, IGT failed to timely notify the Commission of
10 a termination.

11 In the second count, the supplier violated
12 the rules for shipping electronic gaming devices.

13 IGT has agreed to a monetary settlement of
14 \$8,500.

15 Order 2017-150 is a settlement agreement
16 with Konami Gaming, Incorporated, wherein the
17 supplier violated the rules for shipping electronic
18 gaming devices. Konami Gaming, Incorporated, has
19 agreed to a monetary settlement of \$1,500.

20 Order 2017-151 is a settlement agreement
21 with NRT Technology Corporation wherein the supplier
22 failed to timely notify the Commission of a
23 termination. NRT has agreed to a monetary settlement
24 of \$1,000 in lieu of disciplinary action.

25 Commission staff recommends that you

1 approve Order 2017-146 through 2017-151.

2 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Thank you very much.
3 Any questions on these orders relating to the
4 settlement agreements?

5 Seeing none, is there a motion?

6 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Motion to approve.

7 COMMISSIONER HERNDON: Second.

8 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: There's a motion and a
9 second. All those in favor say aye.

10 (Chorus of ayes.)

11 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Opposed.

12 Orders 146 through 151 are adopted.

13 MS. BUNTON: Thank you.

14 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Thank you very much.
15 Occupational licensing. Dennis Mullen.

16 MR. MULLEN: Yes. Thank you, Chairman,
17 Commissioners and executive staff. You have before
18 you Orders 2017-152 through 154 which concerns
19 settlement agreements between Commission staff and
20 occupational licensees. These licensees have failed
21 to comply with 68 IAC Article 2 Rule 3 for the
22 reasons set forth in each licensee settlement. In
23 the disciplinary action, Commission staff offered
24 each licensee a settlement agreement that would have
25 them agree to an unpaid voluntary relinquishment of

1 the occupational license for a period of regularly
2 scheduled working days with no vacation or other paid
3 time off to be used. Each licensee has agreed to the
4 terms of their settlement agreement.

5 Orders 2017-152 through 154 would approve
6 the settlement agreements entered into by the
7 parties. At this time Commission staff respectfully
8 recommends that you approve these orders. Thank you.
9 I'll be happy to answer any questions.

10 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Thank you, Dennis. Any
11 questions for Dennis?

12 Hearing none, what is the pleasure of the
13 Commission on Orders 152 through 154 relating to the
14 settlement agreements?

15 COMMISSIONER FINE: Move for approval.

16 COMMISSIONER HERNDON: Second.

17 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: There is a motion and a
18 second. All those in favor say aye.

19 (Chorus of ayes.)

20 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Opposed.

21 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Mr. Chairman, I'm
22 going to abstain from this vote at this time.

23 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Okay. So we have one
24 abstention, but I believe they're all ayes for the
25 remainder of the vote. The orders are adopted.

1 Thank you very much.

2 MR. MULLEN: Thank you.

3 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Continue on.

4 MR. MULLEN: Moving along, you now have
5 before you Orders 2017-155 through 157 which deny
6 individual's applications for permanent occupational
7 licenses to work in Indiana casinos. Pursuant to
8 Indiana Code Section 4-33-8-3(4), the Commission may
9 not issue an occupational license to an individual
10 unless he or she has met the standards adopted by the
11 Commission for holding the occupational license. An
12 applicant for a Level 2 or a Level 3 occupational
13 license must include the applicant's criminal history
14 in his or her application. Any misrepresentation or
15 omission made with respect to the application is
16 grounds for denial of the application pursuant to
17 68 IAC 2-3-4(b)(2).

18 As part of the routine background
19 investigation of each applicant, Commission staff
20 discovered the applicants represented in
21 Orders 2017-155 through 157 have failed to meet the
22 established standards for licensure.

23 These three individuals were given the
24 opportunity to withdraw their applications for
25 consideration for permanent licensure and none did.

1 Detailed information regarding each individual's
2 investigation is contained in the confidential
3 materials provided to you prior to today's meeting.

