## Military Funeral Honors Mission Statement

The mission statement for Indiana ARMG MFH Program is to render professional and dignified MFH IAW service tradition, to all eligible Service Members, Retirees, and Veterans when requested by an authorized family member, representative, or by the Fort Knox Causality Assistance Center (CAC). The INARMG MFH Program can be augmented by a Veteran Service Organization (VSO) while performing veteran burial honors, by assisting in rendering a three round volley and the playing of Taps.

## Military Funeral Honors Eligibility

Two Soldier Detail – All Soldiers with an honorable discharge are eligible for a two Soldier detail. A two Soldier detail consists of the playing of Taps followed by the folding and presentation of our Nation's flag.

Full Honors Detail – All retired and active personnel are eligible for a full honors detail. (No Rank requirement and pending on personnel availability) This detail will consist of a casket team, a firing party, a bugler, and two Soldier's to fold the flag.

(This is the highest honor rendered for our Nation's veterans.)

Honorable Transfer – Honorable transfers will be given during repatriation of remains and active personnel remains being transferred to home of record from another state. Remains will be flown in by plane from another airport and a casket team will transfer the remains from the bottom of the plane to a hearse in order to put the remains in the Funeral Home's possession.
