Louisville - Southern Indiana Ohio River Bridges Project Progress Report Number 16 January 1, 2011 – June 30, 2011 Implementation of the Section 106 Memorandum of Agreement

The Section 106 Memorandum of Agreement (MOA)¹ for the Louisville – Southern Indiana Ohio River Bridges Project (Project) was executed on April 1, 2003. Attachment A provides a list of the signatories to the MOA and concurring parties. Included in the MOA was a stipulation providing for the preparation of a Progress Report (Stipulation IX). The following is Progress Report No. 16, which covers the January 1, 2011 – June 30, 2011 reporting period (Reporting Period).

Activity during the Reporting Period concentrated on implementation of mitigation measures in the MOA including preparing and convening meetings of the Indiana and Kentucky Historic Preservation Advisory Teams (IHPAT/KHPAT), continuing the Historic Preservation Plan (HPP) process for the Swartz Farm, the Utica Limekilns and the Country Estates of River Road/River Road Corridor (CE RR/RRC), coordinating the activities to prepare preservation easements for various properties, as well as treatment plans for other identified sites. Activities related to completion of these aforementioned tasks are described in more detail in later sections of this report.

PART I – OVERALL PROJECT STATUS

The Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) and the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC) executed the prime contract for Community Transportation Solutions – General Engineering Consultant (CTS-GEC) on April 20, 2005. A description of each section and the progress of each Section Design Consultant (SDC) are provided in the following summary.

- Section 1 Kentucky Downtown Approach (including Kennedy Interchange) –
 No direct environmental or mitigation efforts were initiated by SDC 2
 during this Reporting Period.
- Downtown Bridge (using Alternative C-1, Three Tower Cable Stay) –
 No direct environmental or mitigation efforts were initiated by SDC 2
 during this Reporting Period.
- Indiana Downtown Approach During this Reporting Period, development of a landscaping variance for the Spring Street Freight House (Freight House) was completed along with the construction plans for rehabilitating the structure. The 100% plans were finalized by SDC 3 and sent to the Procurement Section of the INDOT Division of Procurement, Project Accounting and Budget. The rehabilitation of the Freight House was bid on April 13, 2011.


Kentucky East End Approach – On February 28, 2011, a tornado struck the Rosewell property, including the historic mansion. As such, SDC 4 recommended that needed repairs occur at the same time as a portion of the proposed Rosewell Treatment Plan. KYTC requested concurrence from FHWA and the Kentucky SHPO (KY SHPO) to commence the repairs as noted. Final review is continuing with approval of the repairs and treatment plan anticipated in the ensuing Reporting Period.

<u>Section 5</u> East End Bridge – No direct environmental or mitigation efforts were initiated by SDC 5 during this Reporting Period.

Section 6 Indiana East End Approach – East End Approach – No direct environmental or mitigation efforts were initiated by SDC 6 during this Reporting Period.

CTS-GEC worked during this Reporting Period with the BiState Management Team (BSMT), which consists of representatives from the INDOT, KYTC and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), in the project oversight requirements of the SDCs under contract by either INDOT and/or KYTC.

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PART II – IMPLEMENTATION OF MITIGATION MEASURES CONTAINED IN THE MOA

Measures to mitigate adverse effects of the Project on historic properties are described in the MOA along with a number of activities to guide the development of project plans and provide for coordination of those activities through an historic preservation advisory team for the Indiana portion of the project and one for the Kentucky portion of the project.

The MOA is divided into the following fourteen (14) stipulations:

- II. Project Development
- III. Site Specific Mitigation
- IV. Archaeological Resources
- V. Unanticipated Discoveries
- VI. Additional Historic Properties and Effects
- VII. Excess Right of Way
- VIII. Performance Standards
- IX. Progress Reports
- X. Project Modification
- XI. Amendment
- XII. Failure to Comply/Termination
- XIII. Dispute Resolution
- XIV. Duration

An expanded version of this listing is included as Attachment B to serve as an outline in the preparation of the Progress Report. A complete definition of each of the specific MOA stipulations completed during the Reporting Period is contained in Attachment C. Activities completed toward satisfying the various stipulations of the MOA during the Reporting Period are described in the following information.

STIPULATION I: Project Coordination

Stipulation I.A.2. provides for the Historic Advisory Teams to assist the BiState Historic Consultation Team (BSHCT) and the BSMT in developing Project design details to implement the measures stipulated in the MOA. Work continued during the Reporting Period on this stipulation.

Stipulation I.A.3. provides for the Co-chairs to convene meetings of the Historic Preservation Advisory Teams (HPATs), prepare summaries of said meetings and prepare and submit HPAT recommendations to the BSHCT for further action. An IHPAT meeting was held on April 13, 2011. A KHPAT meeting was held on April 14, 2011. Summaries of each meeting were returned to HPAT members within a reasonable time following each meeting. HPAT meetings scheduled for February (IHPAT of February 16, 2011/KHPAT of February 17, 2011) and June (IHPAT of June 15, 2011/KHPAT of June 16, 2011) were postponed by the Co-chairs due to a lack of agenda items.

