

Indiana will invest \$270 million toward improving broadband access and adoption in Indiana. The Next Level Connections Broadband Grant Program is designed to provide funds for the deployment of broadband infrastructure to provide eligible broadband service to unserved end users, which include

households, businesses and community anchor institutions, such as schools

and health clinics, across Indiana. Broadband has become not only an essential tool, but an important part of quality of life. IBO believes that broadband is the vehicle that moves information at high speeds and allows every corner of the state to be digitally connected. We hope to provide opportunities and assistance to communities across the state and ensure connectivity to all.







indicates a location in which there is a Broadband Ready Task Force in place.


