Progress Report Number 7
July 1, 2006 – December 31, 2006
Implementation of the Section 106 Memorandum of Agreement

The Section 106 Memorandum of Agreement (MOA)¹ for the Louisville – Southern Indiana Ohio River Bridges Project (Project) was executed on April 1, 2003. Attachment A provides a list of the signatories to the MOA and concurring parties. Included in the MOA was a stipulation providing for the preparation of a Progress Report (Stipulation IX). The following is the Seventh Progress Report for the July 1, 2006 through December 31, 2006 reporting period (Reporting Period).

There was continued activity on implementation of mitigation measures during the Reporting Period. The Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) continued work to finalize the scopes of work and contracts for the Section Design Consultants (SDCs) in Section 3 (Indiana Downtown) and Section 6 (Indiana East End). This will be discussed in more detail in Part I of this report.

Activity during the Reporting Period on implementation of mitigation measures in the MOA included preparing and convening meetings of the Indiana and Kentucky Historic Preservation Advisory Teams (IHPAT/KHPAT), continuing the Historic Preservation Plan (HPP) process for Butchertown, Phoenix Hill, the Old Jeffersonville Historic District and the Swartz Farm Rural Historic District, finalizing the Immediate Needs Report (INR) for the Country Estates of River Road/River Road Corridor (CERR/RRC), managing the development, scheduling and convening of the Smart Growth Conference and undertaking various archaeological investigations. All activities will be described in more detail in later sections of this report.

PART I – OVERALL PROJECT STATUS

INDOT and KYTC executed the prime contract for Community Transportation Solutions – General Engineering Consultant (CTS-GEC) on April 20, 2005. A description of each section and the progress of each SDC are provided in the following summary.

Section 1 Kentucky Downtown Approach (including Kennedy Interchange) – Ongoing coordination with agencies and organizations continued through this Reporting Period. SDC 1, Kentucky Transportation Associates (KTA), prepared and presented Draft Aesthetic Design Guidelines to the Regional Advisory Committee (RAC), Area Advisory Team (AAT) and the KHPAT for the Kennedy Interchange. Revisions to the draft are underway and will be presented in the future. Three meetings were held with the KHPAT. A final report for the Witherspoon Avenue/Geiger Street extension study was submitted; this study evaluated options for the relocation of the Witherspoon Extension from the location shown in the Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) to the location recommended in the INR and HPP for Butchertown. Noise studies were

completed to evaluate the potential need for noise abatement along I-64 east of the Payne Street overpass. The findings from these studies indicate that no noise abatement is required east of Payne Street. Coordination activities continued with the Waterfront Development Corporation during Phase II of the Waterfront Park Impact Reduction Study.

Section 2

Downtown Bridge (using Alternative C-1) – The design team completed Step 3 (Develop Alternatives) and Step 4 (Select Bridge Type) in the Bridge Type Selection Process (BTSP) concluding an 18-month public involvement effort.

Based on the public comment on bridge alternatives in Step 3, along with engineering analyses, three bridge alternatives were identified for recommendation in Step 4. Guidelines for the development of the bridge alternatives were based on the public involvement process for this project, as well as commitments made in the Record of Decision (ROD), FEIS and MOA. The applicable Context Sensitive Design (CSD) guidelines and parameters were considered by the SDC 2 bridge architect during the development of the three alternatives.

During Step 4, more detailed engineering analysis was performed on refining member sizes and geometry; constructability checks and quantity based construction cost estimating were also done. A comprehensive Bridge Type Selection Report (BTSR) was prepared documenting the BTSP. The report contained topics including public involvement, the bridge alternatives and their development, historic context and environmental commitments.

The recommended bridge types were presented to the AAT on July 11, 2006 and to the RAC and HPATs on July 18, 2006 (separate meetings) to solicit feedback before being presented to the Executive Bridge Type Selection Committee (EBTSC). The three bridge types were presented to the EBTSC on November 1, 2006. As a result of this meeting, the EBTSC requested that the alternatives be presented to the public for additional feedback and for them to vote for their favorite alternative for the EBTSC to use in selecting a bridge.

Four public meetings were then held on consecutive days from November 13-16, 2006. Two meetings each were held in Kentucky and Indiana. The voting results were presented to the EBTSC on December 12, 2006. During the meeting, the EBTSC selected the Three Tower Cable Stayed Bridge as the Downtown Bridge.

Section 3

Indiana Downtown Approach – Efforts during the Reporting Period entailed the continuation of the topographic survey for the Project. No direct environmental or mitigation efforts were initiated by SDC 3 during this Reporting Period.

Section 4

Kentucky East End Approach – During the Reporting Period, Preliminary Line and Grade Plans (PL&G) were completed. These plans were presented to the KHPAT, RAC and the AAT. Coordination continued with the Louisville Water Company and the appropriate environmental resource agencies to develop strategies for working within the Wellhead Protection Zone. The appropriate environmental permit documents were filed with U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for the exploratory tunnel and access ramp project. The Draft Aesthetic Design Guidelines were submitted to the BiState Management Team (BSMT) and to the KHPAT for comment.

Section 5

East End Bridge (using Alternative A-15) – The design team has completed Step 3 (Develop Alternatives) and Step 4 (Select Bridge Type) in the BTSP concluding an 18-month public involvement effort. .

Based on the public comment on bridge alternatives in Step 3, along with engineering analyses, three bridge alternatives were identified for recommendation in Step 4. Guidelines for the development of the bridge alternatives were based on the public involvement process for this project, as well as commitments made in the Record of Decision (ROD), FEIS and MOA. The applicable Context Sensitive Design (CSD) guidelines and parameters were considered by the SDC 5 bridge architect during the development of the three alternatives.

