

Senior Judge Per Diem

Order

Indiana Code 33-23-3-5, effective July 1, 2007, provides that a senior judge shall be entitled to a per diem of \$100 per day for each of the first thirty (30) days of senior judge service in a calendar year, and a per diem of \$250 for each day, up to one hundred days, the senior judge serves after the first thirty days of service in a calendar year, subject to the condition that this Court may issue an order adjusting the compensation rate for service beyond thirty (30) days.

The Court now finds that during calendar year 2016 the Court's payroll fund will be insufficient to compensate senior judges at the rate of \$250 per day as provided by statute. The Court further finds that compensation beyond the first thirty (30) days of service should be paid as follows: \$175 for each day of service beginning on the senior judge's thirty-first (31st) day of service through the senior judge's seventy-fourth (74th) day of service, and \$200 for each day of service beginning on the senior judge's seventy-fifth (75th) day of service through the senior judge's one-hundredth (100th) day of service.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that, pursuant to IC 33-23-3-5(c), during calendar year 2016 the compensation rate for senior judge service, beginning with the thirty-first (31st) day of service through the seventy-fourth (74th) day of service is adjusted to \$175 for each day of service, and beginning with the seventy-fifth (75th) day of service through the one-hundredth (100th) day of service is adjusted to \$200 for each day of service. This Order shall remain in effect until further order of the Court.
