NEW APPLICATION

Jail Management System

The Indiana Supreme Court has partnered with the Indiana Sheriffs' Association to create a new jail management system for potential statewide use. The application, dubbed "INjail," is in development at IOCT, and pilot counties will begin using the tool by the end of 2022. Seven counties are participating in the system design.

- Phases 1 and 2 are funded by grants from the Indiana Criminal Justice Institute
- System will be hosted at the Supreme Court's datacenter, with potential for local hosting on premises (which might add cost for the county)
- Centralized database will allow data sharing between jails and justice partners
- Interfaces with fingerprinting machines for improved criminal history processes
- Interface to Odyssey case management system for updated court data including bonds, hearings, and dispositions
- Interfaces to Protection Order Registry and Supervised Release System
