Pursuant to Indiana Code 4-22, as the Small Business Ombudsman, I have reviewed the economic impact analysis for small business associated with the proposed rule to repeal 410 IAC 7-25 contained in LSA Document #18-160 proposed by the Office of Indiana State Department of Health.

Based on my assessment as the Small Business Ombudsman, I have concluded that the proposed rule will not put extra burden on small business. This repeal will allow for less regulatory requirements.

The economic impact statement prepared by the Natural Resources Commission states, "Repeal of 410 IAC 7-25, the On Farm Poultry Processor Exemption, will not have an economic impact on small poultry business."

Based upon this statement and review, the Small Business Ombudsman supports the proposed rule related to the economic impact to small business if the Indiana State Department of Health conclusion reflects the actual result after promulgation.