4 Because the applicants have failed to meet
5 the established standards for licensure, the staff
6 recommends the applications for permanent licensure
7 be denied in Orders 2017-155 through 157. Thank you.

8 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Thank you. Any
9 questions for Dennis? These are orders which, if
10 adopted, are denying the permanent licensure for
11 these applicants.

12 Seeing or hearing no questions, what is the
13 pleasure of the Commission on Orders 155 through 157?

14 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Motion to approve.

15 COMMISSIONER WILLIAMS: Second.

16 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: There's a motion and a
17 second. All those in favor say aye.

18 (Chorus of ayes.)

19 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Opposed.

20 Orders are adopted. Thank you very much,
21 Dennis.

22 MR. MULLEN: Thank you very much.

23 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Casino matters. Come
24 on back, Angie.

25 MS. BUNTON: It's me again. All right.

1 You have before you 12 settlement agreements
2 concerning disciplinary actions.

3 Order 2017-158 is a settlement agreement
4 with Ameristar Casino and includes two counts. In
5 the first count, the casino violated the rules for
6 playing cards.

7 In the second count, the casino allowed an
8 underage person on the casino floor on two separate
9 occasions. Ameristar has agreed to a monetary
10 settlement of \$6,000 in lieu of disciplinary action.

11 Orders 2017-159 is a settlement agreement
12 with Blue Chip Casino and includes two counts. In
13 the first count, the casino violated the rules for
14 receiving and storage of software.

15 In the second count, the casino violated
16 the rules for live gaming device fills, front money,
17 and safekeeping deposits and sensitive keys.

18 Blue Chip has agreed to a monetary
19 settlement of \$12,000 in lieu of disciplinary action.

20 Order 2017-160 is a settlement agreement
21 with Belterra Casino and includes two counts. In the
22 first count, the casino allowed an underage person on
23 the casino floor on three separate occasions.

24 In the second count, the casino failed to
25 timely notify the Commission of a termination.

1 Belterra has agreed to a monetary
2 settlement of \$10,000 in lieu of disciplinary action.

3 Order 20147-161 is a settlement agreement
4 with French Lick Resort Casino and includes three
5 counts. In the first count, the casino failed to
6 timely notify the Commission of two terminations.

7 In the second count, the casino violated
8 the rules on live gaming device fills and the rules
9 for playing cards.

10 In the third count, the casino violated the
11 rules on sensitive keys, electronic gaming device
12 conversions, and manually paid jackpots.

13 French Lick has agreed to a monetary
14 settlement of \$12,000 in lieu of disciplinary action.

15 Order 2017-162 is a settlement agreement
16 with Hollywood Casino and includes three counts. In
17 the first count, the casino violated the rules on
18 acceptance of coupons at a live gaming device.

19 In the second count, the casino failed to
20 properly perform a coin test and reel strip test
21 prior to placing the electronic gaming device in
22 service. Additionally, the casino violated the rules
23 for manually paid jackpots.

24 In the third count, the casino violated the
25 rules on variances by failing to maintain appropriate

1 surveillance coverage.

2 Hollywood has agreed to a monetary
3 settlement of \$9,000 in lieu of disciplinary action.

4 Order 2017-163 is a settlement agreement
5 with Hoosier Park and includes three counts.

6 In the first count, the casino allowed an
7 underage person on the casino floor.

8 In the second count, the casino failed to
9 timely notify the Commission of two terminations.

10 In the third count, the casino violated the
11 rules of the visitor and vendor log.

12 Hoosier Park has agreed to a monetary
13 settlement of \$6,500 in lieu of disciplinary action.

14 Order 2017-164 is a settlement agreement
15 with Horseshoe Hammond and includes two counts.

16 In the first count, the casino violated the
17 rules of the Voluntary Exclusion Program.

18 In the second count, the casino failed to
19 timely notify the Commission of two terminations.

20 Horseshoe has agreed to a monetary
21 settlement of \$8,500 in lieu of disciplinary action.

22 Order 2017-165 is a settlement agreement
23 with Horseshoe South and includes two counts. In the
24 first count, the casino violated the rules on live
25 gaming device fills.

