

Atterbury History

Camp Atterbury was activated as a base for the U.S. Army on June 2, 1942. Four miles west of Edinburgh, Indiana, the camp comprised just over 40,351 acres from land purchased from Bartholomew, Johnson, and Brown counties.



It was named in honor of **General William W. Atterbury**, the Director of Transportation of the American Expeditionary Forces (AEF) during World War I, and president of the Pennsylvania Railroad.

Over 275,000 soldiers trained at Camp Atterbury during World War II. The base hosted a stationed company from the Women's Army Corps (WAC) and around 38,000 women trained at Camp Atterbury during the war. During the Second World War, Camp Atterbury had 1,780 buildings providing housing to 44,159 officers and troops, including 1 hospital and covalesent center that alone had 68 buildings on 80 acres.

Rock of Camp Atterbury

The Camp also served as an internment camp, housing between 12,000 and 15,000 Italian and German prisoners of war. They were housed in a large compound located on the extreme western edge of camp. Prisoners, of Roman Catholic faith, constructed their own chapel, and one of them, Libero Puccini, carved the famous rock.



After the World War

Following the end of World War II, Camp Atterbury was inactivated for the first time on July 31, 1946. During the subsequent decades, the base was reactivated and inactivated as the United States' martial conflicts waxed and waned. The Indiana Military Academy moved from Fort Benjamin Harrison to Camp Atterbury in July 1965.

The base became an Army
National Guard Training Site on
September 1, 1976 and until the
1990s, the camp provided support
to the Indiana National Guard
through different conflicts.

Today Camp Atterbury primarily provides military training and serves as a mobilization site for the U.S. military.

MUSCATATUCK HISTORY

Opened in 1920 as a Farm Colony for Feeble-Minded. In 1937 it was chartered for mentally handicapped children. Over the next 85 years, the role expanded to include all developmentally-disabled.



Situated on 1,000 acres, the center became Jennings County's largest employer with at its highest patient count of 8,115 total patients.

In 2005, the facility was closed and turned over to the Indiana Army National Guard (INARNG) as a premier urban training center for military and civilian first responder personnel.

Today it offers users a globally unique, urban and rural, multi-domain operating environment operated by INARNG





OUR MISSION



Atterbury-Muscatatuck Training Center serves as a major training site for individual, collective, and joint operations providing realistic venues for live, virtual and constructive training, and testing events in order to increase training readiness, attract commercial defense industry participation and build strategic partnerships. It includes the Indiana Air Range Complex and Muscatatuck Training Center. On order, Atterbury-Muscatatuck activates as a Mobilization Force Generation Installation in support of FORSCOM and Combatant Commander requirements

CAPABILITIES & TRAINING



Camp Atterbury offers comprehensive logistical and training support for up to two brigade-sized elements concurrently across more than 34,000 acres. This federally owned facility, operated by the Indiana National Guard, provides a wide array of training ranges, live-fire venues, and airfield capabilities that accommodate aircraft up to C-130. Additionally, the facility features managed airspace with air-to-ground firing capabilities and an LVC simulation and exercise center.

Equipped with secure facilities, advanced simulations, and versatile training ranges, Camp Atterbury also boasts configurable classrooms and conference spaces, offering users mission-specific, adaptable training experiences. The facility combines a pedestrian-friendly campus, a newly constructed barracks complex, and extensive life-support amenities, ensuring optimal conditions for units engaged in large-scale training exercises and pre-operational testing.



The Range Training Complex at Camp Atterbury offers a wide array of facilities to support diverse training needs. It includes 41 direct fire ranges, covering basic marksmanship, live-fire exercises, crew-served gunnery, convoy live-fire, and aerial gunnery. Additionally, there are 16 mortar firing points and 52 artillery firing points. The complex features 113 training areas, ranging from flat terrain to wooded and marshy zones.

