Division Updates – Katie Hokanson, Director, ISDH Trauma and Injury Prevention</p>	<p>The Governor’s Next Level Recovery Conference is scheduled for April 23, 2020.</p> <p>The ISDH had their public health accreditation site visit on February 5 & 6. There were over 357 documents submitted. Results are expected in the coming weeks.</p> <p>The Safety and Health Integration in the Enforcement of Laws on Drugs (SHIELD) Train-the-Trainer Program will begin this coming Spring. This is evidence-based training for law enforcement officers for syringe and overdose scene safety and workplace wellness.</p> <p>The Stroke Center List has been updated. 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	<p>The Division of Trauma and Injury Prevention are pursuing new grant opportunities: US DOT: State & Local Government Data Analysis Tools to Support Policy & Decision Making for Roadway Safety (if awarded - \$250,000 to \$500,000 for one year); Administration for Community Living : 2020 Empowering Communities to Reduce Falls & Falls Risk (if awarded - \$300,000 over three years) ; and STOP School Violence Grant Program (if awarded - \$500,000 per year for three years); Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration: Strategic Prevention Framework – Partnerships for Success (if awarded - \$1,000,000 per year for five years; and Health Resources & Services Administration: Rural Communities Opioid Response Program (if awarded - \$1,000,000 per year for three years).</p>		
<p>4. Regional Updates</p>	<p>District 1 (Jasper, Newton, Lake, Porter, and La Porte Counties) – Both hospitals are up for ACS re-verification in 2020. They are continuing the Stop-the-Bleed trainings.</p> <p>District 2 (Elkhart, Fulton, Kosciusko, Marshall, Pulaski, Starke and St. Joseph Counties) District 2 met on January 21, 2020. They are working to enhance hospital participation. May 2020 is Trauma Awareness Month.</p> <p>District 3 (Adams, Allen, DeKalb, Huntington, LaGrange, Noble, Steuben, Wells and Whitley Counties) District 3 met the first week of December. There was discussion about staging a regional mass casualty incident (MCI) event in the fall of 2020. 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	<p>District 5 (Boone, Hamilton, Hancock, Hendricks, Johnson, Marion, Morgan and Shelby Counties) District 5 will meet again on February 19, 2020 at the EMS Headquarters. They are working with Trinh Dinh at the ISDH on data inconsistencies with IC 10 codes.</p> <p>District 6 (Blackford, Delaware, Fayette, Grant, Henry, Howard, Jay, Madison, Randolph, Rush, Tipton, Union and Wayne Counties) – No Report</p> <p>District 7 (Vermillion, Parke, Putnam, Clay, Vigo, Owen, Sullivan and Greene Counties) District 7 continues to meet quarterly. They are getting more participation from non-trauma hospitals. The next meeting is scheduled for March 2020.</p> <p>District 8 (Brown, Monroe, Bartholomew, Jackson, Lawrence, Orange, and Washington Counties) District 8 has provided Stop-the-Bleed training to every staff person in the school system.</p> <p>District 9 (Clark, Dearborn, Decatur, Floyd, Franklin, Harrison, Jefferson, Jennings, Ohio, Ripley, Scott and Switzerland Counties) Dr. Welsh stated that Decatur County Memorial Hospital has an interest in becoming a Level III trauma center and are working toward that goal.</p> <p>District 10 (Crawford, Daviess, Dubois, Gibson, Knox, Martin, Perry, Posey, Spencer, Vanderburgh and Warrick Counties) Dr. Woodland stated that District 10 continues to study the issues with ED LoS and provide Stop the Bleed campaign trainings. They will meet again in January 2020.</p>		
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5. Indiana EMSC Updates – Margo Knefelkamp	Margo provided an Emergency Medical Services for Children (EMSC) Update. This federal program is to reduce pediatric morbidity and mortality as a result of serious injury and illness. She provided updates on all the Objectives which are: EMSC Performance Measures; EMSC EMS Annual Assessment; Indiana Pediatric Facility Recognition; Pediatric Surge Annex; National Pediatric Readiness Assessment; School Nurse Emergency Course; and the 9 th Annual Pediatric Heroes Awards Breakfast. Collaborating partners are Indiana Department of Homeland Security, Indiana State Department of Health, Indiana Emergency Medical Services Association, Indiana Fire Chiefs Association, Managed Emergency Surge Hospitals (MESH) Association, Indiana Hospital Association, Indiana Rural Health Association and Indiana Volunteer Firefighters Association. 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	<p>Performance Improvement (PI) Subcommittee – Dr. Peter Jenkins, IU School of Medicine, provided a comparison study of mortality at Level III vs Level I and II trauma centers. Level III centers have increased access to care, but their outcomes are unclear. Conclusions of this study indicate that Level III centers are doing a good job. A small mortality difference exists due to patients ages 65 and older.</p> <p>Dr. Jenkins reported the Indiana TQIP Committee met today with all Level I & II centers represented. The Committee will work on confirming that state registry data matches what hospitals are reporting.</p> <p>Jill Castor, IU Health Methodist Hospital, reported the Subcommittee will continue with their 2020 goals of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Decrease ED LoS at non-trauma centers• Increase trauma registry quiz participation• Collect hospital level variables on an annual basis and• Continue EMS run sheet collection• Data validation		
<p>7. Quarter 3, 2019 Data Report – Ramzi Nimry, ISDH Trauma and Injury Prevention</p>	<p>Ramzi Nimry reported that 108 hospital reports in Quarter 3. The reporting hospitals were 10 Level I and II trauma centers, 13 Level III trauma centers; and 85 non-trauma centers. There were 11,442 incidents. The majority of patients in the ED go to a floor bed or ICU at non-trauma centers. The majority of patients in the ED stay for 1 to 5 hours.