1 In the second count, the casino allowed an
2 employee to work without a gaming badge for 19 days.

3 Horseshoe South has agreed to a monetary
4 settlement of \$7,000 in lieu of disciplinary action.

5 Order 2017-166 is a settlement agreement
6 with Indiana Grand and includes two counts. In the
7 first count, the casino failed to timely notify the
8 Commission of a termination.

9 In the second count, the casino violated
10 the rules on sensitive keys.

11 Indiana Grand has agreed to a monetary
12 settlement of \$3,500.

13 Order 2017-167 is a settlement agreement
14 with Majestic Star Casino and includes three counts.
15 In the first count, the casino failed to timely
16 notify the Commission of a termination.

17 In the second count, the casino violated
18 the rules on the vendor and visitor log.

19 On the third count, the casino violated the
20 surveillance rules.

21 Majestic Star Casino has agreed to a
22 monetary settlement of \$13,500 in lieu of
23 disciplinary action.

24 Order 2017-168 is a settlement agreement
25 with Rising Star Casino and includes three counts.

1 In the first count, the casino violated the rules on
2 currency collection and the soft count process.

3 In the second count, the casino violated
4 the rules on the redemption of non-value roulette
5 chips.

6 In the third count, the casino violated the
7 surveillance rules.

8 Rising Star has agreed to a monetary
9 settlement of \$15,500 in lieu of disciplinary action.

10 Order 2017-169 is a settlement agreement
11 with Tropicana Evansville and includes two counts.
12 In the first count, the casino violated the rules on
13 live gaming device fills.

14 In the second count, the casino violated
15 the rules on found cash equivalents and the
16 collection and counting of tokens.

17 Tropicana has agreed to a monetary
18 settlement of \$10,500 in lieu of disciplinary action.

19 Commission staff recommends that you
20 approve Order 2017-158 through Order 2017-169.

21 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Thank you. Any
22 questions for Angie on these proposed settlement
23 agreements?

24 Hearing none, what is the pleasure of the
25 Commission?

1 COMMISSIONER FINE: Move for approval.

2 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Second.

3 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: There's a motion and a
4 second for Orders 158 through 169. All those in
5 favor say aye.

6 (Chorus of ayes.)

7 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Opposed.

8 Orders are adopted.

9 MS. BUNTON: Thank you.

10 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Casino renewals.

11 Dustin.

12 MR. MOLOY: Thank you. You have before you
13 Order 2017-170 and Order 2017-171 regarding the
14 annual renewal of casino owner's licenses for Blue
15 Chip Casino, LLC, and Gaming Entertainment Indiana,
16 LLC, operating as Blue Chip and Rising Star
17 respectively.

18 Both entities have filed the proper
19 paperwork and have paid the required annual renewal
20 fee. The Blue Chip license was set to expire on
21 August 17, 2017, and the Rising Star license was set
22 to expire on September 15, 2017.

23 Executive Director Tait issued interim
24 renewals to the licensees to cover the period between
25 the expiration date and the date of this business

1 meeting.

2 Additionally, by Orders 2015-148 and
3 2015-149, the Commission approved the powers of
4 attorney for Blue Chip and Rising Star respectively.
5 Their approvals expire upon the renewal of the casino
6 owner's license. For that reason, all casinos must
7 request renewal of the Commission's approval of the
8 written power of attorney concurrently with the
9 request for renewal or present the Commission with a
10 new written power of attorney maintaining a new
11 trustee-in-waiting.

12 Both licensees have stated their intent to
13 maintain the existing trustee-in-waiting and have not
14 presented the Commission with any modifications of
15 the power of attorney.

16 At this time Commission staff respectfully
17 request approval of Orders 2017-170 and 2017-171
18 renewing the casino owner's license for a period of
19 one year.

20 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Thank you very much.
21 Any questions for Dustin?

22 Hearing none, is there a motion on these
23 two orders, 170 and 171 for casino renewals?

24 COMMISSIONER FINE: Move for approval.

25 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Second.

1 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: There's a motion and a
2 second. All those in favor say aye.

