

In the Matter of E-Filing in Criminal Cases

Order

On July 23, 2015, this Court issued an Order Amending the Indiana Rules of Trial Procedure and Scheduling the Implementation of Electronic Filing in Indiana Courts. The amendments have been utilized to implement the filing of subsequent pleadings in both civil and criminal case types. The Court has been advised that it is now possible to authorize electronic filing of initial information and pleadings in criminal case types through interim solutions for the Odyssey and JTS case management systems.

The Court approves these interim solutions to accommodate filing of initial information and pleadings in criminal cases after civil E-Filing has successfully commenced in a given county, as determined by the Steering Committee. These interim solutions will receive and transmit initial E-Filing submissions between the Indiana Prosecuting Attorneys Council's Electronic Filing Service Provider and the appropriate case management system.

IT IS, THEREFORE ORDERED that the aforementioned interim solutions are authorized, until further Order of the Court, to receive and transmit initial E-Filing submissions between the Indiana Prosecuting Attorneys Council's Electronic Filing Service Provider and the appropriate case management systems. These interim solutions shall operate under the direction and control of the Steering Committee, and may commence only after civil E-Filing has successfully commenced in a given county, as determined by the Steering Committee. The Court and the parties understand that the Steering Committee will terminate these interim solutions once the E-filing Manager purchased by the Court is able to accommodate initial information and pleadings in criminal case types.
