The grant program, which seeks to bridge the digital divide by bringing highquality, reliable broadband to unserved and underserved parts of Indiana, began as part of Gov. Holcomb's Next Level Connections initiative, a \$1 billion statewide infrastructure program announced in 2018. The first two rounds of funding awarded \$78.95 million to 63 projects, for a total