- Range safety certification classes are conducted 7 days a week at <u>1200</u> in Building 127.
- The RSO/OIC must submit range safety cards, a Commander's memorandum, and a risk assessment for each training area/range. Blanket memos are not authorized- Be specific.
- <u>Non-tactical vehicles must check in</u> at Building 127 to obtain a range pass, including all civilian model vehicles, rentals, and GSA's.
- Ranges and training areas are <u>required to maintain communication</u> with Range Control throughout training. If issued radios happen to malfunction, other contact methods, i.e. cell phone, runner, must be used. Contact for each location is required.
- While a Range is occupied, radio checks with Range Control are performed at the bottom of each hour.
- The Range Operations Synchronization Meeting takes place every Friday at 1400 in Building 127; attendance from all units training over the weekend is mandatory.

The Atterbury Rail Deployment Facility (ARDF), also known as the "railhead" at CAIN, is fully equipped to load and unload a brigade combat team within 72 hours and can accommodate up to 120 rail cars per day. The facility includes a 20,000 square foot vehicle deployment processing center, a weigh-in-motion scale house, a rail operations building, and well-organized loading, marshalling, and staging areas.

As a highly cost-effective and efficient resource, the ARDF is one of the most economical methods for transporting large equipment and personnel across long distances. It is a vital asset in the Indiana National Guard's mission readiness, supporting a wide range of military operations. The ARDF ensures the Guard is prepared to meet any mission, anytime, anywhere in the world, helping maintain the strategic flexibility required for global military engagement.





HOUSING

Camp Atterbury provides a diverse selection of top-tier accommodations and state-of-the-art operational facilities to meet the needs of both personnel and administrative functions. With a variety of housing options and essential services, it is the ideal location for both long-term stays and short-term assignments. Whether stationed here or visiting, Camp Atterbury offers everything required for a seamless and efficient experience.




ATTERBURY LOGISITICS

The Directorate of Logistics (DOL) manages all requests for Class I, III, and IV supplies, including dining facilities, and a retail fuel point, during training at Camp Atterbury. DOL also coordinates the contracting of chemical latrines, hand wash stations, dumpsters, and any additional items needed for training.


Edinburgh **Correctional Facility**



Camp Atterbury is home to a Level 1 correctional facility situated within the installation. Incarcerated individuals from this facility are engaged in various work details around the base, contributing to the daily operations by participating in work crews performing jobs in and around the cantonment area as well as the range complex. These individuals, who are easily identifiable by their distinctive yellow coveralls, work under the supervision of Camp Atterbury employees and are closely monitored to ensure their safety and the security of the installation.

It is important to note that, for safety and security reasons, personnel and visitors are strictly prohibited from interacting with these incarcerated individuals. This includes refraining from giving or receiving anything from them, such as items or messages, and ensuring that they do not have access to or use cellular devices. Such interactions could pose a risk to the security of the installation and violate established protocols.

If any issues, concerns, or incidents arise involving these individuals, it is essential to immediately notify the IDOC Administration at Building 701. This ensures that the proper authorities are alerted and can take the necessary actions to address the situation in accordance with established procedures. Adhering to these guidelines is crucial for maintaining a secure and safe environment at Camp Atterbury.








MUTC CAPABILITIES & TRAINING

Muscatatuck Training Center (MuTC) offers a globally unique, multi-domain operating environment that combines urban and rural settings, making it the largest and most realistic urban training facility within the Department of Defense (DoD). It serves as a premier site for those dedicated to homeland defense and peacekeeping efforts.

Muscatatuck is an actual city with a fully developed physical infrastructure, a sophisticated cyber-physical environment, integrated electromagnetic effects systems, and human elements, all contributing to an immersive training experience. The center provides flexible, cost-effective, and highly realistic scenarios for training and testing.

The facility supports customized live/virtual/constructive (LVC) training, as well as developmental testing and evaluation. Encompassing a 1,000-acre urban and rural landscape, Muscatatuck features more than 90 brick-and-mortar buildings, totaling approximately 1.5 million square feet of indoor space. Additionally, it includes 1.8 miles of subterranean tunnels, a cave complex, over nine miles of roads, managed airspace, a 185-acre reservoir, and a cyber live-fire range.




