

2025 Legislative Session Update

On April 16, 2025, Senate Enrolled Act 209 was signed into law by Governor Mike Braun. This legislation allows certain veterans and fraternal qualified organizations to obtain a charity gaming license allowing them to conduct electronic pull tab games. On April 30, 2025, Senate Enrolled Act 108 was signed into law by Governor Mike Braun. This legislation changes requirements for the expenditures of net proceeds from charity gaming and changes requirements for the conduct of charity gaming for certain organizations. These Acts will go into effect on July 1, 2025. The Indiana Gaming Commission will begin the administrative rulemaking process to promulgate rules relating to these Acts shortly. These administrative rules will include, among other things, an approval process for electronic pull tab devices and systems. Organizations may execute letters of intent with manufacturers or distributors, with the sale or lease of electronic pull tab devices and systems contingent upon approval by the IGC pursuant to the administrative rulemaking.

The IGC is committed to making this process transparent and to creating a strong regulatory environment that ensures the integrity of charitable gaming in Indiana.
