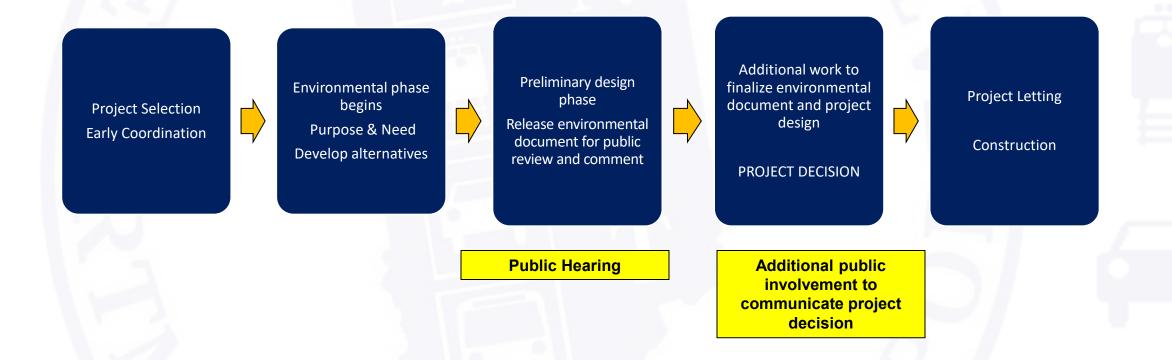

U.S. 231 Intersection Improvement

Purpose and Need

- The need is based on the high crash rate, specifically the occurrence of right-angle crashes involving vehicles crossing US 231 on Iowa Street.
- The purpose is to improve intersection safety and provide a long-term solution to ensure safe and efficient operation of the intersection.