SDC 5 made a presentation to the IHPAT and KHPAT on July 18, 2006 regarding the BTSP, guidelines and parameters to be used in the East End Bridge Design, and the three alternates recommended in Step 4. At the joint HPAT meeting, no preferences were expressed regarding the three recommended alternatives for the East End Bridge. Questions and discussion topics at the meeting focused on the HPPs for identified historic properties, the role of the HPATs in the Bridge Type Selection Process, and the role of the HPATs in the next phase of design. It was emphasized during the presentation that detailed design of the selected bridge type would continue in the next phase.


The BTSR for the East End Bridge was submitted in October 2006. This document summarized the 18 month, four-step, BTSP, which involved extensive public involvement, preliminary engineering, architectural analysis, consideration of the bridge site context, incorporation of environmental commitments of the EIS, ROD and MOA, and development of a Kentucky Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) program. The BTSR identified the three recommended alternatives developed in Step 4 and was written to assist the EBTSC in selecting one of the bridge type alternatives to be constructed in the East End.

In December 2006, the EBTSC met to discuss public input and other considerations related to the bridge alternatives for the East End and Downtown Bridges. For the East End, the committee selected Recommended Alternative 3, the Median Tower Cable-Stayed Bridge

with Median Cables. The committee agreed that this alternative was the most transparent, was the best fit with the context of the East End Bridge location, and best met the commitments of the FEIS, ROD and MOA.

The environmental commitments matrix for the East End Bridge has been maintained and updated to monitor the commitments in relation to the recommended bridge alternatives developed in Step 4 of the BTSP. The matrix includes references to the MOA, EIS and ROD for the Project. Many of the commitments listed in the matrix applied to the BTSP, but will also continue throughout the design, right-of-way, utilities and construction of the project.

- Section 6** Indiana East End Approach – Efforts entailed the preparation for the negotiation of the design proposal with the INDOT. SDC 6 initiated no direct environmental or mitigation efforts during the Reporting Period.



CTS-GEC, under the management of Mr. John Sacksteder worked during this Reporting Period with the BSMT, which consists of representatives from INDOT, KYTC and FHWA, in the development of a Project Management Plan, project schedule and oversight requirements of the six SDCs to be placed under contract by either INDOT and/or KYTC.

PART II – IMPLEMENTATION OF MITIGATION MEASURES CONTAINED IN THE MOA

Measures to mitigate adverse effects of the Project on historic properties are described in the MOA along with a number of activities to guide the development of project plans and provide for coordination of those activities through an historic advisory team for the Indiana portion of the project and one for the Kentucky portion of the project.

The MOA is divided into the following fourteen (14) stipulations:

- I. Project Coordination
- II. Project Development
- III. Site Specific Mitigation
- IV. Archaeological Resources
- V. Unanticipated Discoveries
- VI. Additional Historic Properties and Effects
- VII. Excess Right of Way
- VIII. Performance Standards
- IX. Progress Reports
- X. Project Modification
- XI. Amendment
- XII. Failure to Comply/Termination
- XIII. Dispute Resolution
- XIV. Duration

An expanded version of this listing is included as Attachment B, to serve as an outline in the preparation of the Progress Reports. A complete definition of each of the specific MOA stipulations is contained in Attachment C. Activities completed toward satisfying the various stipulations of the MOA during the Reporting Period are described in the following information.

STIPULATION I: Project Coordination

Stipulation I.A.2 provides for the Historic Advisory Teams to assist the Bi-State Historic Consultation Team (BSHCT) and the BSMT in developing Project design details to implement the measures stipulated in the MOA. Work continued during the Reporting Period on this stipulation.

Stipulation I.A.3 provides for the Co-chairs to convene meetings of the HPATs, prepare summaries of said meetings and prepare and submit HPAT recommendations to the BSHCT for further action. IHPAT meetings were held on July 18, 2006 (joint meeting with the KHPAT), August 16, 2006, October 18, 2006 and December 13, 2006. KHPAT meetings were convened on July 18, 2006 (joint meeting with the IHPAT), July 19, 2006, September 26, 2006, October 19, 2006 and December 14, 2006. Summaries of each meeting, except for the KHPAT meetings

of July 19, 2006 and September 26, 2006, which were working sessions to continue the development of the HPPs for Butchertown and Phoenix Hill, were returned to HPAT members within a reasonable time following each meeting.

Stipulation IA.9 provides for the convening of meetings of the HPATs by the Co-chairs to review plans, comment, and make specific recommendations regarding Project design scopes of work and details for consideration by the BSHCT. Stipulations IA.9.a and IA.9.b describe meetings prior to development of scopes of work and prior to the selection of contractors for the HPPs and Treatment Plans under Stipulation III. Once the scope of work for the Treatment Plans are developed for the properties identified in the MOA, the respective HPATs will be advised accordingly per this stipulation.

Stipulation IA.10 provides for the distribution of materials needed for review by the advisory teams and comments following scheduled meetings. Materials for the meetings held during the Reporting Period were generally limited to information on the preparation of INRs/HPPs, Preliminary Line and Grade (PL&G) plans for Section 4 and bridge type alternatives in Steps 3 and 4 of the BTSP for Sections 2 and 5. Presentations and requests for input during the meetings were supplemented by a 15-day comment period following the meetings to obtain input into the INRs/HPPs, PL&G and BTSP.

Stipulation IA.11 provides for the development of recommendations by the Co-chairs based on comments provided by the advisory team, for consideration and action by the BSHCT. This was completed after each meeting.

Stipulation IB. provides for a BSHCT. The BSHCT is to consist of representatives of FHWA, INDOT, KYTC and the respective SHPOs. It defines the roles and responsibilities of the BSHCT, mandates the scheduling of BSHCT coordination meetings and provides a means to advance recommendations of the HPATs to the BSMT for final approval.