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Stipulation I.A.10. provides for the distribution of materials needed for review by the advisory teams and comments following scheduled meetings. Meeting materials were provided at least 15 days prior to each scheduled meeting. Presentations and requests for input during the meetings were supplemented by a 15-day comment period following the meetings to obtain additional input and comment from the HPATs.

Stipulation I.A.11. provides for the development of recommendations by the Co-chairs based on comments provided by the advisory team, for consideration and action by the BSHCT. During the Reporting Period, there were no recommendations of the HPATs advanced from the Co-chairs to the BSHCT.

Stipulation I.B. provides for a BSHCT. The BSHCT is to consist of representatives of FHWA, INDOT, KYTC and the respective State Historic Preservation Officers (SHPOs). It defines the roles and responsibilities of the BSHCT, mandates the scheduling of BSHCT coordination meetings and provides a means to advance recommendations of the HPATs to the BSMT for final approval.

The BSHCT held two meetings during the Reporting Period on January 18, 2011 and March 15, 2011. The only recommendations elevated from the BSHCT to the BSMT (and the date of the respective BSHCT meeting) included the approval of Progress Report No. 15 (July 1, 2010 – December 31, 2010) for distribution (March 9, 2011), and the final approval of the CE RR/RRC HPP (January 12, 2011). The scheduled BSHCT meeting of May 17, 2011 was declined by the Co-chairs.

Stipulation I.C. provides for a BSMT. The BSMT consists of representatives of INDOT, KYTC and FHWA. It defines the roles and responsibilities of the BSMT, mandates the preparation of Progress Reports as set forth in Stipulation IX of this MOA and provides a means to consider recommendations of the HPATs through the BSHCT for final approval. Biweekly meetings of the BSMT generally occurred on the Monday of every other week and items related to this MOA were brought forth. The BSMT approved Progress Report No. 15 (July 1, 2010 – December 31, 2010) for distribution on March 28, 2011. Following approval the Progress Report was distributed in accordance with Stipulation IX of the MOA on April 11, 2011. The CE RR/RRC HPP was approved by the BSMT on January 24, 2011 and distributed to the KHPAT members on February 7, 2011.

Progress Report Number 16 for the Reporting Period of January 1, 2011 – June 30, 2011 is provided in accordance with Stipulation IX.

Stipulation I.D. provides for an Ombudsman for the Indiana portion of the Project and one for the Kentucky portion of the Project. It defines the qualifications for performance as the Project Ombudsman, the roles and responsibilities of the Ombudsman and the location of the office of the Ombudsman for each state. During the Reporting Period, Mr. Carl Pearcy continued to serve as the Indiana Ombudsman. Mr. Lee Douglas Walker continued to serve as the Kentucky Ombudsman.

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STIPULATION II: Project Development

Work initiated on implementation of mitigation measures identified in Stipulation II of the MOA during the Reporting Period follows.

Stipulation II.B. provides that the views of the public are important and will be solicited and considered at a minimum through the normal transportation project development process of each state through informal meetings to be convened by the respective State Transportation Agencies (STA). During the Reporting Period, no Area Advisory Team (AAT) or Regional Advisory Committee (RAC) meetings were convened. A Resource Agency coordination meeting was held on May 26, 2011 as part of the Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS) process.

Stipulation II.C. provides that the roadways, bridges and other Project elements shall be designed and constructed with sensitivity to aesthetic values, historic cultural landscapes, and the historic context, utilizing services of professionals with experience in areas related to historic preservation. Due to the modification to the preferred alternate by the governors of Indiana and Kentucky, the coordination meeting scheduled for February 2011 to further discuss the logo options for the noise wall and gateways at Mellwood Avenue and Story Avenue were withdrawn. All of the concepts developed to date are to be reviewed.

Stipulation II.F. describes the actions for preparation of HPPs. The seven historic properties for which HPPs are to be developed were identified in Stipulation II.F.2 (a through g). During the Reporting Period, development of the HPPs for the Swartz Farm, the Utica Limekilns and the CE RR/RRC were placed on hold.

The first amendment to the MOA for the Swartz Farm was sent to the IN SHPO for comment on January 20, 2011. The amendment was being processed due to the razing of the farmhouse by the private owner. FHWA sent a follow-up letter advising IN SHPO that the amendment for the Swartz Farm will be included in the Section 106 Consultation Process for the SEIS. No further work was to continue on the amendment or the HPP.

On March 4, 2011, coordination was initiated with the IN SHPO to address the applicability of Section 4(f) to the Utica Limekilns. In a previous coordination meeting of March 22, 2010 with the IN SHPO, it was thought that the adjacent quarries could be eligible for the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP). The Section 106 process is to be followed to determine eligilibility and effects on the site as part of the SEIS.

The final HPP for the CE RR/RRC was approved by the Co-chairs of the BSHCT at their meeting of September 14, 2010 with a recommendation to advance it to the BSMT for final review for approval. It was provided to the BSMT and approved on January 24, 2011. It was posted to the Project website and distributed to the KHPAT members on February 7, 2011.

The final draft of the HPP for Butchertown is on hold while the preparation of the SEIS is continuing.

Stipulation II.H. mandates that preservation easements shall be established on (those specific) properties identified in Stipulation III in perpetuity by INDOT or KYTC, and held by a local

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government, local or state preservation organization or other entity as determined by INDOT or KYTC in consultation with the respective SHPO.

Representatives of CTS-GEC conducted field work at the Wesley House in February 2011 to visually observe, measure and photograph the gymnasium building (121 N. Shelby Street) and the red brick house (809 E. Washington Street). The site visit was facilitated by the property owner. The 30% plans for the exterior rehabilitation of both buildings were issued for review and comment on March 7, 2011. At the KHPAT meeting of April 14, 2011, KYTC advised that further work on the Wesley House was placed on hold per instructions from FHWA. All mitigation measures are to be reviewed as a part of the SEIS development, including a revised preservation easement.

A site visit was held on April 5, 2011 to identify a potential scope for the exterior rehabilitation of the Edison House. Based on the visual observations, CTS-GEC identified and developed a scope for the rehabilitation work. However, at the KHPAT meeting of April 14, 2011, KYTC advised that further work on the Edison House was placed on hold per instructions from FHWA. All mitigation measures are to be reviewed as a part of the SEIS development, including the preservation easement.

Coordination with the property owner is continuing for the placement of an easement on the tract of land within the NRHP boundary of the Allison-Barrickman house. The property owners are in receipt of the information requested from SDC 4. To date, no further coordination with the owners has taken place. It is probable that a meeting will be scheduled to further discuss the easement, as the right-of-way acquisition phase continues on the Kentucky East End Section.

Negotiations with the property owner were continuing for the placement of a preservation easement at Drumanard. If negotiations fail, KYTC is prepared to make an offer to acquire the entire property.

After rehabilitation, the INDOT will place a preservation easement on the Freight House and (most likely) offer the building for sale (as office space) through the Indiana Department of Administration (IDOA) state surplus property sale procedures. The disposition of the building would be in accordance with existing state law. It is probable that IHPAT members would assist FHWA, INDOT and CTS-GEC in defining the specific stipulations of the preservation easement.

Stipulation II.I. mandates that for specific properties identified in Stipulation III, documentation required for a NRHP nomination shall be prepared by a qualified historic preservation consultant selected by INDOT or KYTC, upon receipt of written consent from the property owner(s) and within the first three years following the ROD. Six properties were identified in the MOA requiring the preparation of a nomination form, all located in Indiana.

In this Reporting Period, the Utica Limekilns MPDF and NRHP nominations remain under FHWA review. On March 4, 2011, coordination was initiated with the IN SHPO to address the applicability of Section 4(f) to the Utica Limekilns. The Section 106 process is to be followed to determine eligibility and effects on the site as part of the SEIS.

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Stipulation II.J. provides for streetscape improvements, such as landscaping, tree plantings, ornamental street lighting, fencing, curbing, pavements, sidewalks, traffic calming, or other similar work, when specified in Stipulation III, shall be designed in consultation with the respective SHPO and constructed within public rights of way unless otherwise provided for in this MOA or approved by the Bi-State Management Team. As stated, the coordination meeting scheduled for February 2011 to further discuss the logo options for the noise wall and gateways at Mellwood Avenue and Story Avenue were withdrawn. All of the concepts developed to date are to be reviewed.

Stipulation II.K. states that interpretative signage, when specified in Stipulation III, shall be placed within the right of way of public streets, or on easements, to explain the significance of the historic properties, their context, and their importance to the development of the area. As stated, the coordination meeting scheduled for February 2011 to further discuss the logo options for the noise wall and gateways at Mellwood Avenue and Story Avenue were withdrawn. All of the concepts developed to date are to be reviewed.

STIPULATION III: Site Specific Mitigation

Work continued on the implementation of mitigation measures identified in Stipulation III of the MOA during the Reporting Period.

Stipulation III.A.2.b. provides that any work to rehabilitate the Train Depot (Spring Street Freight House) shall be undertaken in consultation with the IN SHPO and in accordance with the Secretary's Standards. The 100% plans were finalized by SDC 3 and sent to the Procurement Section of the INDOT Division of Procurement, Project Accounting and Budget. The construction letting for the Freight House was held on April 13, 2011 with 100% state funds. Construction of the rehabilitation is underway with an anticipated completion date of April 2012.

As a part of the final plan development, it was determined that the removal of five proposed trees along Spring Street for better visibility of the Freight House would require a zoning variance from the Jeffersonville Planning Commission (JPC). The Co-chairs favored endorsement of the proposed variance by the IHPAT. As such, CTS-GEC prepared a resolution and it was signed by Ms. Kennedy (INDOT Co-chair) and Mr. Carr (IN SHPO Representative Co-chair) and sent to the IHPAT on January 18, 2011. Four IHPAT members signed the resolution and it was forwarded to SDC 3 on January 21, 2011. The application for the variance was prepared by SDC 3 and submitted to the JPC on January 21, 2011. On January 24, 2011, the variance with the IHPAT letter of endorsement was filed with the Development Plan Application by SDC 3. It was included on the JPC agenda for review and approved at the February 22, 2011 meeting of the JPC.

Stipulation III.A.2.c. provides that a preservation easement shall then be placed on the property consistent with Stipulation II.H and the property shall be sold at fair market value to a preservation organization or other party acceptable to the BSHCT or donated to a local government. After rehabilitation, the INDOT will place a preservation easement on the Freight House and (most likely) offer the building for sale (as office space) through the Indiana Department of Administration (IDOA) state surplus property sale procedures. The disposition of the building would be in accordance with existing state law. It is probable that IHPAT members

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would assist FHWA, INDOT and CTS-GEC in defining the specific stipulations of the preservation easement.

Stipulation III.A.5. provides that in consultation with the IHPAT and the IN SHPO, the INDOT shall develop and place interpretative signage as set forth in Stipulation II.K near the facility to explain its historic significance. INDOT has contacted Mr. Chris Wahlman of the INDOT, Seymour District to obtain specifications from the Scenic Byway Project for possible use in developing signage at the Freight House.

Stipulation III.E.7 provides for INDOT, IN SHPO and the FHWA to make a reasonable effort to relocate the five contributing structures (residences) to available vacant lots within the Old Jeffersonville HD. The property owner at 116 Fort Street, which is one of the contributing properties in the Old Jeffersonville Historic District (HD) to be relocated by the Project, has inquired about hardship acquisition. This inquiry was made due to the potential foreclosure on the property. This request is pending.

Stipulation III.H.1. provides for the preparation of an HPP for the Utica Lime Industry Multiple Property Listing, including a Context Study focusing on the lime industry in the region. A pamphlet is to be produced, describing the results of such a study. In this Reporting Period, the Utica Limekilns MPDF and NRHP nominations remain under FHWA review. On March 4, 2011, coordination was initiated with the IN SHPO to address the applicability of Section 4(f) to the Utica Limekilns. The Section 106 process is to be followed to determine eligibility and effects on the site as part of the SEIS.

Stipulation III.H.8. requires the INDOT to develop and seek NRHP nomination for the Utica Lime Kiln Multiple Property Listing. As stated, the NRHP nomination remains under FHWA review. On March 4, 2011, coordination was initiated with the IN SHPO to address the applicability of Section 4(f) to the Utica Limekilns. The Section 106 process is to be followed to determine eligibility and effects on the site as part of the SEIS.

Stipulation III.I. The first amendment to the MOA for the Swartz Farm was sent to the IN SHPO for comment on January 20, 2011. The amendment was being processed due to the razing of the farmhouse by the private owner. FHWA sent a follow-up letter advising IN SHPO that the amendment for the Swartz Farm will be included in the Section 106 Consultation Process for the SEIS. No further work was to continue on the amendment or the HPP.

Stipulation III.I.4. requires the INDOT to develop and seek NRHP nomination for the portion of the Swartz Farm lying to the west of the Project, including the house, barn and associated outbuildings. The preparation of the NRHP nomination form is to be developed by CTS-GEC. FHWA has advised the IN SHPO that the amendment of the MOA for the Swartz Farm will be included in the Section 106 Consultation Process for the SEIS.

Stipulation III.1.7. requires archival documentation of the CPH prior to its demolition. FHWA has advised the IN SHPO that the amendment of the MOA for the Swartz Farm will be included in the Section 106 Consultation Process for the SEIS.

Stipulation III.K.1. provides for the preparation of an HPP for the Butchertown Historic District. The final draft HPP for Butchertown is pending completion of the dispute resolution.

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Stipulation III.K.4. provides for the exterior rehabilitation of the Edison House if the owners agree to provide a preservation easement to ensure the long-term preservation of the exterior. A site visit was held on April 5, 2011 to identify a potential scope for the exterior rehabilitation of the Edison House. Based on the visual observations, CTS-GEC identified and developed a scope for the rehabilitation work. However, at the KHPAT meeting of April 14, 2011, KYTC advised that further work on the Edison House was placed on hold per instructions from FHWA. All mitigation measures are to be reviewed as a part of the SEIS development, including the preservation easement.