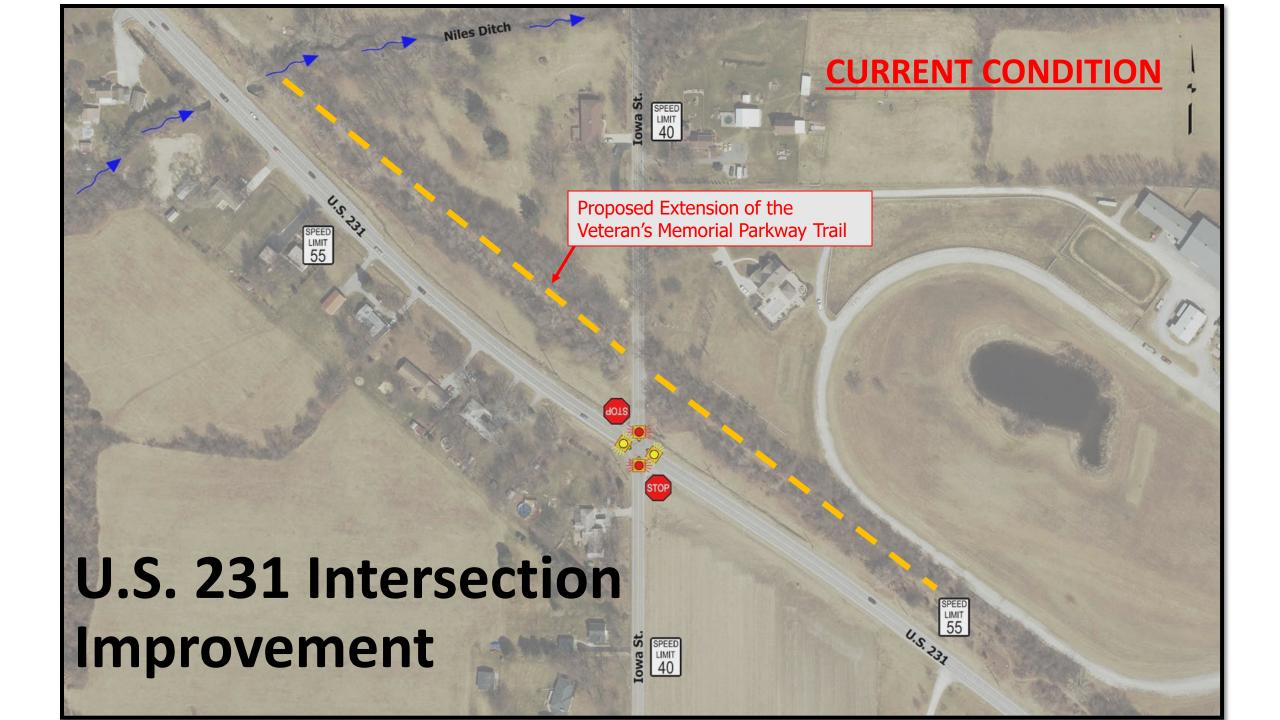
U.S. 231 Intersection Improvement

CURRENT CONDITION

- Free flow with flashing yellow for US 231.
- Stop controlled with flashing red for Iowa Street.







Environmental Document

National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA)

- Decision-making process, requiring INDOT to analyze and evaluate the impacts of proposed project to the natural and socio-economic environments
 - Purpose and Need
 - Alternatives Screening
 - Identifies Preferred Solution (Preferred Alternative)

Impacts analyzed, evaluated and described NEPA document

- What impacts might this project have on the community and environmental resources?
- How can impacts be avoided?
- Can impacts be minimized?
- Mitigation for impacts?

- Right-of-way 2.54 acre permanent ROW, 0.026 acre temporary ROW, 0.281 acre re-acquired ROW
- Utilities

- Section 4(f) de minimis finding



Project Impacts - Environmental

Section 4(f) de minimis use of the Veteran's Memorial Parkway Trail

Lake County Parks and Recreation Department owns land in northwest quadrant of US 231 and Iowa Street required for planned extension of Veteran's Memorial Parkway Trail.

- Planned trail is publicly owned recreational resource protected under Section 4(f) of the DOT Act of 1966.
- 0.871 acre of permanent ROW in the northwest quadrant
- Section 4(f) de minimis finding
 - Project will not adversely affect the activities, features, and attributes of the planned trail
 - Planned trail incorporated into the design to accommodate future construction

Legal notice announcing the public hearing will include information on Section 4(f) *de minimis* finding for public comment



Project Impacts - Environmental

Wetland Impacts

Permanent wetland impacts - Approximately 0.31 acre anticipated

 Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) Isolated Wetlands Permit / Waters of the State Permit and US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Regional General Permit

Wetland Mitigation

- 0.732 acres of wetland mitigation credits from the IDNR Stream and Wetland Mitigation Program (INSWMP) Kankakee Service Area Wetland Mitigation
- IDEM and USACE determine final credits to be purchased during permitting

All efforts to avoid and minimize wetland impacts have been considered during the design process.



Public Involvement

- Notice of Entry for Survey June 2022
 - Letters mailed to properties within general area
 - Gather data for environmental analysis
- Public involvement process June/July 2025
 - Opportunity for public to provide input regarding the proposed project
- Communicate project decision Summer 2025
 - INDOT seeking public comment and input regarding proposed project