The BSHCT held four meetings during the Reporting Period on July 6, 2006, August 1, 2006, September 12, 2006 and November 14, 2006. Recommendations elevated from the BSHCT to the BSMT included concurrence in the Final INR for the CERR/RRC (July 6, 2006), abandonment of the James Smith Rural Historic Farmstead from further consideration in the historic preservation process (August 1, 2006) and conclusion of the BTSP (November 14, 2006).

Stipulation IC. provides for a BSMT. The BSMT consists of representatives of INDOT, KYTC and FHWA. It defines the roles and responsibilities of the BSMT, mandates the preparation of Progress Reports as set forth in Stipulation IX of this MOA and provides a means to consider recommendations of the HPATs through the BSHCT for final approval.

Weekly meetings of the BSMT generally occurred on the Monday of each week and items related to this MOA were brought forth as needed.

Progress Report Number 7 for the Reporting Period of July 1, 2006 through December 31, 2006 is provided in accordance with Stipulation IX.

Stipulation I.D. provides for an Ombudsman for the Indiana portion of the Project and one for the Kentucky portion of the Project. It defines the qualifications for performance as the Project Ombudsman, the roles and responsibilities of the Ombudsman and the location of the office of the Ombudsman for each state.

During the Reporting Period, a list of potential candidates for the Indiana Ombudsman position were assembled and provided to the Executive Office of INDOT for selection. It is anticipated that the selection of an Indiana Ombudsman will occur in the next Reporting Period. Mr. Lee Walker continued to serve as the Kentucky Ombudsman.

STIPULATION II: Project Development

Work initiated on implementation of mitigation measures identified in Section II of the MOA during the Reporting Period follows.

Stipulation II.A. describes the design goal of the Project, which will be used in the preparation of the Project Management Plan, to guide the development of project details.

Stipulation II.B. provides that the views of the public are important and will be solicited and considered at a minimum through each state's normal transportation project development process through informal meetings to be convened by the respective State Transportation Agencies (STA). During the Reporting Period, Area Advisory Team (AAT) and Regional Advisory Committee (RAC) meetings were organized. The AAT meetings were convened for Section 1 (Kennedy Interchange Approach) on October 26, 2006 and Section 2 (Downtown Bridge) on July 11, 2006. Section 5 (East End Bridge) convened an AAT meeting on July 13, 2006. RAC meetings were held on July 18, 2006 and October 26, 2006.

Stipulation II.C. provides that the roadways, bridges and other Project elements shall be designed and constructed with sensitivity to aesthetic values, historic cultural landscapes, and the historic context, utilizing services of professionals with experience in areas related to historic preservation. In the BTSP for the Downtown and the East End bridges, design professionals who have experience working with historic cultural landscapes, historic context and preservation were key contributors in the development bridge type alternatives for Steps 3 and 4.

Stipulation II.D. provides for the roadway lighting within the viewshed of historic properties and any navigational lighting required on structures included in the Project shall be designed and constructed to minimize the dispersion of light beyond the right-of-way and include state of the art techniques. Lighting techniques were a component of the Aesthetic Design Guidelines prepared by SDC 1 and SDC 4 and presented to the KHPAT on October 19, 2006 and December 14, 2006, respectively. Lighting is also a component of the Butchertown and Phoenix Hill HPPs and the INR for the CERR/RRC. All of the SDCs are reviewing the current state-of-the-art technology and will continue to do so until the project letting.

Stipulation II.E. describes activities to minimize adverse effects of noise on historic properties in accordance with state and federal noise regulations, policies and guidance. During this Reporting Period, the Noise Report was prepared by SDC 1, submitted through CTS-GEC to the BSMT and approved on August 28, 2006. The final noise barrier report for Section 1 was presented to the KHPAT at their meeting of December 14, 2006. The report recommended that

no noise barriers be provided in the I-65 and I-71 corridors. Noise barriers are still in consideration along I-64 in the area of Clifton, and a meeting with the neighborhood is pending. It was requested that SDC 1 provide additional studies along I – 64 in this area of Clifton.

Revisions were made to the Section 4 Noise Barrier Analysis to incorporate potential increased structure costs of a noise wall on the Harrods Creek Bridge into the analysis for the Harbor at Harrods Creek Condominiums. The Noise Barrier Analysis was approved by the BSMT on December 4, 2006. SDC 4 will hold community meetings with the affected neighborhoods to discuss possible design concepts for proposed noise barriers in the following Reporting Period.

Stipulation II.F. describes the actions for preparation of HPPs. The seven historic properties for which HPPs are to be developed were identified in Stipulation II.F.2 (a through g). During the Reporting Period, development of the HPPs for the Swartz Farm Rural Historic District (HD) and the Old Jeffersonville HD continued. A walking tour of the Swartz Farm HD was held on October 18, 2006 after the regularly scheduled IHPAT and a working session was convened as the IHPAT of December 13, 2006. For the Old Jeffersonville HPP, a public information meeting/working session was held on August 16, 2006, and another working session was convened as the IHPAT of December 13, 2006. Work on finalizing both HPPs will continue in the next Reporting Period. Coordination with the property owner of the James Smith Rural Historic Farmstead continued from the previous Reporting Period. No response was received by an established deadline of June 14, 2006 indicating no desire to donate the property. As directed by the Co-chairs of the BSHCT, a closure letter for the abandonment of the property from further consideration in the historic preservation process was prepared and concurred in by the Co-chairs on August 1, 2006 and the BSMT on August 7, 2006. Work on the development of the HPP for the Utica Lime Kilns is pending access from the property owner. The draft HPPs for Butchertown and Phoenix Hill were discussed in KHPAT working meetings held on July 19, 2006 and September 26, 2006. Both HPPs will be finalized in the next Reporting Period. Similar to the HPPs, a KHPAT working meeting to further refine the INR for the CERR/RRC was held on July 19, 2006; this helped to finalize the INR, which was approved by the BSMT on July 31, 2006. Development of the HPP for the CERR/RRC began after that approval.