Stipulation III.K.5. provides for the exterior rehabilitation of the Wesley House if the owners agree to provide a preservation easement to ensure the long-term preservation of the exterior. Representatives of CTS-GEC conducted field work in February 2011 to visually observe, measure and photograph the gymnasium building (121 N. Shelby Street) and the red brick house (809 E. Washington Street). The site visit was facilitated by the property owner. The 30% plans for the exterior rehabilitation of both buildings were issued for review and comment on March 7, 2011. At the KHPAT meeting of April 14, 2011, KYTC advised that further work on the Wesley House was placed on hold per instructions from FHWA. All mitigation measures are to be reviewed as a part of the SEIS development, including a revised preservation easement.

Stipulation III.K.12. provides that KYTC shall design and construct streetscape improvements within the entire historic district as set forth in Stipulation II.J, in accordance with provisions of the HPP and the Kentucky Heritage Council's streetscape design guidelines. As stated, the coordination meeting scheduled for February 2011 to further discuss the logo options for the noise wall and gateways at Mellwood Avenue and Story Avenue were withdrawn. All of the concepts developed to date are to be reviewed.

Stipulation III.L.3. provides that the Project make a reasonable effort to relocate Baer Fabrics Company to another historic property within the Phoenix Hill neighborhood. The Baer Fabrics Building was acquired for demolition as it fell within the right-of-way of the Project. There has been no change in the status of this property. The timeline for the demolition is still deferred, as there is a hold on demolition.

Stipulation III.L.4. provides for the preparation of a treatment plan/reuse options for rehabilitation of the Vermont American Buildings affected by the Project. The building has been acquired by KYTC. An initial draft of the Treatment Plan (TP) was completed in July 2010, and a revised draft was submitted for BSHCT review in August 2010. Written review comments were issued by FHWA on January 5, 2011, which requested revisions and clarifications. The second draft of the TP is pending completion of the SEIS.

Stipulation III.M.1. provides for the preparation of an HPP for the CE RR/RRC. The final HPP for the CE RR/RRC was approved by the Co-chairs of the BSHCT at their meeting of September 14, 2010 with a recommendation to advance it to the BSMT for final review for approval. It was provided to the BSMT and approved on January 24, 2011. It was posted to the Project website and distributed to the KHPAT members on February 7, 2011.

Stipulation III.M.5. provides that prior to initiating construction activities, KYTC shall ensure that contractors shall develop and implement blasting/vibration plans to avoid damage to the listed and eligible properties. The blasting and vibration (BV) plans for the CE RR/RRC were a

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topic of discussion at the Ohio River Bridges Industry Forum of February 16 and 17, 2011 in Louisville. Development of these plans would be coordinated with the contractors prior to construction. The BV plans could vary dependent on the contractor's intended method of construction. Basic specifications will provided to the contractors at the time of bid requiring development of the plans. Upon the preparation of the BV plans, additional coordination with the KHPAT would occur.

Stipulation III.N.2. provides that FHWA shall make every effort to acquire or otherwise establish an historic preservation easement for the entire Drumanard historic property. Baseline documentation was prepared by SDC 4 for use in preparing the easement for Drumanard. Negotiations with the property owner were continuing to place a preservation easement at Drumanard. If negotiations fail, KYTC is prepared to make an offer to acquire the entire property.

Stipulation III.O.1. provides that KYTC shall make a reasonable effort to acquire a preservation easement for the tract of land within the NRHP boundary of the Allison-Barrickman house. Coordination with the property owner is continuing for the placement of an easement. The property owners are in receipt of the information requested from SDC 4. To date, no further coordination with them has taken place. It is probable that a meeting will be scheduled to further discuss the easement as the right-of-way acquisition phase is proceeding in the Kentucky East End.

Stipulation III.P.1. provides for the preparation of a treatment plan for Rosewell to minimize damage to the historic property. On February 28, 2011, a tornado struck the Rosewell property, including the historic mansion. As KYTC owns the property, KYTC requested concurrence from FHWA and the KY SHPO to commence needed storm repairs at the same time as the work proposed in the treatment plan. SDC 4 defined the repairs and sent them to the KY SHPO for review and comment. The KY SHPO returned comments to the KYTC on the scope of the repairs on March 29, 2011. Final (100%) treatment plan development accommodated the needed repairs and was completed on June 30, 2011. Final review is continuing with the KY SHPO for approval of the treatment plan with repairs anticipated in the ensuing Reporting Period, leading to a construction letting.

Kentucky Division of Finance would be the lead agency in overseeing the completion of the construction activities and in the contractor prequalification process. A pre-qualification and bid package is under preparation to advertise for qualified contractors. A pre-bid meeting will be held at Rosewell prior to the acceptance of the pre-qualification packages. The KY SHPO would be engaged in the pre-qualification and bid package and construction letting processes.

