


IBO December Newsletter

BEAD Program Update

The Broadband, Equity, Accessibility, and Deployment (BEAD) Program has several key updates to share. The IBO is awaiting final NTIA approval of the BEAD-eligible address list, which will be made public once approved. Additionally, Subgrantee Selection Round 1 is scheduled to open at the end of December and will remain open for 45 calendar days.