3 (Chorus of ayes.)

4 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Opposed.

5 Orders are adopted. Thank you.

6 MR. MOLOY: Thank you.

7 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: The next matter is a
8 transfer of ownership interest. I'll ask Greg to
9 walk us through this one.

10 MR. SMALL: Thank you, Mr. Chair.

11 Commissioners, before you is Order Number 2017-172.
12 This is a transfer ownership and casino owner's
13 licensee and waiver of certain provisions. In this
14 case, the Indiana casino owner licensee is Aztar
15 Indiana Gaming Company, LLC, right here in
16 Evansville, Indiana. Its parent company is Tropicana
17 Entertainment, Inc.

18 On June 23, 2017, Tropicana and Icahn
19 Enterprises, LP, announced the commencement of a cash
20 tender offer for outstanding shares of Tropicana's
21 common stock. These shares are currently held by
22 wholly owned Icahn Enterprise, LP, subsidiary Icahn
23 Enterprises Holdings, LP.

24 Icahn Enterprise, LP, is seeking to
25 transfer shares of Tropicana stock from Icahn

1 Holdings to American Entertainment Properties Corp.
2 American Entertainment Properties Corp. is a wholly
3 owned subsidiary of Icahn Building, LLC, which in
4 turn is a wholly owned subsidiary of Icahn Holdings.

5 Pursuant to 68 IAC 5-1-1, any direct or
6 indirect ownership interest of 5 percent or more in a
7 casino licensee that is a publically traded
8 corporation may only be transferred in accordance
9 with this rule. Under the rule, there are a few
10 requirements for the transfer to be effectuated,
11 including a transfer of ownership form, submission of
12 an application fee, and a finding of suitability.

13 The proposed Tropicana stock transfer is
14 considered a transfer of ownership in a publically
15 traded company under 68 IAC 5-1. However, Tropicana
16 requested a waiver under 68 IAC 1-2-13 from the
17 application requirements in 68 IAC 5-1-2.

18 In support of the waiver request, it was
19 submitted that both Icahn Building and American
20 Entertainment Properties Corp. are wholly owned
21 subsidiaries of Icahn Enterprises, LP, which has
22 already been found to be suitable by the Commission
23 to hold a 5 percent or greater interest in a casino
24 owner licensee.

25 In addition, the key personnel of Icahn

1 Enterprise, LP, who are also key personnel in the
2 wholly owned subsidiaries already hold Level 1
3 licensees in connection with their position from the
4 IGC. Lastly, this transaction does not require
5 Commission approval for any financing.

6 The transfer of ownership contemplated was
7 reviewed by Commission Financial Investigator Bill
8 Murphy. The staff recommends approval with the
9 waiver of submissions. In this order, the Commission
10 is asked to make two decisions. (1) To approve the
11 transfer of ownership interest in Tropicana from
12 Icahn Enterprises Holdings, LP, to American
13 Entertainment Properties Corp. and (2) also to waive
14 certain transfer application requirements of
15 68 IAC 5-1-2.

16 Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

17 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Thank you, Greg. Any
18 questions for Greg?

19 We have dealt with this previously in other
20 matters. I think mostly with suppliers primarily,
21 but part of this is the previous findings of
22 suitability with the related parties. Is that a fair
23 statement?

24 MR. SMALL: That's correct. Here we're
25 dealing with the transfer of stock between wholly

1 owned subsidiaries of an entity that has already been
2 found to be a suitable entity; and as I said, the key
3 personnel are currently licensed at the Level 1 level
4 by the Commission.

5 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Very good. What is the
6 pleasure of the Commission on Order 172?

7 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Motion to approve.

8 COMMISSIONER WILLIAMS: Second.

9 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: There's a motion and a
10 second. Any comments, discussion?

11 All those in favor say aye.

12 (Chorus of ayes.)

13 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Opposed.

14 Order 172 is approved.

15 Athletic Division. Dennis.

16 MR. MULLEN: Thank you again,
17 Commissioners. Two Athletic Division matters for
18 consideration this morning/afternoon. The first is
19 Order 2017-173 concerning a settlement agreement
20 between Commission staff and professional Mixed
21 Martial Artist licensee Mohammad Abdullah.

22 On August 12, 2017, Mr. Abdullah
23 participated in a Mixed Martial Arts bout in Kokomo,
24 Indiana. Mr. Abdullah was found to be in violation
25 of 68 IAC 24-3-37. In lieu of a disciplinary action,

1 Commission staff offered to settle the matter with
2 Mr. Abdullah for a fine of \$250. Commission staff
3 and Mr. Abdullah agreed to the terms of the
4 settlement, and the agreement was executed on
5 September 6, 2017. Order 173 would approve that
6 settlement entered into by the parties.

7 Would you like to vote on this or --

8 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: I think we'll go ahead
9 and take these individually.

10 MR. MULLEN: Okay.

11 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: So what is the -- are
12 there any questions for Dennis on this proposed
13 settlement?

14 Hearing none, is there a motion on
15 Order 173?

16 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Motion to approve.

17 COMMISSIONER FINE: Second.

18 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: There's a motion and a
19 second. All those in favor say aye.

20 (Chorus of ayes.)

21 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Opposed.

22 Order 173 is adopted.

23 Order 174.

24 MR. MULLEN: Thank you very much.

25 Order 174 is regarding DM Fight Promotions surety

1 bond. DM Fight Promotions was issued a promotor's
2 license under which it held a professional boxing
3 event on April 8, 2017, at the Hammond Armory in
4 Indiana. As required by the Indiana Code, DM Fight
5 Promotions obtained a surety bond in the amount of
6 \$10,000 guaranteeing payment of all financial and tax
7 obligations under Indiana Code 4-33-22-32.

8 To this date, no payments have been
9 received, and the Commission staff has been unable to
10 make contact with the promotor since that event was
11 held. DM Fight Promotions continues to owe unpaid
12 reimbursement fees and ticket tax for that event
13 totaling \$837.50. Pursuant to Resolution 2010-127,
14 the Commission must approve the recovery of any
15 outstanding amount through exercise of a surety bond.
16 At this time Commission staff respectfully request
17 approval of Order 174 to allow recovery of the unpaid
18 fees and ticket tax. Thank you.

19 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Thank you. Any
20 questions?

21 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: One question for
22 you here. With this fight promotor, will this be
23 noted in their file or in their record to make sure
24 that if they come to do business in Indiana again
25 that they may not be approved to do business?

1 MR. MULLEN: Absolutely. I would assume
2 that our Athletics Division would take that into
3 consideration if that were to come about.

4 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Great.

5 MR. MULLEN: If they were to request
6 another license or renewal.

7 COMMISSIONER FINE: Don't pay a penalty?

8 MR. MULLEN: No.

9 MR. SMALL: That's the requirement of a
10 bond.

11 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: So Order 174 is seeking
12 our approval to exercise through the surety bond.
13 Any other questions?

14 What's the pleasure of the Commission on
15 Order 174?

16 COMMISSIONER FINE: Move for approval.

17 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Second.

18 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: There's a motion and a
19 second. All those in favor say aye.

20 (Chorus of ayes.)

21 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Opposed.

22 Order 174 is approved.

23 MR. MULLEN: Thank you.

24 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Garth is going to walk
25 us through -- is this the third applicant for paid --

1 MR. BROWN: Fourth.

2 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Fourth. Okay. Fourth.

3 MR. BROWN: We've got a couple more on the
4 way. Good morning again. You have before you
5 Order 2017-175 granting a permanent paid fantasy
6 sports game operator's license to SportsHub
7 Technologies, LLC.

8 On June 27, 2017, SportsHub Technologies,
9 LLC, submitted a paid fantasy sports game operator
10 license application and the required fees.

11 Commission staff has conducted a background
12 and financial investigation of SportsHub and their
13 operations. Commission staff could find no
14 derogatory information that would affect the
15 applicant's suitability to hold a PFS license. The
16 staff's final report regarding SportsHub
17 Technologies, LLC, has been made available for your
18 review. You will need to grant or deny this
19 application for a permanent PFS license. The staff
20 recommends that you grant the application.

21 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Any questions for
22 Garth?

23 Hearing none, is there a motion on
24 Order 175 approving this Paid Fantasy Sports
25 licensee?

1 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Motion to approve.

2 COMMISSIONER HERNDON: Second.

3 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: There's a motion and a
4 second. All those in favor say aye.

5 (Chorus of ayes.)

6 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Opposed.

7 Order 175 is approved.

8 MR. BROWN: Thank you.

9 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: My favorite: Rules.
10 Dennis.

11 MR. MULLEN: Thank you. So
12 Resolution 2017-176 concerns readopting
13 administrative regulations that are set to expire.
14 As some background, administrative rules adopted
15 under Indiana Code 4-22 Chapter 2 expire on January 1
16 of the seventh year after the year in which the rules
17 take effect. The sections addressed in this
18 resolution are due to expire on January 1,
19 2017 [sic], unless they are readopted. The statute
20 provides an abbreviated readoption process for rules
21 that are not to be edited.

22 The Indiana Register published the notice
23 of intent to readopt these rules on September 14,
24 2016 -- or '17 -- excuse me. The 30-day statutory
25 period for filing an objection to the abbreviated

1 process or request separation of any of the rules
2 passed without any person filing objection or
3 requesting to separate.

4 The abbreviated readoption process also
5 requires the Commission to consider the effect of the
6 readopted rules on small businesses. Thus, a small
7 impact statement has been included in your documents
8 for this meeting for consideration.

9 This resolution, if passed, will adopt the
10 section identified in the notice of intent without
11 any changes or edits. Commission staff ask that you
12 readopt the approved sections.

13 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: And then this rolls for
14 another seven years then?

15 MR. MULLEN: That is correct.

16 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Okay. Any questions
17 for Dennis?

18 Is there a motion regarding this
19 resolution, 176?

20 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Motion to adopt
21 the resolution.

22 COMMISSIONER WILLIAMS: Second.

23 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: There's a motion and a
24 second. All those in favor say aye.

25 (Chorus of ayes.)

1 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Opposed.

2 The resolution is adopted.

3 MR. MULLEN: Thank you.

4 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Thank you very much.

5 Now we're going to turn to the Tropicana
6 team, John and whoever else might be coming up with
7 you. Again, as Sara mentioned, this has been really
8 a great visit for us. We did walk through the
9 facility, and, boy, it's exciting to see that and
10 what the potential is and the opportunities not only
11 for Tropicana and the City of Evansville and then
12 also I'll reiterate the reinvestment, if you will, in
13 the State of Indiana.

14 It seems somewhat fitting that being the
15 first operator when we did this back in the 1990s,
16 now Tropicana is the first operator transitioning to
17 a land based casino, so we're really excited. We
18 know that you are and that there's a lot to do yet in
19 the next three weeks. We'd like to hear from you and
20 give us a little more detail.

21 MR. CHASZAR: Sure. We are tremendously
22 excited. Thank you again for joining us here in
23 Evansville. A lot of hours, a lot of hard work has
24 gone into planning and implementing in this facility
25 and it's come to fruition here in less than three

1 weeks. As you saw, we have our work cut out for us
2 in the next three weeks, but we're confident that it
3 will be fine.

4 I'd also like to thank Executive Director
5 Tait and her staff. They have been tremendous
6 throughout the process, not only from a compliance
7 standpoint but also for adding valuable suggestions
8 throughout the process to make our lives easier down
9 the road with the planning.

10 I'd also like to thank Supervisor Wickware
11 and Assistant Supervisor Freeze. They have their
12 work cut out for them in the next couple weeks with
13 moving all the machines off the boat.

14 With that I'd like to introduce Stacey
15 McNeill. She is our executive director of marketing.
16 She's going to take you through a very short
17 presentation.

