

The following identifies the changes between the proposed rule and final rule for LSA # 18-416.

All of the changes listed in the document presented to the Executive Board May 22, 2019 Executive Board meeting plus the following changes based on Attorney General review:

1. 410 IAC 39-4-1(b)(4)(C)

Proposed Rule:

(C) The hospital shall follow current Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) recommendations related to the care of the maternal patient including, but not limited to, the following:

- (i) Induction of labor.
- (ii) Group B streptococci (GBS) treatment.
- (iii) Human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) treatment.

Final Rule:

(C) The hospital shall provide care to the maternal patient in accordance with acceptable standards of practice, as provided for by 410 IAC 15-1.6-9(a). The current Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) recommendations related to the care of the maternal patient shall be considered as authoritative sources of such acceptable standards of practice.

2. 410 IAC 39-5-1(b)(4)(B)

Proposed Rule:

(B) Hospital shall follow current Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), and American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) recommendations related to the care of the newborn including, but not limited to, such areas as:

- (i) Group B streptococci (GBS) treatment;
- (ii) human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) treatment;
- (iii) safe sleep positioning; and
- (iv) circumcision.

Final Rule:

(B) The hospital shall provide care to the newborn in accordance with acceptable standards of practice, as provided for by 410 IAC 15-1.6-9(a). The current Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), and American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) recommendations related to the care of the newborn shall be considered as authoritative sources of such acceptable standards of practice.

3. 410 IAC 39-4-1(b)(3)(B)

Proposed Rule:

(B) All emergency resuscitation medications needed to initiate and maintain resuscitation shall be readily available at all times in accordance with Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) and NRP.

Final Rule:

(B) All emergency resuscitation medications needed to initiate and maintain resuscitation shall be readily available at all times in accordance with Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) and NRP training.

4. 410 IAC 39-5-1(b)(1)(C)

Proposed Rule:

(C) Provide resuscitation and stabilization of unexpected neonatal problems according to the most current Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP) guidelines.

Final Rule:

(C) Provide resuscitation and stabilization of unexpected neonatal problems according to the most current Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP) training.

5. 410 IAC 39-5-1(b)(2)(K)

Proposed Rule:

(K) All equipment necessary to provide resuscitation and stabilization of unexpected neonatal problems according to the most current NRP guidelines.

Final Rule:

(K) All equipment necessary to provide resuscitation and stabilization of unexpected neonatal problems according to the NRP training.

6. 410 IAC 39-5-1(b)(3)(C)

Proposed Rule:

(C) Emergency medications, as listed in the NRP, shall be available in the delivery area and neonatal units.

Final Rule:

(C) Emergency medications, necessary to provide resuscitation and stabilization of unexpected neonatal problems according to NRP training, shall be available in the delivery area and neonatal units.

Proposed Rule:
