The Charity Gaming Division regulates and enforces nonprofit gaming statutes and rules in the State of Indiana.

Only qualified organizations may conduct charitable gaming activities in Indiana. Today there are just over 3,700 qualified organizations conducting charitable gaming activities.

We serve many organizations in our Hoosier communities including fraternal, veteran, civic, religious and school booster and athletic organizations.

- **Monitors and evaluates all submission from the 20 licensed Manufactures and 29 licensed Distributors in Indiana (ATC)**
- **Supports leadership**
- **Supports the Investigative Team**

Program Coordinators (7)

- **Average of 10 years experience in Charity Gaming issues**
- **They have worked to reduce backlogs to virtually zero (1st time in memory)**
- **Routinely complimented on their kindness and thorough assistance.**

Investigators (5)

- **Average of 46 years of law enforcement and/or investigative experience.**
- **Years of prior experience with the Indiana Gaming Commission in other divisions.**
- **Individual areas of responsibility range from 6,200 square miles to over 7,400 square miles.**
- **Could have from 631 to 1,182 organizations in their individual area of responsibility.**
- **Very reactive but strive to be proactive.**
- **374 Investigations conducted 2023**
- **23 disciplinary actions were filed with 22 being settled resulting in \$134,750 in fines and 5 individuals being suspended.**

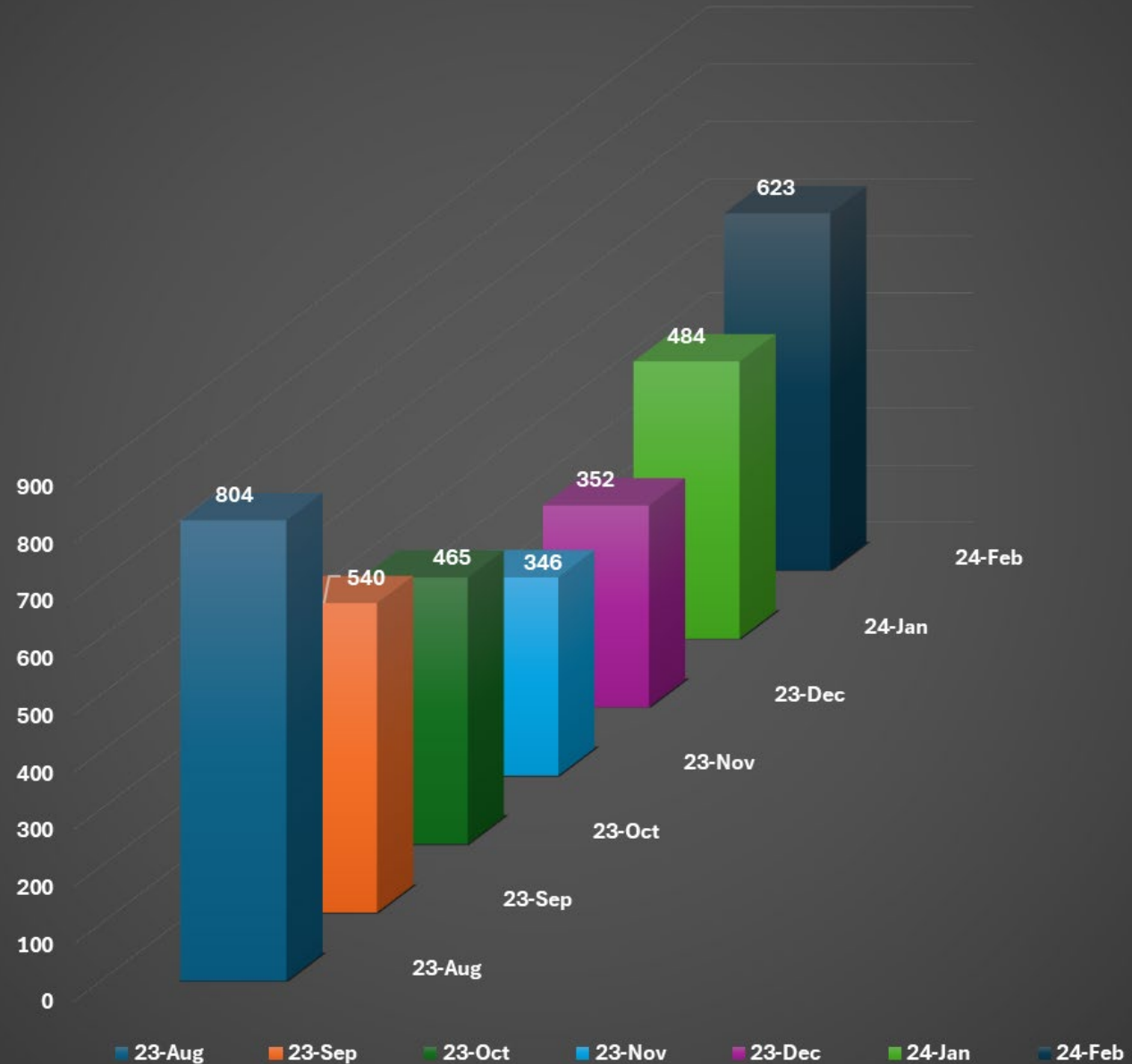

In 2023, approximately 4,709 applications, exempt notifications and financial reports were processed by our program coordinators.