Stipulation II.G. mandates that within five years of the Record of Decision (ROD), the historic preservation documents for Clark County, Indiana and Jefferson County, Kentucky will be updated by a qualified historic preservation consultant with the information developed for the Project. The Indiana SHPO has initiated work to develop a plan for the Clark County Survey update. Work on the development of an MOA with Louisville Metro Government for Jefferson County is ongoing.

Stipulation II.I. mandates that for specific properties identified in Stipulation III, documentation required for a NRHP nomination shall be prepared by a qualified historic preservation consultant selected by INDOT or KYTC, upon receipt of written consent from the property owner(s) and within the first three years following the Record of Decision. Six properties were identified in the MOA requiring the preparation of a nomination form, all located in Indiana; as stated above, no further consideration in the historic preservation process will be afforded to the Smith Farm as the property owners did not indicate a willingness to donate the property. Therefore, the number of NRHP nominations has been reduced to five. The preparation of these NRHP nomination forms is underway by CTS-GEC and INDOT. A scope of work and fee has been negotiated with the INDOT to complete this activity as a supplement to the INDOT/CTS-GEC

agreement for the Ohio Falls Car and Locomotive Company HD, the Utica Lime Kilns Multiple Property Listing and the Swartz Farm Rural HD. In regard to the Colgate – Palmolive HD, a documentation report was prepared and submitted to the IN SHPO on August 31, 2006 in lieu of a nomination form. The property owners declined to provide access to complete the nomination, necessitating the preparation of the documentation report. It was submitted to the IHPAT for review and comment on October 26, 2006; no comments were received by the established deadline of December 1, 2006. Therefore, it is proposed to advance approval of the documentation report in the ensuing Reporting Period. For the Train Depot, a nomination form was prepared and sent to the IN SHPO for review in September 2006. It is to be submitted to the Indiana Historic Preservation Review Board for approval in the ensuing Reporting Period.

Stipulation II.O. describes the process to hold a Smart Growth Conference within three years of execution of the MOA. The Conference was held on September 18 – 20, 2006 at the Louisville Downtown Marriott Hotel. Progress made toward the continuing development of the Conference during the Reporting Period included the holding of two additional Organizational Committee Meetings as follows:

September 6, 2006 – Speaker Presentation Review
September 13, 2006 – Dry Run Meeting

The Speaker Presentation Review meeting consisted of discussions of approximately 50% of the Conference presentations. The remaining presentations were not available, but were expected to be delivered to the Committee for review prior to the Conference.

Sponsorships were received from eight entities, totaling \$6,000.00. There were six Silver Sponsors (6 @ \$500.00 each) and two Gold Sponsors (2 @ \$1,500.00 each). Registration totaled 176 individuals including the Conference speakers and eight students. Both the Kentucky League of Cities and the Indiana Association of Cities and Towns were contacted in mid-August 2006 with a request that a Conference e-mail be sent to their respective list serves.

An e-mail was sent to all registrants on September 1, 2006 asking for their attendance at scheduled tours of Butchertown and Phoenix Hill (walking tour), Old Jeffersonville (walking tour) and the Country Estates and River Road (driving tour). The limit for each tour was set at 30 persons.

Moderator room assignments were made as well as a generic listing of assignments. It was the intent of the Committee to distribute the listing to all moderators to ensure that all of the Conference presentations were to be run in a similar format. Additionally, a Conference survey was prepared for discussion at the Dry Run meeting.

Following the Conference, Mr. George Jones of the FHWA requested that a meeting be scheduled with the Committee to evaluate the efforts expended on the scheduling and holding of the Conference. This meeting was held on October 13, 2006 at CTS-GEC to discuss the preparation of the Conference Report. A draft Report outline was sent to the Committee on October 4, 2006 in preparation for the meeting. The format and content of the Report were discussed; a draft of the Report is to be sent to the Committee members for review and comment on January 10, 2007 for discussion at a meeting on January 19, 2007 at CTS-GEC. Completion and acceptance of the Report will finalize the work tasks for this work element. Additionally, the

Environmental Commitments Team held an internal meeting on October 25, 2006 to further discuss assimilation of the draft Conference report.

STIPULATION III: Site Specific Mitigation

Work continued on the implementation of mitigation measures identified in Section III of the MOA during the Reporting Period. The major effort on measures identified in this section is expected to occur once all six SDCs are under contract and have work underway.

Stipulation III.A.4 requires the INDOT to develop and seek NRHP nomination for the Train Depot. A nomination form was prepared by INDOT during the Reporting Period and sent to the IN SHPO for review in September 2006. It is to be submitted to the Indiana Historic Preservation Review Board for approval in the ensuing Reporting Period.

Stipulation III.B.1 provides for the development of documentation to seek a National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) nomination for the Colgate-Palmolive Historic District. A documentation report was prepared and submitted to the IN SHPO on August 31, 2006 in lieu of a nomination form. The property owners declined to provide access to complete the nomination, necessitating the preparation of the documentation report. It was submitted to the IHPAT for review and comment on October 26, 2006; no comments were received by the established deadline of December 1, 2006. Therefore, it is proposed to advance approval of the documentation report in the ensuing Reporting Period.

Stipulation III.C.1 provides for the development of documentation to seek a NRHP nomination for the Ohio Falls and Locomotive Company Historic District. The preparation of the NRHP nomination form is to be developed by CTS-GEC and INDOT. A scope of work and fee has been negotiated with the INDOT to complete this activity as a supplement to the INDOT/CTS-GEC agreement. A notice to proceed is pending and expected during the next Reporting Period.

