

Pursuant to Indiana Code § 8-1.5-3-8.3(c), the City of New Haven by counsel, requests the Director of the Water and Wastewater Division of the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (Commission”) to approve the rate and charge difference between property within and property outside the corporate boundaries of the City of New Haven. In support of its request, the City of New Haven states:

1. The amended ordinance setting rates and charges for property within and property outside the municipality’s corporate boundaries took effect on February 28, 2006.
2. Attached as “Exhibit A” is a copy of the Ordinance. At page 3 the Ordinance states the Within City and Outside City maximum waste water connection charges of \$1,250.00 and \$1,500.00 respectively.
3. The works that is the subject of the Ordinance is a wastewater utility works.
4. The percentage difference between the maximum connection charges imposed on users of the works for service to property located outside the corporate boundaries of the municipality and to property located within the corporate boundaries is 20%.
5. If the percentage difference in #4 above varies based upon the amount of consumption, please provide a chart illustrating the various consumption levels in 1,000 gallon increments with the corresponding percent surcharge and attach to this Petition.


6. Robert M. Glennon is counsel of record for Petitioners in this matter and is duly authorized to accept service of papers in this cause on behalf of Petitioners.

ORDINANCE NO. G-06-02

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND CONSOLIDATING
THE RATES AND CHARGES OF
THE CITY OF NEW HAVEN WASTEWATER UTILITY**

WHEREAS, The City of New Haven maintains a wastewater sewer system; and,

WHEREAS, during periods of wet weather, the combined sewer system overflows, sending untreated effluent into local waterways; and,

WHEREAS, the state and federal governments have adopted regulations requiring communities to separate wastewater and stormwater systems; and,

WHEREAS, the regulatory mandate to separate the sewer system comes without funding from the state or federal governments; and,

WHEREAS, the City of New Haven has undertaken the separation of its stormwater and wastewater utilities; and,

WHEREAS, the rates presently charged by the Wastewater Utility are not sufficient to discharge all operating costs of that utility in addition to the costs of the combined sewer separation charged to the Wastewater Utility; and,

WHEREAS, as a result of the increase in the rates required by this Ordinance, the Common Council of the City of New Haven (the "Council") has determined it necessary to repeal the increase in the rates required by Section 2 of Ordinance No. G-04-07, as amended, adopted by the Council on January 11, 2005 (the "2005 Rate Ordinance").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED THAT THE RATES OF THE CITY OF NEW HAVEN WASTEWATER UTILITY SHALL BE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Base rates to be effective from and after the 20th day of March, 2006, shall be as follows:


SECTION 3. Inspection charges to be effective from and after the 20th day of March, 2006, shall be as follows:

Commercial & Industrial	\$75.00


SECTION 4. There shall be a late fee of 10% of the invoice amount added to any rate or charge not paid within fifteen (15) days after the date due.
