Pursuant to Indiana Code 4-22, as the Small Business Ombudsman, I have reviewed the economic impact analysis for small business associated with the rule changes contained in LSA Document #18-282 proposed by the Indiana State Department of Health.

Based on my assessment as the Small Business Ombudsman, I have concluded that this proposed rule will not impose any requirement or cost on small businesses in order to comply with the proposed rule.

The economic impact statement prepared by Indiana State Department of Health states, "This proposed change to the rule is intended to keep Indiana's law aligned with the most up-to-date federal guidelines while also increasing data quality to the ISDH to help determine if an outbreak needs to be investigated and ensure facilities are reporting based on 410 IAC 1-2.4."
