Call to Order and Roll Call

Meeting was called to order at 12:03pm by Chair Tracy Barnes. Taylor Hollenbeck called roll and announced a quorum.

Approval of February Minutes

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Review Final Draft of State Plan

- 1. It was brought to attention the deadline to submit the State's Plan was moved from September to March of 2023. Discussion was had around the timeline of federal approval, when the funding would be released to states, and the expected release of 2023's NOFO in July.
- 2. Discussion occurred regarding funding being moved into different buckets after the submission and approval of the State's Plan.
- 3. Discussion around July's NOFO being all project based, so the Committee should consider high level objectives for the State Plan so they can start on projects. The next State Plan does not need to be submitted until 2025.
- 4. After the approval of the Plan, the Committee will start meeting more regularly on projects since the state only has 45 days to disburse the funds. Specific funding will be related to the projects, but the Plan should remain vague to allow flexibility.
- 5. The Committee decided to get their final edits to David Cartmel by April 7th, he will publish the updated version on April 10th with April 12th being the last day to submit updates. The final approval of the Plan will occur at the April 19th meeting.

Federal Update

- 1. Eleven different states have submitted their Plan, with only 6 or 7 with CISA's recommendation for approval.
- 2. The lowest number of projects listed is one and the highest is 13.
- 3. Ransomware Pilot has been available since January. CISA has seen indicators of ransomware ingress/egress in the environment to get ahead of the attack.
- 4. MS-ISAC will probably not expand the Albert Sensor program until the renewal contract is completed.
- 5. Definition of Supplant vs. Supplement
- 6. Megan Incerto is the State's MS-ISAC Representative