18 MS. MCNEILL: Good morning. Some of this
19 will be redundant for some of you since our tour this
20 morning, but, again, it should be short and sweet.
21 So talking about the facility, it's a \$50 million
22 entertainment complex investment for the City of
23 Evansville and the State of Indiana. It includes a
24 casino, two restaurants, and an entertainment lounge
25 that we'll hear more about in just a minute.

1 The casino, itself, is 45,000 square feet
2 of gaming space. The entire complex is 75,000 square
3 feet. We plan to open with the 1176 slot machines,
4 so just over the 1175 noted. We have 41 table games
5 in poker and a fantastic high limit room that some of
6 you got to peek into today, even though it still has
7 some development left.

8 The Tap House is going to be the anchor
9 restaurant in the facility. It will be open for
10 lunch and dinner. As John mentioned to you earlier,
11 we'll have 36 variations of beer on tap plus about 50
12 other beers available for the connoisseurs, plus a
13 variety of wines and liquors.

14 The food menu will be featuring popular
15 dishes that a lot of people see in a lot of places,
16 but we'll have some very interesting new items that
17 our culinary team has worked hard on here, so we're
18 excited to announce those in the coming days.

19 The Deli. Most of you saw that. It's
20 probably 90 percent complete today. It will feature
21 Boar's Head meats and cheeses, all of the things you
22 would expect from a deli and more. We think this
23 will be a very popular outlet. It's just off the
24 casino floor but inside the new complex.

25 The Lounge and Nightclub. We've spent a

1 lot of time programing this space to make sure that
2 we have something for everyone. We know we can't
3 please everybody all the time, but we're going to try
4 in this venue. So during the day we'll feature a
5 variety of sports and music videos. Every night
6 there will be live entertainment, and then on Friday
7 and Saturday evenings, we'll convert to a nightclub
8 for a younger demographic and hopefully draw a new
9 attendance to our facility.

10 All right. Where we are now. If you can
11 remember when we met with you in Indianapolis not too
12 long ago, we talked about what you could expect when
13 you came for your visit a few weeks ago, and this is
14 where we are now. This is just a quick time lapse
15 video of us from where we started until today.

16 (Video is shown.)

17 MR. CHASZAR: Take note of how much snow we
18 got. Almost none.

19 MS. McNEILL: We were lucky. That's what
20 you'll see today if you're on the street. As John
21 mentioned, the favorable weather and other things has
22 helped us really get ahead of schedule. You know, we
23 planned to open in December, similar to what we did
24 22 years ago, and now we're announcing our opening
25 for later this month, so we're pretty excited about

1 that.

2 On the casino floor now, we're under
3 24-hour security. Our surveillance is up and running
4 with 300 plus cameras. As you saw today on the tour,
5 all of our new slot bases and the new gaming product
6 is being installed. All of our new table game
7 equipment is in. The cage and count rooms are
8 90 percent complete and really only missing a piece
9 of glass in the window before it comes secure.

10 These are just some quick photos of what
11 things look like today and what they'll look like
12 when they're complete.

13 This is the entrance where we took you in
14 originally during the tour looking across the
15 facility. Obviously, with the wager and tax change
16 that occurred in the 2016 legislative session, those
17 turnstile won't be there, but otherwise it's a pretty
18 accurate rendering of the floor with no gaming
19 product.

20 This is The Deli and how it will look in
21 its completed stage. The Entertainment Lounge
22 looking from the casino floor back across into it,
23 which in this photo is dark but absolutely gorgeous.

24 This is our Tap House, and even since
25 yesterday when we took these photos, it's transformed

1 almost 50 percent further than that. That's how fast
2 things are moving. This is just a look back across
3 the casino floor into the high limit area, cashier
4 cage, and Players Club areas.

5 And now, most importantly, what's going to
6 happen over the next 21 days. As John alluded to, we
7 have a lot of work to do in a very short amount of
8 time. On October the 1st, this weekend, we will
9 close Level 1 of the riverboat and relocate those
10 200 machines to the new facility. On October the
11 16th, the casino, itself, the riverboat casino, will
12 completely close at 6 a.m., and we will continue to
13 relocate the remaining slot product from that
14 location to the new casino.