Stipulation III.P.3. provides that KYTC shall place a preservation easement on the property and sell the property to a local preservation organization or other party acceptable to the BSHCT or donate the property to a local government. SDC 4 is working to prepare Rosewell for re-sale or public use as previously documented in Stipulation III.P.1.

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STIPULATION IV: Archaeological Resources

The final identification, evaluation and determination of Project effects for archaeological resources were phased because alternatives consisted of large corridors where access was restricted during the FEIS phase.

Stipulation IV.A.1. states that FHWA may withhold or limit public disclosure of information about historic properties.

Stipulation IV.A.2. FHWA shall ensure that consultation with Indian Tribes is conducted in a manner consistent with 36 CFR 800.2. **Bridges Native American Consultation**: A Resource Agency coordination meeting was held on May 26, 2011 as part of the SEIS process.

Stipulation IV.A.3. In order to maximize the opportunity to avoid adverse effects, FHWA will make every effort to complete identification and evaluation of archaeological resources at the earliest possible time in Project Design. Archaeological GIS: A GIS database and accompanying document have been provided to KYTC and distributed to FHWA, SHPO, and CTS-GEC for review and comment in a prior Reporting Period. The database and document await final concurrence from FHWA and the SHPO. The database and document provide an assessment of archaeological potential by parcel and provide a base for decisions regarding archaeological investigations for the Section 1 portion of the project. Geotechnical Monitoring for Archaeological Deposits (KY): The information from any monitoring will be incorporated into the Archaeological GIS to inform both historic and prehistoric probability models. Hazmat Area Archaeology (KY): Additional information from geotechnical borings in areas with potential hazardous materials would be available following Phase II testing that will inform potential archaeological investigations in those areas. In some cases, it is likely that hazardous materials will prohibit archaeological testing or testing may need to wait until cleanup has been completed.

Stipulation IV.A.4. In implementing Stipulation IV, FHWA may consult with the parties listed in Attachment F [consulting parties list] and others identified in accordance with 36 CFR 800.2.

Stipulation IV.A.5. FHWA, in consultation with the SHPOs, Indian Tribes when appropriate and other parties deemed appropriate by FHWA, will take reasonable measures to avoid disinterment and disturbance to human remains and grave goods of religious and cultural significance to Indian Tribes, including modification of the Project. Human Remains Protocol: A step-by-step protocol for human remains encountered during archaeological testing was deemed prudent given the potential for human remains in the project setting.

Stipulation IV.B.1-2. States that before letting any type of Project construction in the APE or selecting sites for ancillary activities associated with the Project, FHWA shall complete the identification and evaluation of archaeological resources for inclusion in the NRHP in accordance with applicable Federal and state standards and guidelines listed in Stipulation VIII.B. and lists examples of ancillary areas. Section 1A Archaeological Exploration: A Phase 1 archaeological survey of the Project corridor in Downtown Louisville was conducted in 2006 and three previously unrecorded sites were found: 15JF716, 15JF717 and 15JF718. All three are comprised of the remains of historic occupations of the area from the mid-1800s to the present. Phase II Archaeology work was initiated beginning on November 6, 2006. Site 15Jf716 was

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determined to not be eligible for listing on the NRHP; however, Sites 15Jf717 and 15Jf718 were found to be eligible for listing. Phase III data recovery was conducted in 2008 at both sites. At Site 15Jf717, the archaeological research potential had been exhausted. At Site 15Jf718, all available important information about local and regional history had been recovered. It was recommended that no further work be conducted at either site, and that clearance was warranted. Further disposition of these sites are a part of the development of the SEIS. Section 4 Archaeological Exploration: Due to lack of landowner permission, Phase II work at Sites 15JF678, 15JF679, and 15JF719 (Section 4) has been postponed until after property has been purchased. Phase II work at Site 15JF720 was completed and a report issued on July 29, 2008. The report recommended that the site was eligible for inclusion in the NRHP. The KY SHPO agreed with that conclusion; however, KYTC and FHWA disagreed. In a coordination meeting with FHWA, KYTC, SDC 4 and CTS-GEC on October 2, 2008, SDC 4 was tasked to redesign the section in order to avoid impacting this site. A preliminary design was developed to span the site and avoid an adverse effect. Rosewell Treatment Plan Archaeology: As a by-product of the structural assessment of the house, the entire basement of the house has been identified as a sensitive resource and no work can occur in the basement (not even concrete removal or repair) without prior archaeological review. The entire property is a NRHP listed resource and no work can occur without consulting KYTC and SHPO. Section 1 Archaeological Database and Document: A GIS database and accompanying document have been provided to KYTC and distributed to FHWA, SHPO, and CTS-GEC for review and comment in a prior Reporting Period. The database and document await final concurrence from FHWA and the SHPO. The database and document provide an assessment of archaeological potential by parcel and provide a base for decisions regarding archaeological investigations for the Section 1 portion of the project. Freight House Archaeology: On January 24, 2011, the Cultural Resources Office of INDOT submitted a draft archaeology monitoring plan for the proposed Freight House rehabilitation, including the required monitoring, to the IN SHPO. The IN SHPO approved the archaeological monitoring plan and report on February 8, 2011.

