Summer Advantage USA	Summer Advantage is one of only two summer learning models in the nation that has been scientifically proven to improve student outcomes. Our model was evaluated in an independent evaluation by the Urban Institute using random assignment, the "gold standard of evaluation methods." Elements of our model include standards-based instruction in literacy and math in the morning; afternoon enrichment ranging from STEM to art and sports; a healthy breakfast and lunch; and Mentor Fridays that consist of guest speakers, workplace tours, field trips, college campus visits and scholar-led community service projects.