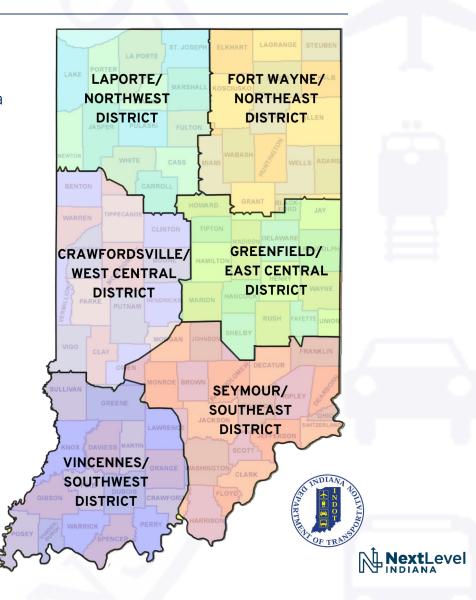

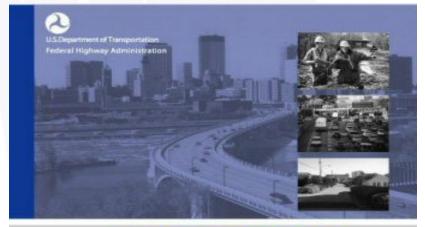

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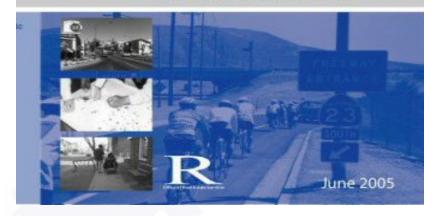

Real Estate Acquisition Process

• "Uniform Act of 1970"

- All federal, state and local governments must comply
- Requires an offer for just compensation

Acquisition Process

- Appraisals
- Review Appraisals
- Negotiation
- Right-of-Way (ROW) needed for project
 - 2.54 acre of permanent new ROW (1.51 agricultural, 0.87 commercial, 0.16 residential)
 - 0.026 acre of temporary ROW needed
 - No permanent easements needed
- INDOT Real Estate Team to work with impacted property owners

Right-of-Way (ROW)

- Permanent ROW
 - Land, once purchased by INDOT from legal land owner, becomes ROW owned by INDOT
- Existing apparent ROW
 - <u>Existing apparent ROW INDOT</u>
 acquired land by Highway Grant some
 years ago, transactions in some cases
 were not properly recorded, requires
 further action by INDOT

Temporary ROW

- Land required during the construction of a project and is used for the purposes of construction-related activity
- INDOT pays legal land owner a fee for land use during construction and/or as part of construction-related activities

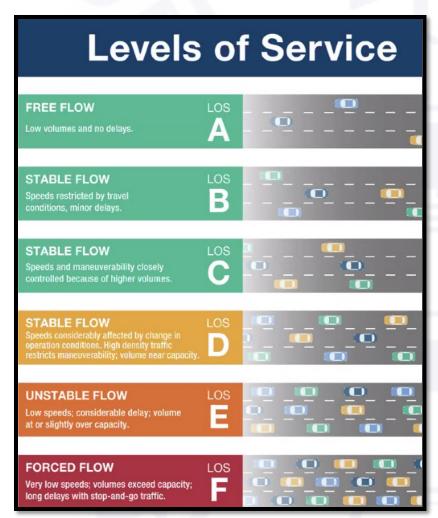


No Build Alternative

- Baseline for comparison of build alternative
- Does not meet purpose and need of project
- Does not improve the mobility or safety of the intersection

Traffic Signal with Added Left Turn Lanes

- Left turn lanes required on US 231 for mobility and safety
- Signals are known to increase crashes due to rear-ends and red light running
- Does not reduce intersection conflict points or crashes
- Provides Level of Service B
- Does not fully meet the purpose and need of the project



