## Appendix A: County Fact Sheets for AAL Report

## Background


#### Abstract

This document summarizes information on demographics and healthcare facilities in each of the 92 counties in Indiana. This document is broken down into a few sub-sections. The first section provides fact sheets for the 64 counties in Indiana with less than 50,000 residents overall as of the 2020 census (https://www.stats.indiana.edu/population/PopTotals/historic_counts_counties.asp). The next section provides fact sheets for the counties with > 50,000 residents which do not have an affordable assisted living facility (AAL). Note that these are the only 4 counties with a population $>50,000$ residents and no affordable assisted living facility. Then, we summarize information for counties with 50,000-100,000 residents which have at least one AAL. These counties may provide information on what makes an AAL feasible in a county with a relatively small population. The final section summarizes counties with > 100,000 residents. Each of these counties have at least one AAL. Within each section the county fact sheets are sorted alphabetically.


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## Data Sources

The data sources used in this report are summarized in the paragraphs below.
The total population count for the county is the 2020 count from Stats Indiana (https://www.stats.indiana.edu/population/PopTotals/historic_counts_counties.asp). The source for average life expectancy is the US Small-area Life Expectancy Estimates Project (USALEEP, https://www.cdc.gov/nchs/nvss/usaleep/usaleep.html). The data is from 2010 - 2015. Information on the largest city within each county is from the US Census (https://www2.census.gov/programs-surveys/popest/datasets/2020-2021/cities/totals/, downloaded data for state 18 (Indiana) and used the population estimate for 2020).

The American Community Survey from the US Census (2017-2021, https://www.census.gov/programs-surveys/acs) provided a lot of information summarized in this report, including the population count $\geq$ age 65 , the count of people $\geq$ age 65 with a disability, the count of people $\geq$ age 65 living in group quarters, count of people $\geq$ age 65 below the poverty level, the count of people $\geq$ age 65 with different health insurance types, and the age distribution of seniors within each county.

In this report, affordable assisted living facilities are defined as assisted living facilities which received low income housing tax credits. Please note that there are no affordable assisted living facilities in counties with < 50,000 people. Information on these facilities is from the existing properties report (can be found here:
https://www.in.gov/ihcda/developers/rental-housing-tax-creditsrhtc/\#Recent_Awards_and_Existing_Properties). Information on the count of Medicaid
waiver eligible assisted living facilities is from a data request from the Indiana Family and Social Services Administration. Please note that facilities at the same address were counted as a single facility. Information on the number of licensed assisted living facilities is from the Indiana Department of Health website
(https://isdh.maps.arcgis.com/apps/webappviewer/index.html?id=ce9b358f567b49198b cf202133c49da7). Note that not all assisted living facilities need to be licensed - for instance, a facility which does not provide medication administration or other medical care to residents does not need to be licensed (Source:
https://aspe.hhs.gov/sites/default/files/private/pdf/110466/15alcom-IN.pdf Please see first page). Therefore, the count of licensed assisted living facilities in these fact sheets likely underrepresents the total number of assisted living facilities within the county. The number of residential care beds for each type of facility is from the consumer reports available for each facility from the Indiana Department of Health website mentioned previously. Work is currently ongoing to take a survey of both licensed and non-licensed assisted living facilities in Indiana. Updated data is expected to be available in Spring 2024.

Regarding healthcare employee and facility data, information on the full time equivalent count for primary are physicians and the ratio of county residents to the primary care physician full time equivalent is 2021 data from the Indiana Physician Workforce Dashboard organized by the Bowen Center for Health Workforce Research through the Indiana School of Medicine (https://bowenportal.org/indiana-physician-workforce/). This information is updated every other year when physicians renew their Indiana State Medical License. These counts exclude medical residents and include the following specialties: Family Medicine/General Practice, Internal Medicine (General), and Pediatrics (General). Additionally, information on the count of total healthcare workers is 2022 data from the National Plan and Provider Enumeration System (NPPES). Additional information on this source can be found here: https://www.cms.gov/Regulations-and-Guidance/Administrative-Simplification/NationalProvIdentStand/DataDissemination. The count of different categories of healthcare workers (health diagnosis and treating practitioners, health technologists and technicians, and healthcare support staff) is from the American Community Survey from the US Census (mentioned above). The Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) score is from the US Health Resources and Services Administration (https://bhw.hrsa.gov/workforce-shortage-areas/shortage-designation). This score is calculated within each census tract and the scores for census tracts with a county are added up to obtain the county level score. If a county contains no HPSAs, then the score will be 0 . If a county contains one or more census tracts which are HPSAs, then each census tract designated as an HPSA is given a score of 0-25 (for primary care and mental health) or 0-26 (for dental health) with higher values indicating greater need. Healthcare facility count data was also obtained from the Indiana Department of Health (https://isdh.maps.arcgis.com/apps/webappviewer/index.html?id=ce9b358f567b49198b cf202133c49da7). This report does not summarize the size or capacity of each facility.
