Traffic Shifted on I-469 This Week

Traffic restricted to one lane in each direction between U.S. 27 and Minnich Road

ALLEN COUNTY – The Indiana Department of Transportation announces that the traffic pattern on I-469, from 0.85 miles east of U.S. 27 to 2.4 miles south of U.S. 30, has been shifted to its season-long configuration.

Traffic has been shifted to the eastbound lanes, with one 11-foot lane in each direction, while road reconstruction takes place in the westbound lanes. Also at this time, contractors have closed the westbound exit ramp from I-469 to Marion Center Road and the westbound entrance from to I-469 from Tillman Road.

Work on the project, to be completed by INDOT contractor Brooks Construction Company, includes the total removal of concrete pavement from the lanes and shoulders, followed by the placement of asphalt between mile marker 11/U.S. 27 and mile marker 17/Minnich Road. Bridge rehabilitation and repair are also scheduled for the I-469 bridge over the Chicago, Fort Wayne and Eastern Railroad south; the I-469 bridge over Tillman Road; and the I-469 bridge over the Chicago, Fort Wayne and Eastern Railroad north. A bridge deck overlay is planned for the I-469 bridge over Houk Ditch.

The speed limit will be reduced to 55 mph through the construction zone, with a 45 mph speed limit when flashing speed limit signs are present.

Work on the westbound lanes will continue throughout late 2017, with traffic being restored to two lanes in both directions before the 2017-18 winter season. The two-year construction project will resume in the spring of 2018 with the reconstruction of the eastbound lanes.