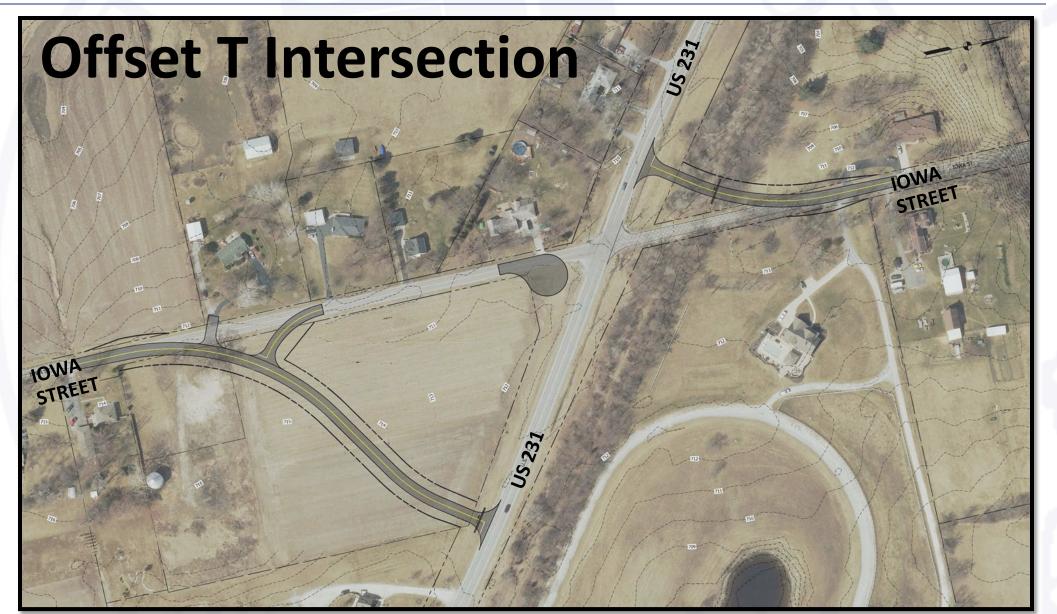






- Offset T Intersection
 - Typically utilized when major and minor roads have a skew
 - Crossing movement eliminated
 - Separate intersections by 700 ft
 - Lower construction cost
 - Reduces right angle crashes but could increase left turn, sideswipe and rear end crashes
 - Level of Service ranges from C to F
 - Does not fully meet the purpose and need of the project