Stipulation IV.B.3. States that any human remains and grave goods encountered should be treated in a sensitive, respectful and careful manner, avoiding disinterment and photography, if at all possible. In addition, it states that the SHPOs, Indian Tribes, and any other party deemed appropriate by FHWA will be notified within 48 hours if remains that may be significant to Indian Tribes are identified. No human remains were identified during this period.

Stipulation IV.B.4. A Plan(s) for the identification and evaluation of archaeological resources will be developed by FHWA in consultation with the SHPOs, Indian Tribes and other parties deemed appropriate by FHWA. Archaeological Plan: After consultation, the Project team agreed that the plan should address auxiliary areas (waste, borrow, staging, and the like), the Archaeological GIS, SDC 2 and 5 underwater surveys and SDC 4 Phase II activities. The plan shall also include or make reference to the Human Remains Protocol developed for this Project and may address artifact conservation and final curation. Artifact Curation Policy: A final approved policy from the KY SHPO is pending. Artifact Conservation: Further information concerning potential conservation facilities and associated charges is pending.

Stipulation IV.B.5. FHWA shall prepare and distribute final Identification and Evaluation reports in accordance with Stipulation IV.F.

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Stipulation IV.C.1-6. States that studies shall be completed with a level of effort consistent with 36 CFR 800.4 and provide enough information to determine which archaeological resources are eligible for the NRHP. Indian Tribes will be consulted for their special expertise and FHWA shall notify Indian Tribes and other parties, whom so request, of eligibility determinations. Provides mechanisms for dispute resolution regarding eligibility and states that any party notified of determinations have 15 days to object in writing. All studies conducted during this Reporting Period have been completed in compliance with 36 CFR 800.4 and have provided sufficient information to make decisions. No eligibility determination disputes have occurred during this period. Section 4 Archaeological Exploration: Due to lack of landowner permission, Phase II work at Sites 15JF678, 15JF679 and 15JF719 (Section 4) has been postponed until after property has been purchased. Phase II work at Site 15JF720 was completed and a report issued on July 29, 2008. The report recommended that the site was eligible for inclusion in the NRHP. The KY SHPO agreed with that conclusion; however, KYTC and FHWA disagreed. In a coordination meeting with FHWA, KYTC, SDC 4 and CTS-GEC on October 2, 2008, SDC 4 was tasked to redesign the section in order to avoid impacting this site. A preliminary design was developed to span the site and avoid an adverse effect. Freight House Archaeology: On January 24, 2011, the Cultural Resources Office of INDOT submitted a draft archaeology monitoring plan for the proposed Freight House rehabilitation, including the required monitoring, to the IN SHPO. The IN SHPO approved the archaeological monitoring plan and report on February 8, 2011.

Stipulation IV.D.1-3. FHWA shall, in consultation with SHPOs, Indian Tribes, and other parties deemed appropriate by FHWA, determine if the Project will adversely affect archaeological resources determined eligible for inclusion in the NRHP and, if adverse impacts cannot be avoided, shall develop a treatment plan in accordance with Stipulation IV.E. Any dispute regarding the determination of effects on eligible archaeological resources shall be resolved in accordance with Stipulation XIII Dispute Resolution. KYTC received an archaeological report detailing the data recovery efforts for sites determined to be eligible for the NRHP in Section 1A. The KY SHPO issued a conditional clearance letter on March 5, 2007 pending submittal of the final report. The final report was received by CTS-GEC for review and comment on December 19, 2007. A revised report was sent to KYTC on June 27, 2008, and is pending approval.

Stipulation IV.E.1-6. FHWA shall, in consultation with SHPOs, Indian Tribes and other parties deemed appropriate by FHWA, develop a treatment plan for NRHP eligible sites that cannot be avoided. Implementation of the treatment plan must be completed for each site prior to the initiation of any Project construction activities that could affect the site. Treatment of human remains will be determined by FHWA on a site-by-site basis through consultation with SHPOs, Indian Tribes and other parties deemed appropriate by FHWA. FHWA shall provide ACHP, SHPOs, Indian Tribes who have expressed interest in the site, and other parties deemed appropriate by FHWA 30 calendar days to review and provide comment on final Treatment Plans(s). Following the implementation of a treatment plan, FHWA may elect to monitor construction activities in selected portions of the right of way. No treatment plans were developed during this Reporting Period. In addition, no locations where treatment plans were implemented have gone to construction or been subjected to monitoring.

