Filed Pursuant To: 170 IAC 1-4-4.1-10 and 170 IAC 1-6

Request: In this filing, DEI is seeking authorization to update its Tariff No. 58 Economic Development. The Economic Development tariff is available for new load associated with initial permanent service to new establishments to the State of Indiana or expansion of existing establishments who apply to DEI for service under this tariff. The proposed revision to Tariff No. 58 eliminates the ≥ 20 MW demand requirement for customers requesting to extend the Economic Development reduction period from five to ten years. As a result, any customer would be able to request an extension of the Economic Development reduction period, with approval of such requests to be at the discretion of DEI.

Customer Impact: Eligible customers will receive a discount on their monthly bill under the Economic Development credit so long as all requirements are met.

Tariff Page(s) Affected: IURC NO. 16, Original Tariff No. 58, Pages 1 through 3 of 3.
