Update on Talking Book Topics in Large Print

Due to ongoing supply-chain issues and worldwide paper shortages, the large-print edition of Talking Book Topics (TBT) has been suspended indefinitely. Here are the alternate formats available:

- HTML, www.loc.gov/nls/tbt, which includes links to BARD for downloading or adding books to wish lists.
- PDFs, www.loc.gov/nls/tbt, which include order forms that you can print and mail to us.
- Audio cartridge, which comes with a large print order form and must be returned before the next catalog is sent.
- BARD audio magazine, downloadable to cartridge or to BARD Mobile wish list. January-February 2022 is now available as DB106440.
- Braille Book Review's TBT Abridged section in hardcopy braille
- Braille Book Review's TBT Abridged section as a BRF downloadable through BARD or from www.loc.gov/nls/bbr.
- TBT is also available through NFB-NEWSLINE.

If you have questions about any of these formats, please contact the library. We will keep you informed of any updates regarding the long-term future of the large-print TBT.
