Definition of Control Route (105 IAC 7-4-2(9)):

“Control route” means any road in Indiana that is:

- (A) part of the interstate system;
- (B) part of the federal-aid primary system as of June 1, 1991;
- (C) a scenic byway; or
- (D) part of the national highway system to include intermodal connectors.

Scenic byways

Indiana’s scenic byways include:

- **Historic National Road;**
- **Indiana’s Historic Pathways;**
- **Lincoln Highway Scenic Byway (1913 Route and 1928 Route);**
- **Historic Michigan Road Scenic Byway;**
- **Ohio River Scenic Byway (and Extension);**
- **Wabash River Scenic Byway;**
- **Whitewater Canal Scenic Byway (including the Oldenburg-Bateville Loop, East Fork Loop, and Dearborn-Ripley Loop)**
- **Hoosier Hills Scenic Byway**