15 On the 18th, which you know is not very
16 many days away, we'll do our first introductory event
17 at the casino. It will be for our Day 1 employees,
18 and we are proud to say that we have approximately
19 50 people that are still with us from Day 1 here in
20 Evansville. We're pretty proud of that statistic.
21 We'll allow them to come in and see the space and
22 enjoy some food and beverage in our Tap House
23 restaurant.

24 We will follow that with an all team member
25 event. We would like to thank you for allowing us to

1 have our gaming and nongaming employees on the floor
2 just to get to see and experience the product to help
3 sell to our customers. During the day, there will be
4 a quick 1 to 3 tour. It's a self-guided tour. It
5 will allow them to understand and get to know all of
6 our outlets in more detail.

7 That evening we will have our VIP opening
8 event, so a selected group of invited people.
9 Players, elected officials, both locally and at the
10 state level, you, and a number of other people will
11 be invited that evening, so it will be a controlled
12 opening essentially. And we'll be able to try some
13 of the things on the floor there, as well.

14 We will follow that event with our official
15 grand opening and ribbon cutting at 10 a.m. on
16 October the 20th. And then ultimately, the bottom
17 point -- a lot of people aren't aware yet, but on
18 October the 30th, we are likely closing on the sale
19 of the riverboat, and it will actually depart the
20 same day.

21 There are a lot of things to do in a short
22 amount of time. All right. Questions?

23 MR. CHASZAR: The original scheduled
24 opening date was December 15, and the commitment of
25 our ownership group and the engineering firm that we

1 hired out of Louisville to oversee this project
2 brought us several opportunities to accelerate the
3 process.

4 The commitment of our ownership group, they
5 have been tremendous support with this \$47.5 million
6 commitment from their standpoint and the overall \$50
7 million commitment of the project. It's been a
8 wonderful experience, and we're ahead of schedule.
9 We're on budget. Every time we came in under budget,
10 my boss said, "Make it nicer. Add something to it."
11 It's been a great ride.

12 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Very good. Before we
13 went on the tour this morning, our staff was
14 talking -- the IGC staff, and they were very
15 commendable of the due diligence, staying on your
16 timeline. Obviously, there's been some great luck
17 with the weather and all of that, but they were very
18 complimentary of not only the cooperation with them
19 but also just the way your team has stayed just
20 weekly on your timeline and making adjustments as
21 needed and continuing to push forward. We know
22 there's a heavy lift in the last three weeks, so keep
23 going and looking forward to the opening.

24 Do any other members of the Commission have
25 comments?

1 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Yes. I'd like to
2 make a comment. Congratulations to Tropicana on a
3 significant investment within Evansville. You are
4 the first ones to accomplish this feat as to open a
5 land based casino, or going to open a land based
6 casino, and I applaud you.

7 I also encourage and challenge my casinos
8 up north in northwest Indiana to follow the
9 Tropicana's lead, and hopefully we can get on board
10 with the land based casinos, as well. Back in 2015
11 the legislature took on the enormous task to get this
12 legislation passed. You have followed a great path,
13 and hopefully we can follow your lead, so thank you.

14 MR. CHASZAR: Thank you.

15 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Congratulations.

16 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Very good. Well, thank
17 you and good luck.

18 MR. CHASZAR: Thank you very much.

19 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: And we appreciate
20 everything you've done. The next meeting is
21 scheduled for Thursday, November 16. The time and
22 exact location is pending, but we're kind of liking
23 this road trip stuff. I'm not sure we're going to do
24 it again at the very next meeting, but November 16.

25 Is there any other business to come before

1 the Commission?

2 Seeing none, is there a motion to adjourn?

3 COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Motion to adjourn.

4 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Motion and a second?

5 COMMISSIONER HERNDON: Second.

6 CHAIRMAN JOHNSTON: Very good. All those

7 in favor say aye.

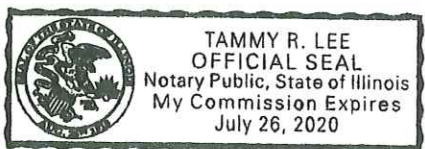