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Stipulation IV.F.1-5. FHWA shall ensure that all archaeological work is performed or supervised by person(s) meeting the *Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualification Standards* in archaeology and that the results of all work are reported in a professional manner consistent with SHPO standards for each state. Sensitive information regarding archaeological sites, human remains and grave goods shall be kept confidential from the public; the ACHP, SHPOs, Indian Tribes, and other parties deemed appropriate by FHWA shall have 30 days to comment on any such reports that are developed.

Stipulation IV.G.1-3. Upon completion of work, FHWA shall provide copies of final reports to SHPOs, State Transportation Agencies (STAs), and Indian Tribes when appropriate. consultation with SHPO, FHWA shall prepare final reports for dissemination to the public libraries, educational institutions, and other repositories in Jefferson and Clark Counties and Indian Tribes as appropriate; however, FHWA will ensure disseminated reports do not contain sensitive information regarding human remains and grave goods, or the location, character and ownership of archaeological sites. In order to adhere to measures outlined in the MOA concerning the protection of detailed information about archaeological sites, only those reports detailing the results of treatment plans will be disseminated in accordance with this stipulation. The final report concerning the treatment of (Kentucky) Sites 15Jf716, 15Jf717 and 15Jf718 will be treated in accordance with this stipulation when ready. Sites 15Jf716, 15Jf717 and 15Jf718 have been excavated. The KYTC is completing review of the Phase I/salvage report for the three sites (15Jf716, 15Jf717, and 15Jf717) and for the accelerated I-65 (Kentucky) Downtown. The KYTC recommended substituting a general audience booklet and/or website in place of the technical archaeological report for sites 15Jf716, 15Jf717, and 15Jf718. The technical report is long and full of jargon. Materials aimed at the layperson would better fulfill the objective of the stipulation of the MOA. The BSMT approved the use of the booklet and/or website formats for these sites and KYTC identified a funding source. KYTC agreed to work with its archaeological consultants in developing the media and defining a schedule for completion. The materials could be made available to broad audiences.

STIPULATION V: Unanticipated Discoveries

No previously unidentified property was discovered during the Reporting Period nor was a previously identified historic property affected in an unanticipated manner.

STIPULATION VI: Additional Historic Properties and Effects

No sites for staging, wetland mitigation, borrow or waste, dredge disposal or other construction activities associated with the Project were identified during the Reporting Period.

STIPULATION VII: Excess Right of Way

No excess right of way was identified during the Reporting Period.

STIPULATION VIII: Performance Standards

The FHWA shall ensure that the performance of all cultural resources work required in implementing this MOA shall be performed by or under the supervision of individuals that meet the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualification Standards. All work performed during

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this Reporting Period was performed or directly supervised by individuals who meet or exceed the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualification Standards.

STIPULATION IX: Progress Reports

Progress Report Number 16 for the Reporting Period of January 1, 2011 – June 30, 2011 was developed in accordance with Stipulation IX and will be sent to the signatories, concurring parties and HPAT members (identified in Attachment A). Prior to this Progress Report, the following Progress Reports have been provided:

STIPULATION X: Project Modification

The FHWA, INDOT and KYTC are in the process of preparing a Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS) for the Project. A Notice of Internet (NOI) to prepare the SEIS was placed in the *Federal Register* on February 15, 2011. The NOI provided a short project description, a discussion of the proposed action, an expected project schedule, and contact information. The SEIS is under preparation because of the passage of time since the approval of the original FEIS/ROD, the present need for tolling revenues to assist in funding the project as determined through the Metropolitan Transportation Planning process, and the need to evaluate cost saving measures in the design of the Selected Alternative. As a part of the SEIS, the Section 106 process may result in an amended MOA.

STIPULATION XI: Amendment

The first amendment to the MOA for the Swartz Farm was sent to the Indiana SHPO (IN SHPO) for comment on January 20, 2011. The amendment was being processed due to the razing of the farmhouse by the private owner. FHWA sent a follow-up letter advising IN SHPO that the amendment for the Swartz Farm will be included in the Section 106 Consultation Process for the SEIS. No further work was to continue on the amendment or the HPP.

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STIPULATION XII: Failure to Comply/Termination

No signatories to the MOA identified any concerns during the Reporting Period that the terms of the MOA cannot be or are not being carried out.

STIPULATION XIII: Dispute Resolution

No written objections were filed during the previous Reporting Period. The Dispute Resolution for Butchertown is pending final resolution by the FHWA.

STIPULATION XIV: Duration

The MOA is in effect through April 1, 2023.

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PART III - PROJECT MILESTONES

Coordination with the HPATs in the development of plan details to implement mitigation measures is identified in the MOA at a number of project milestones, including:

Preliminary Plans (about 30%), Right of Way Plans (about 60%) Final Plans (about 90%)