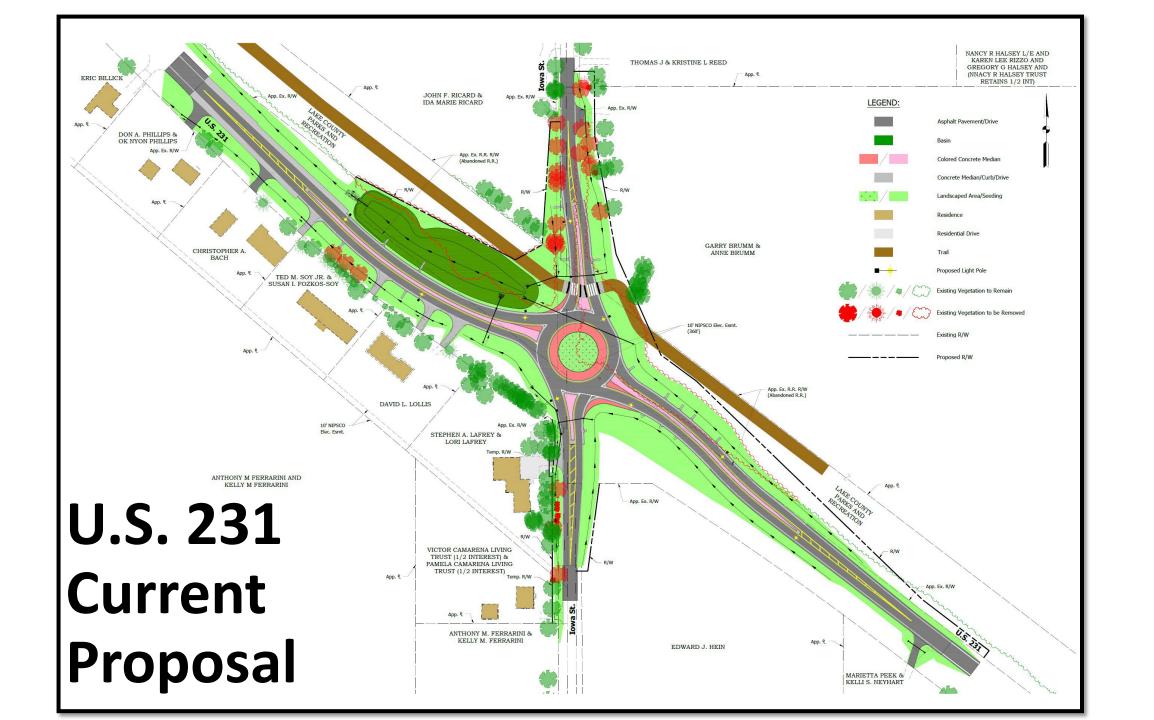


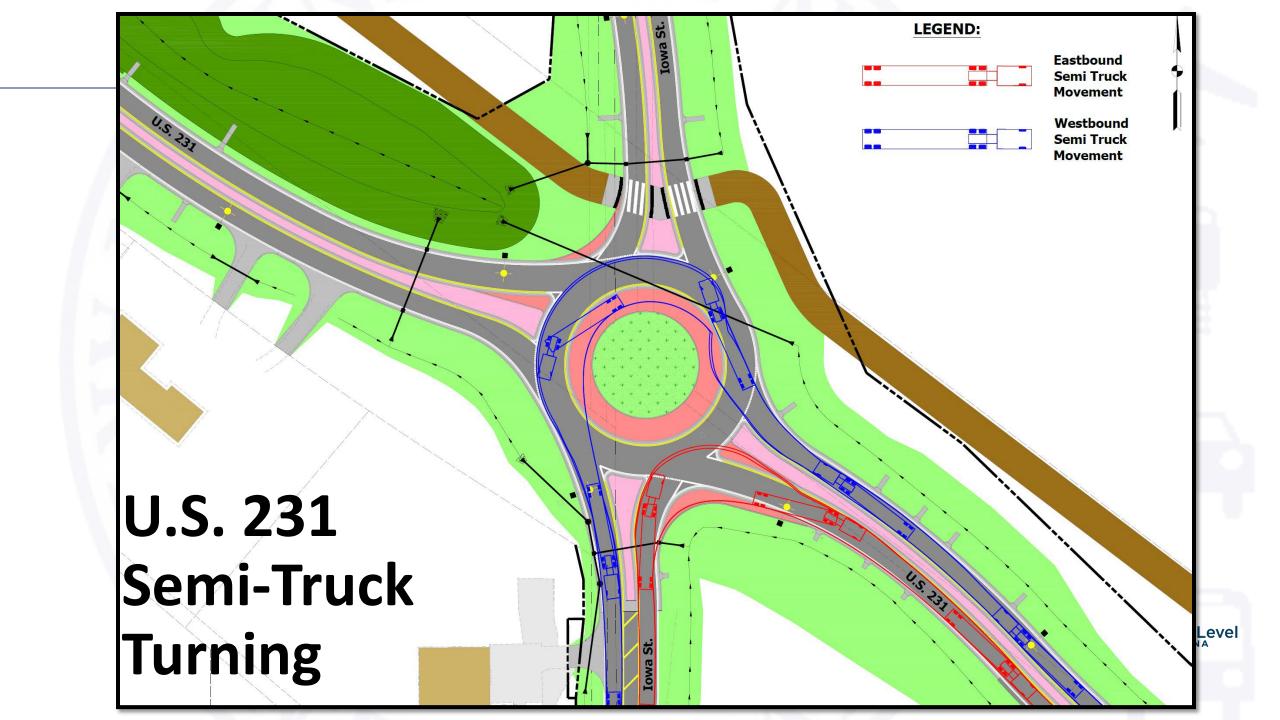


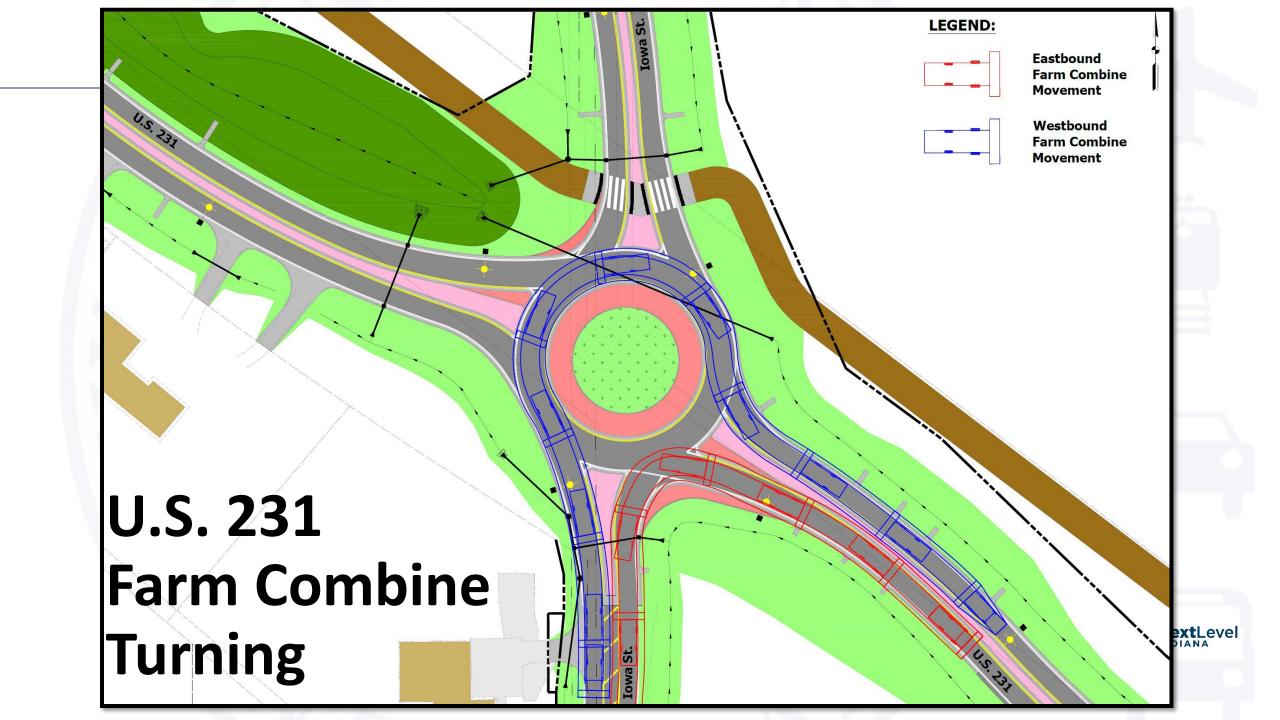
- Roundabout Preferred Alternative
 - Reduces conflict points by 75% compared to typical 4-way intersection
 - Geometry reduces speeds, calms traffic and reduces congestion
 - Provides Level of Service A
 - Higher construction cost
 - More environmental impacts and larger construction limit footprint
 - Benefits as listed on INDOT's website:
 - Up to 90% reduction in fatalities
 - 76% reduction in injury crashes
 - 30-50% increase in traffic capacity