Muscatatuck training site features a modern water treatment plant capable of processing 1 million gallons of water per day, a multi-level prison complex equipped with control systems, cameras, and security technology, and a configurable cellular system, which can replicate global mobile user profiles. Additionally, the site includes networked traffic signals, a smart house with over 70 IoT devices, a closed internet environment, and spectrum analysis equipment (1KHz – 26.6 GHz).



OPERATIONS AND TRAINING

- Coordinate convoy operations with Grizzly Operations 7 days in advance
- Waterborne operations require approval
- Blackout operations require prior approval and inclusion in risk assessment
- Coordinate roadblocks/checkpoints with Grizzly Operations
- Roof access requires prior approval and risk assessment notation
- Be aware of civilian traffic on CR 425 E, CR 450 E, 485N, and CR 475 E
- "No access" rooms/areas are off-limits and hazardous
- Tunnels are accessible only with prior coordination; violations may result in UCMJ/LE action
- Observe speed limits and stop signs on MuTC and adjacent roads

WEATHER PROCEDURES MUSCATATUCK





If the training venue or venues in use do not have hard structures, **Range Control should be contacted** to assist in coordinating a severe weather plan. If weather is active in the area, Range Control follows the Jennings County alert system. Muscatatuck is equipped with numerous hard structure buildings that can be activated for shelter during severe weather events. Once a weather warning has expired or been lifted, an "all-clear" message will be issued, allowing training to resume.

Training organizations are responsible for developing and implementing severe weather plans based on the specific training venues assigned. The training complex provides sufficient space for seeking cover during severe weather. In the event of a thunderstorm warning, relevant information will be broadcast over all radio frequencies, and email notifications will be sent. Should a tornado warning be issued, the emergency siren will sound to alert personnel.







Atterbury-Muscatatck is home to a diverse range of plant life, including several poisonous species such as poison ivy, poison oak, poison sumac, and poison parsnip. It is important to exercise caution around these plants and wash thoroughly after contact. The installation also supports a variety of wildlife, including turkeys, deer, coyotes, skunks, timber rattlesnakes, copperhead snakes, ticks, black widow spiders, and brown recluse spiders. Interactions with wildlife should be avoided to ensure both personal safety and the preservation of natural habitats.

The installation also contains several environmental considerations, including over 70 old wells, cisterns, and protected cemeteries. These areas are marked with Seibert stakes or engineer tape and should be avoided to protect both the environment and cultural heritage.

Additionally, to protect the **endangered Indiana Bats** (Myotis sodalis), the use of M18 colored smoke grenades within 36 meters of trees will be minimized from **April 1 to September 30** each year. This species, endangered since the late 1960s, is difficult to distinguish but typically measures 1.5-2 inches in length and weighs about ¼ ounce. The Indiana Bat is found in wooded areas during warmer months and hibernates in caves during colder months. Adhering to these precautions helps to preserve the natural ecosystem and protect vulnerable species at Camp Atterbury.

Cultural artifacts, including old homesteads, wells, cisterns, and cemeteries, must not be removed or disturbed. Federal and state laws prohibit the personal collection of artifacts, and violations may result in civil and criminal penalties. If an artifact is discovered, it must remain in place, and a 100-foot boundary should be established around it. Range Control and the Environmental Management Branch must be notified immediately. Only foot traffic is allowed in these protected areas.

SOIL DISPLACEMENT

Environmental management must be contacted prior to any soil disturbance. Activities such as rock or spoil placement are considered soil-disturbing and require prior approval. If archaeological resources are discovered during any digging activities, operations must be halted immediately. In such cases, Range Control and the Environmental Management Branch must be notified. Approval for soil disturbance activities may take up to 90 days, depending on the nature of the disturbance.

SPILL RESPONSE

In the event of a spill, identify the nearest water source and contact the responsible party. Complete a Spill Response Report form and submit it to Range Control. All spills, including self-cleaned ones, must be reported. Some spills require immediate notification to federal and state agencies.

To report a spill, contact Range Control at

location, substance, amount, affected environment,
and safety hazards. Environmental personnel will
handle reports to state and federal agencies.