Stipulation III.E.1 provides for the preparation of an HPP for the Old Jeffersonville Historic District. During the Reporting Period, development of the HPP for the Old Jeffersonville HD continued. A public information meeting/working session was held on August 16, 2006 and another working session was convened at the IHPAT of December 13, 2006. Comments were duly noted and revision of the HPP would continue in the next Reporting Period.

Stipulation III.E.5 provides that the INDOT and KYTC will minimize the spacing between the proposed new Downtown Bridge and the existing Kennedy Bridge (I-65) consistent with prudent engineering principles. This will be evaluated in future bridge design phases.

Stipulation III.H.1 provides for the preparation of an HPP for the Utica Lime Industry Multiple Property Listing. Work on the development of the HPP for the Utica Lime Kilns is pending access from the property owner. Throughout the Reporting Period, repeated attempts (August 2, 2006, September 26, 2006, September 29, 2006, October 27, 2006, December 8, 2006 and December 21, 2006) to contact the property owner were unsuccessful. Additional attempts will be made in the following Reporting Period to contact the owner.

Stipulation III.H.8. requires the INDOT to develop and seek NRHP nomination for the Utica Lime Kiln Multiple Property Listing. The preparation of the NRHP nomination form is to be

developed by CTS-GEC and INDOT. A scope of work and fee has been negotiated with the INDOT to complete this activity as a supplement to the INDOT/CTS-GEC agreement. A notice to proceed is pending and expected during the next Reporting Period.

Stipulation III.I.4. requires the INDOT to develop and seek NRHP nomination for the portion of the Swartz Farm lying to the west of the Project, including the house, barn and associated outbuildings. The preparation of the NRHP nomination form is to be developed by CTS-GEC and INDOT. A scope of work and fee has been negotiated with the INDOT to complete this activity as a supplement to the INDOT/CTS-GEC agreement. A notice to proceed is pending and expected during the next Reporting Period.

Stipulation III.K.1 provides for the preparation of an HPP for the Butchertown Historic District. Work continued throughout the Reporting Period to develop the HPP. The Draft of the HPP was presented and discussed at working meetings of the KHPAT members on July 19, 2006 and September 26, 2006. At the working meetings, verbal comments were received and also sent to CTS-GEC in written form after the meeting for proposed revisions of the Draft HPP. Additional revisions of the Draft HPP are to follow in the ensuing Reporting Period to bring the HPP to approval of the BSMT.

Stipulation III.K.2 details the development of the Witherspoon Extension as part of the HPP. Recommendations on the Extension are included as an element of the Final Draft HPP for Butchertown. Studies were initiated by SDC 1 to determine the feasibility for the relocation of the Witherspoon Extension as recommended by the Final Draft HPP. On December 4, 2006, Louisville Metro provided Mayor Abramson's endorsement for Geiger alignment. On December 6, 2006, CTS-GEC and SDC 1 met with the Butchertown Neighborhood Association, which organization endorsed the Geiger alignment. A presentation of possible alternative locations was made at the KHPAT of December 14, 2006; the KHPAT endorsed the Geiger alignment at this meeting. Subsequent to this meeting, the KY SHPO indicated on December 26, 2006 that a 'De Minimis' Section 4(f) Finding would not be justified for the Witherspoon Extension. Additional coordination with the BSMT will continue in the following Reporting Period to finalize the selection of the preferred alignment.

Stipulation III.K.3 details the development of embankments or other designs that support aesthetically pleasing noise abatement measures, lighting and landscaping as part of the HPP. Recommendations on these elements are included as an element of the Draft HPP for Butchertown. SDC 1 has developed Aesthetic Design Guidelines for their section that will be applied as more detailed design is developed.

Stipulation III.K.11 provides for a study of Mellwood Avenue – Story Avenue to evaluate the elimination of the proposed connector and restoration of two-way traffic flow on Mellwood Avenue and Story Avenue. Recommendations on this connector were included as an element of the Draft HPP for Butchertown. Potential environmental effects and additional costs to the project will be assessed by the BSMT for a determination on how to proceed in the future.

Stipulation III.K.12 details the development of the streetscape improvements within the historic district as part of the HPP. Recommendations on streetscape improvements are included as an element of the Draft HPP for Butchertown. Streetscapes will be developed in more detail, as plans are more complete.

Stipulation III.K.14 details the development of roadway lighting within the viewshed of the historic district as part of the HPP. Recommendations on roadway lighting are included as an element of the Draft HPP for Butchertown. Lighting concepts are also included in the Aesthetic Design Guidelines prepared by SDC 1. Lighting plans will be developed in more detail, as plans are more complete.

Stipulation III.L.1 provides for the preparation of an HPP for the Phoenix Hill Historic District. Work continued throughout the Reporting Period to develop the HPP. The Draft of the HPP was presented and discussed in working meetings of the KHPAT members on July 19, 2006 and September 26, 2006. At the working meetings, verbal comments were received and also sent to CTS-GEC in written form after the meeting for proposed revisions of the Draft HPP. A presentation of the Final Draft HPP was made at the KHPAT of December 14, 2006. Additional revisions of the Final Draft HPP are to follow in the ensuing Reporting Period to bring the HPP to approval of the BSMT.

Stipulation III.L.2 details the development of roadway lighting. Recommendations on roadway lighting are included as an element of the Draft HPP for Phoenix Hill. Lighting plans will be developed in more detail, as plans are more complete.

Stipulation III.L.7 details the development of placement of interpretative signage within the historic district as part of the HPP. Recommendations on interpretative signage were included as an element of the Draft HPP for Phoenix Hill. Interpretative signing plans will be developed in more detail, as plans are more complete.

Stipulation III.L.8 details the development of the streetscape improvements at specific locations within the historic district as part of the HPP. Recommendations on streetscape improvements at the specific locations defined in the MOA are included as an element of the Draft HPP for Phoenix Hill. Streetscapes will be developed in more detail, as plans are more complete.

