PREHEARING CONFERENCE ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

On January 28, 2026, the Town of Monrovia (“Petitioner”) filed a Motion to Establish Subdocket with Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (“Commission”), requesting the establishment of a subdocket for the purpose of considering Petitioner’s amendment to Ordinance 2025-06 in accordance with the Commission’s December 17, 2025 Order in Cause No. 46239.

Pursuant to notice and as provided for in 170 IAC 1-1.1-15, a Prehearing Conference in this Cause was held in Room 222 of the PNC Center, 101 West Washington Street, Indianapolis, Indiana, at 1:30 p.m., on April 30, 2026. Proofs of publication of the notice of the Prehearing Conference have been incorporated into the record and placed in the official files of the Commission. Petitioner, Intervenor Board of Commissioners of Morgan County, and the Indiana Office of Utility Consumer Counselor (“OUCC”) appeared and participated.

Prior to the opening of the record and with the consent of all parties in attendance, an informal discussion was held regarding procedural and scheduling matters in this Cause. The agreement of the parties was then read into the record.

Based upon the agreement of the parties, the Commission now enters the following Findings and Order which shall become a part of the record in this proceeding:

- 1. Prefiling Dates.** No prefiling dates are established as the parties do not intend to prefile any additional evidence. However, the parties agree to be responsive to questions, if any, from the Presiding Officers.
- 2. Evidentiary Hearing.** An evidentiary hearing is scheduled to commence at 10:30 a.m. on May 29, 2026, in Room 222 of the PNC Center, 101 West Washington Street, Indianapolis, Indiana. If the parties reach settlement, the agreement and supporting testimony and exhibits shall be submitted to the Commission at least ten business days prior to the evidentiary hearing.
- 3. Hearing Exhibits.** Paper copies of exhibits to be offered at the evidentiary hearing must be: (a) single-sided; and (b) fastened together with staples, binder clips, or other non-permanent bindings that have no more than three holes along the longest edge. Parties shall process

exhibits that: (1) consist of excel spreadsheets, (2) are oversized, or (3) are voluminous in nature, through an optical character recognition program and offer the exhibits on a compact disc. Parties shall offer confidential exhibits on green paper in an envelope marked “confidential” or, if offered on a compact disc, the compact disc shall be labeled “confidential.”

4. **Sworn Testimony.** Any witness testimony to be offered into the record of this proceeding shall be made under oath or affirmation. In accordance with 170 IAC 1-1.1-18(i), if a party offers prefiled testimony of a witness into evidence at the evidentiary hearing, and the witness sponsoring the prefiled testimony is not required to, and does not, attend the evidentiary hearing, the prefiled testimony shall be accompanied by the witness’s sworn affidavit or written verification at the time the evidence is offered into the record.

5. **Discovery.** Discovery is available for all parties and shall be conducted on an informal basis. Any response or objection to a discovery request shall be made within ten calendar days of the receipt of such request.

6. **Objections to Prefiled Testimony and Exhibits.** Parties shall file, and serve on all parties of record, any objections to the admissibility of prefiled testimony or exhibits as soon as an objection can be reasonably determined, but no less than ten days prior to the date scheduled for commencement of the hearing at which the testimony or exhibit will be offered into the record.

7. **Intervenors.** Any party permitted to become an Intervenor in this Cause shall be bound by the record as it stands at the time its Petition to Intervene is granted, pursuant to 170 IAC 1-1.1-11.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED BY THE INDIANA UTILITY REGULATORY COMMISSION that:

1. The determinations of the Prehearing Conference set forth in this Order are made a part of the record in this Cause and shall be binding on all present and future parties of record during the proceedings of this Cause.

2. This Order shall be effective on and after the date of its approval.