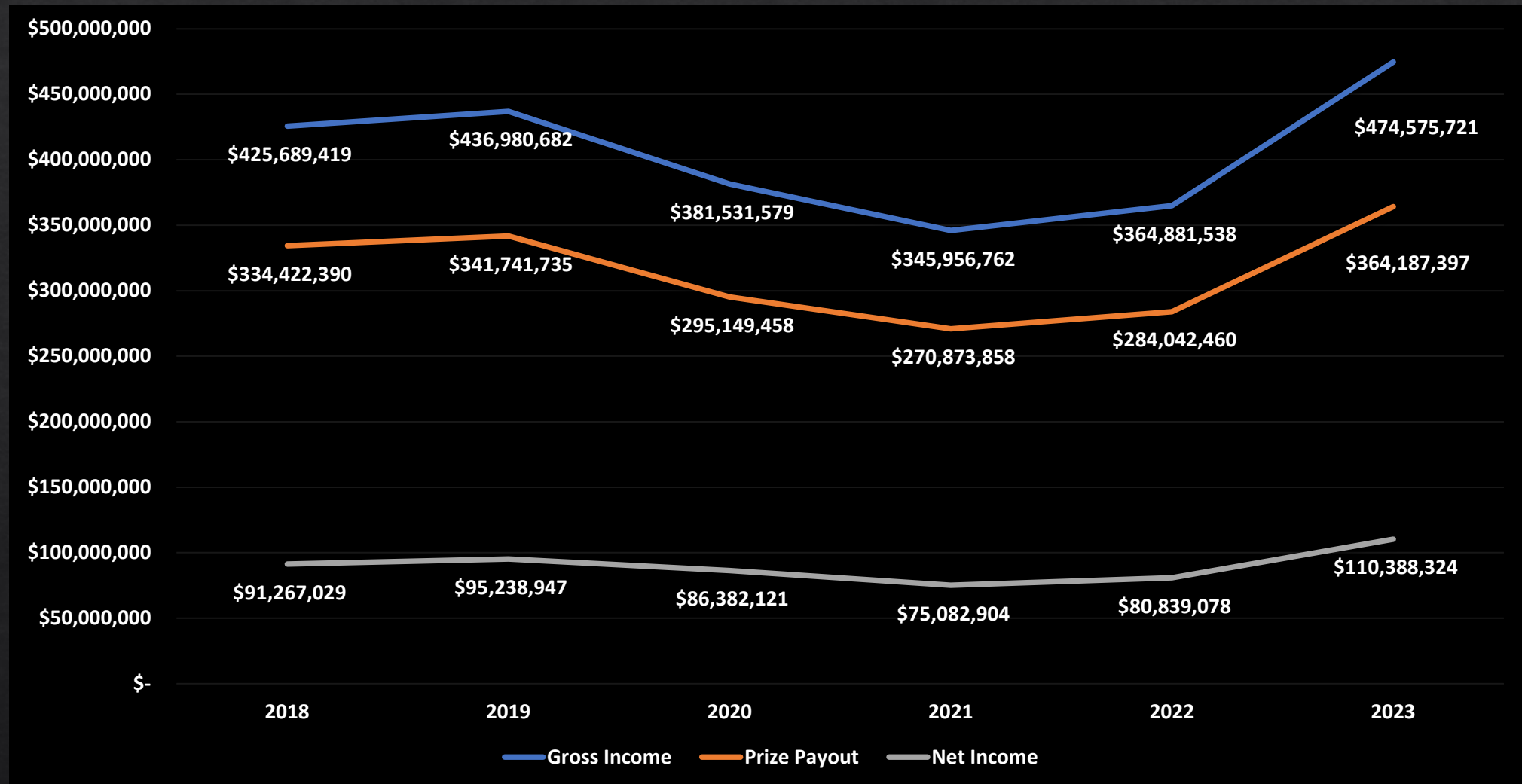
With better tracking and processing in place we look for this number to increase in 2024.