Stipulation III.M.1 provides for the preparation of an HPP for the CERR/RRC. Work continued throughout the Reporting Period to finalize the INR and initiate development of the draft HPP. A working meeting to further refine the INR was held on July 19, 2006; this helped to finalize the INR, which was approved by the BSMT on July 31, 2006. On August 1, 2006, copies of the Final INR were distributed to the KHPAT for their information and use in the ensuing development of the draft HPP. Development of the HPP for the CERR/RRC began after that approval. Continuing development of the HPP will occur in the following Reporting Period.

Stipulation III.N.1 provides that the Project across the historic Drumanard property would be contained within a tunnel to minimize adverse effects. During the Reporting Period, design continued on both the main tunnel and an exploratory bore tunnel that will be used to obtain geotechnical information for the main tunnel design. Reconstruction of the exit ramp at US 42 was let to construction on May 25, 2006, with work beginning in June 2006. The relocation of the ramp work is expected to be completed in spring 2007. The reconstruction of this ramp will permit the exploratory tunnel work to occur in 2007. This construction also involved the addition of turning lanes and a traffic signal on US 42 at the ramps.

Stipulation III.N.2 provides that FHWA shall make every effort to acquire or otherwise establish an historic preservation easement for the entire Drumanard historic property. SDC 4

will develop plans for the Drumanard property that show the needed permanent and preservation/conservation easements that are required. Meetings were held with the Drumanard property owners on several occasions during the Reporting Period. Draft requirements for a preservation easement are being developed by the KYTC in conjunction with KY SHPO. Once this activity is completed, coordination with the property owner will continue.

Stipulation III.P.1 provides for the preparation of a Treatment Plan for Rosewell to minimize damage to the historic property. The draft edition of the Treatment Plan, which was initiated in April 2006, is near completion by SDC 4 and will be supplied to CTS-GEC for review and comment in the following Reporting Period.

STIPULATION IV: Archaeological Resources

The final identification, evaluation and determination of Project effects for archaeological resources were phased because alternatives consisted of large corridors where access was restricted during the EIS phase.

Human Remains: Due to the potential for encountering human remains, Ms. Wayna Roach, KYTC, initially prepared a draft human remains policy in August 2005. Comments from INDOT were received via email on September 11, 2006. Additional comments were received from IN SHPO (Dr. Rick Jones) on October 3, 2006. Mr. George Jones of FHWA confirmed that the document should be revised to respond to Indiana comments as much as possible within the parameters of the Project MOA. Ms. Wayna Roach revised the document and resubmitted it via email on October 13, 2006 to INDOT and the IN SHPO for final acceptance. On October 25, 2006, Mr. Koppel, INDOT, responded that he approved of the revised document; on November 13, 2006, comments from Mr. Tomak, also of INDOT, were received. On December 4, 8, and 18, 2006, phone messages were left for Dr. Jones attempting to solicit comments. On December 20, 2006, FHWA informed KYTC that KY-FHWA objects to final Human Remains Policy and Federal approval was revoked; specific reasons were not elaborated. Resolution of KY-FHWA concerns and IN SHPO comment is pending.

Native American Consultation (NAC): Upon consultation with Indiana FHWA, Mr. Jones indicated that NAC for Indiana Project archaeological reports will be handled in the same manner as Kentucky Project archaeological reports. This announcement was made on September 12, 2006 at the BSHCT meeting, the IN SHPO representative (Mr. John Carr) being present. On September 15, 2006, additional notification was sent to Dr. Rick Jones. Only those reports describing prehistoric sites or materials will be subject to NAC.

Archaeological GIS: AMEC began work on July 31, 2006. A demo occurred on September 1, 2006 at the cooperating Kentucky statewide archaeological consulting firms (CRAI and UK-PAR) and KYTC. By December 2006, the general structure of the Archaeological GIS had been finalized and work was ongoing to develop data entry tables. In addition, 28 historic maps spanning the 18th to the early 20th century were added and rectified to lie accurately upon the modern landscape. Additional access options for cooperating and regulatory agencies will be available in early 2007. Work on the GIS is projected to be finished by fall 2007.

Section 1 Archaeological Exploration: Three previously unrecorded sites were found: 15Jf716, 15Jf717 and 15Jf718. All three were comprised of the remains of historic occupations of the

area from the mid-1800's to the present. Site 15Jf716 was not recommended for further work. Sites 15Jf717 and 15Jf718 have been recommended as potentially eligible for the NRHP. Negotiated scopes of work were submitted to the BSMT team via email on August 24, 2006. The final phase of archaeological excavation began on November 6, 2006. The Phase II/III work on 15JF717 is complete and a final on-site was held with the KY SHPO on November 22, 2006. Several intact structural features were located, as well as portions of two cobblestone streets. Phase II/III work on 15JF718 was finished on December 14, 2006. No further fieldwork will be required for the accelerated portion; a management summary is due in the following Reporting Period.

Section 4 Archaeological Exploration: A management summary was provided on March 6, 2006. A letter requesting edits to the management summary was sent to the contractor on July 17, 2006 and a revised report was received on August 15, 2006. Following final comment from CTS-GEC on September 15, 2006, the report was sent to the KY SHPO. On October 16, 2006, the SHPO issued a letter, in which they concurred with the recommendations of the report. On October 27, 2006, the SHPO letter was sent to CTS-GEC and SDC 4 and copied to the BSMT. The final report was sent to the Kentucky Office of the State Archaeologist. On November 29, 2006, Phase II scopes were requested from CRAI and on December 7, 2006, Phase II scopes of work were received. Once a revised scope is received, a meeting must be scheduled with FHWA and SHPO representatives to reach agreement concerning proposed excavations. It is hoped that Phase II work can begin in spring 2007; however, it is unlikely that all areas will be cleared by 2008.

Rosewell Basement Archaeology: As a by-product of the structural assessment of the house, archaeologists investigated a small portion of the basement. On August 17, 2006, a summary of the findings was forwarded to Mr. Robert Burry of Burry and Amos. On September 7, 2006, historical background information was sent to Ms. Roach from Burry and Amos to be utilized in the forthcoming archaeological report. That information has been forwarded to the archaeological consultant. The consultant plans to submit the report in the following Reporting Period.

Allison-Barrickman: On July 27, 2006, Ms. Roach revisited the cemetery to observe any changes occurring during blasting. No effect was noted, although the weather had caused one tree in the northeast corner to partially fall prior to the visit. On July 28, 2006, an e-mail summary of observations (blasting had no effect) was sent to the BSMT team. On August 17, 2006, the report was forwarded to Mr. Burry.

Geotechnical Monitoring for Archaeological Deposits: Information on Phases 2, 4, and 5 has been received from Mr. Patrick Kiser on a regular basis. CRAI is finishing monitoring of Phase 2 and will soon begin monitoring of Phases 4 and 5. Some of the monitored borings have yielded archaeological deposits (mostly ceramics, glass, and brick fragments) while other locations have appeared disturbed with no intact deposits. A report detailing the findings has been submitted. The report was forwarded to CTS-GEC and comments were received on October 26, 2006. The report was sent to the KY SHPO for comment on November 3, 2006; final comment is pending.

Hazmat Area Archaeology: Additional information will be available following Phase II testing that will inform potential archaeological investigations in those areas. In some cases, it is likely

that hazardous materials will prohibit archaeological testing or testing may need to wait until cleanup has been completed. Additional coordination between KYTC, FMSM and Wang will be necessary. Due to cost concerns, archaeologists will not monitor these borings, but rather the boring logs will be requested following completion. Results are pending.

Artifact Curation Policy: On August 3, 2006, a draft curation policy was submitted to the KY SHPO. On November 27, 2006, the KY SHPO and KYTC archaeologists met to discuss the final wording of the proposed curation policy. Agreement was reached at that meeting, and the policy was put out on the Kentucky Organization of Professional Archaeologists list serve for comment that day. Following a comment period, it is expected to be accepted and put into practice by all state consulting firms in the following Reporting Period.

Artifact Conservation: KYTC has purchased a conservation manual entitled "*The Archaeologist's Manual for Conservation*." Following examination of this manual, discussion will be held with KYTC statewide archaeological providers to determine their capacity for conservation. In addition, the UK Program for Archaeological Research (UK-PAR) fell under new directorship at the beginning of May 2006. UK has, in the past, been capable of rather extensive conservation efforts. In the prior Reporting Period, Ms. Roach met with the new director of UK-PAR to explore potential curation abilities of the university. The lab has a number of pieces of equipment necessary to perform various curation procedures on a variety of material but does not currently have many experienced staff. A meeting was held at UK on November 16, 2006 to observe progress of a number of archaeological items undergoing conservation procedures.

Additional information regarding potential costs, funding options, and other potential conservation facilities will be gathered and submitted to the Project team in the near future. On November 28, 2006, FHWA and CTS-GEC indicated support for further investigation of conservation. On November 30, 2006, CTS-GEC forwarded to KYTC information that the Glenn A. Black Laboratory at Indiana University charged \$400 per box to conserve artifacts. Further information on other potential repositories is pending.

Underwater Archaeology: On October 19, 2006, the field survey was completed by Mainstream Divers of Paducah, Kentucky. A management summary was submitted on November 20, 2006. At a general archaeological contractors meeting, it was indicated that since the management summary, additional information had been received from Mainstream Divers and from archival research. The linear feature near the Indiana shore in the downtown section appears to be a 19th century floodwall, supported by historic sketch from 1876. The rectilinear feature near the Kentucky shore is still thought to be a flatboat and if so, will likely constitute a potentially eligible resource worthy of further research if it cannot be avoided.

On the East End, an unusual anomaly near the Indiana shore shows a large shadow with two spots of high reflectivity *within* the shadow; indicating something with holes in it. It is not clear what this anomaly represents; however, historic photos of the river bedrock seem to show very unusual bedrock features which occasionally is perforated. Additional archival research will be undertaken to finalize the report. The report is expected to be completed within the next Reporting Period.

Archaeological "Plan": After consultation, it was agreed that the MOA specifically stipulates that an overall "Plan" will be developed for the archaeology. On November 28, 2006, a meeting was held with Mr. Jones and CTS-GEC to coordinate the potential content of such a plan. It was agreed that the plan should address auxiliary areas (waste, borrow, staging, etc), the Archaeological GIS, SDC 2 and 5 underwater surveys and SDC 4 Phase II activities. The plan shall also include or make reference to the Human Remains Policy developed for this project. The plan may also address artifact conservation and final curation. Ms. Roach was assigned to draft the Kentucky portion of this plan, while CTS-GEC will develop the Indiana portion.

Section 3 Archaeological Exploration: CTS-GEC drafted a work plan for the Phase Ia archaeological survey of downtown Jeffersonville and a work plan for Phase Ia reconnaissance level investigations in the Fort Street area of the Indiana Downtown approach. Archaeological investigations would also be undertaken of the existing grounds of the five structures to be relocated from the Old Jeffersonville Historic District and the proposed grounds prior to the moving of these structures onto them, as stipulated in the MOA. It was determined that the activities proposed in the work plan would be placed on hold until the location of the bridge piers in Section 2 is known. At that time, the work plan would be re-evaluated to further define the needed surveys.