 - **Does** fully meet the purpose and need of the project











Project Schedule

- Public Hearing: June 24, 2025
- Public comments requested by Tuesday, July 8, 2025
- INDOT review and consideration of public comments Summer 2025
 - Finalize environmental document
 - Reach project decision
 - Complete design
 - Inform community and project stakeholders of project decision
- Proposed construction: Spring 2026; Anticipate completion: Fall 2026

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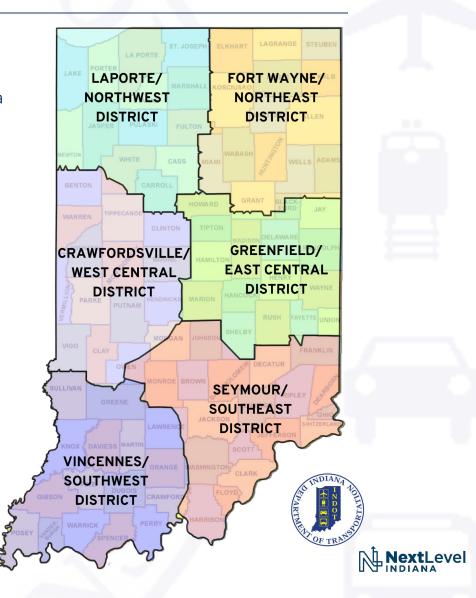