Section 6 Archaeological Exploration: ASC Group (ASC) has completed artifact analysis and write-up of the Phase II investigation of Site 12CL516. Although prehistoric ceramics and stone tools were recovered during the investigation, no intact sub-plow zone deposits or features were encountered. The site is recommended not eligible for NRHP listing. The report of investigations at 12CL516, 12CL525, and 12CL527 was presented in one document. A draft of the report was sent electronically to CTS-GEC for their review and comment on July 31, 2006. No comments were made by CTS-GEC and the report was forwarded to INDOT on August 2, 2006. Comments of the INDOT review archaeologist were received via a letter dated August 14, 2006. ASC revised the report and sent it to CTS-GEC on September 15, 2006. The report was sent to the IN SHPO for review and approval on September 21, 2006. On December 12, 2006, ASC received a letter of concurrence from the IN SHPO for the report. The only remaining task for these sites is the curation of materials from 12CL516 and 12CL525.

ASC made contact with the Indiana State Museum regarding curation of artifacts recovered at 12CL516 and 12CL762. The museum has provided ASC with a handbook of procedures for curation. Dr. Kevin Schwarz participated in a BSHCT meeting on September 12, 2006 by phone conference. An item of discussion at the meeting was the possibility of an interpretive display of artifacts from 12CL762, prior to curation. Dr. Schwarz also attended the IHPAT meeting on October 18, 2006 to discuss this possibility and the curation procedures. The discussion revealed interest in the interpretative display from the local preservation community and interest in having the artifacts curated at the University of Louisville, since it is nearby the project area. Curation of the artifacts was again discussed at the BSHCT meeting on November 14, 2006. INDOT archaeologist Curtis Tomak stated that INDOT had no objections to an interpretive display of the artifacts, but it is necessary to secure permission for whatever action is taken with regard to an interpretative display and/or curation from the landowner, the city of Jeffersonville. The possibility of curating the materials at the University of Louisville was further discussed and after the meeting more information on their curation facilities was reviewed by CTS-GEC and ASC via email. It has been determined that any display or curation of artifacts would occur subsequent to additional required investigations to promote efficient use of Project resources.

STIPULATION V: Unanticipated Discoveries

No previously unidentified property was discovered during the Reporting Period nor was a previously identified historic property affected in an unanticipated manner.

STIPULATION VI: Additional Historic Properties and Effects

Waste sites were identified and environmentally cleared for the construction of the US 42 Ramp reconstruction. All sites utilized with this construction were contained within existing right-of-way, predominantly within the I-71/ Gene Snyder Freeway interchange. Preliminary waste sites for the exploratory tunnel bore were identified and the environmental review of these sites will continue in 2007.

STIPULATION VII: Excess Right of Way

Work on development of plan details and identification of the right of way required for construction and operation of the Project was initiated during the Reporting Period. Excess right of way will be identified, as plans become more complete. Final right-of-way plans are expected in 2007 for Sections 1 and 4. The acquisition of one property based on hardship needs was completed. Two more hardship requests were received and appraisals were initiated on these properties.

STIPULATION VIII: Performance Standards

The FHWA shall ensure that the performance of all cultural resources work required in implementing this MOA shall be performed by or under the supervision of individuals that meet the *Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualification Standards*. Work will be completed in accordance with appropriate federal and state standards and guidelines.

STIPULATION IX: Progress Reports

Progress Report Number 7 for the Reporting Period of July 1, 2006 through December 31, 2006 is provided in accordance with Stipulation IX. Prior to this Progress Report, the following Progress Reports have been provided:

Report No. 1 for April 1, 2003 – December 31, 2003 was sent on July 21, 2004
Report No. 2 for January 1, 2004 – June 30, 2004 was sent on September 20, 2004
Report No. 3 for July 1, 2004 – December 31, 2004 was sent on April 22, 2005
Report No. 4 for January 1, 2005 – June 30, 2005 was sent on October 10, 2005
Report No. 5 for July 1, 2005 – December 31, 2005 was sent on February 20, 2006
Report No. 6 for January 1, 2006 – June 30, 2006 was sent on November 28, 2006

STIPULATION X: Project Modification

No actions occurred during the Reporting Period causing the need for a modification of the MOA.

STIPULATION XI: Amendment

No signatory to the MOA requested an amendment during the Reporting Period.

STIPULATION XII: Failure to Comply/Termination

No signatories to the MOA identified any concerns during the Reporting Period that the terms of the MOA cannot be or are not being carried out. At the end of the Bridge Type Selection Process (BTSP), there were some individuals who felt that the historic context was not taken into consideration in the selection of a bridge type. A recommendation was made by the KHPAT to the (KHPAT) Co-chairs to elevate the perceived lack of consideration of the historic context in the BTSP to the BSHCT. The KHPAT also requested the scheduling of another coordination meeting to further discuss the BTSP. The BSHCT reviewed both of these requests. The BSHCT recommended to the BSMT that the historic context had been considered in the BTSP and that the request for an additional meeting was not required. It was noted that Chapter 5 of the Bridge Type Selection Report (BTSR) prepared by SDC 2 and SDC 5 included discussion of the historic context utilized throughout the BTSP. The BSMT accepted the recommendations of the BSHCT. As a result of this review, the BSMT determined that the BTSP was conducted with deference to the historic context, and that no additional action/meetings were required.

STIPULATION XIII: Dispute Resolution

No written objection from any of the signatories or concurring parties to this MOA was filed during the Reporting Period.

STIPULATION XIV: Duration

The MOA is in effect through April 1, 2023.

PART III – PROJECT MILESTONES

Coordination with the HPATs in the development of plan details to implement mitigation measures was identified in the MOA at a number of project milestones, including:

Preliminary Plans (about 30%),
Right of Way Plans (about 60%)
Final Plans (about 90%)

During the Reporting Period, the BSMT continued work on the overall Project Management Plan, including a schedule for the likely activities to be included in the Project. A draft document is to be prepared by the BSMT for submittal to the FHWA in spring 2007.
